## CHAPTER 22

### **An Act to extend the terms of office of certain directors of regional councils and public establishments in the health and social services sector**

*[Assented to 20 June 1991]*

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

Extension  
of terms of  
office

**1.** Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of the Act respecting health services and social services (R.S.Q., chapter S-5) or the regulations thereunder, the term of office of a member of a board of directors of a regional council established under that Act or of a public establishment governed thereby shall, if it ends in 1991, be extended to 1 June 1992, and the election or appointment procedure provided in the said Act or the regulations thereunder does not apply.

Renewal of  
extension

Any extension under the first paragraph may be renewed by the Government for a period ending on or before 1 June 1993. The terms of office of the other members of the board of directors of a regional council or of a public establishment which, pursuant to the Act respecting health services and social services, would end in 1992 shall end on the same date.

Vacancy

Any vacancy occurring in the office of a member of a board of directors shall be filled, for the unexpired portion of the term, by resolution of the members of the board remaining in office.

Director  
general

This section does not apply to a director general.

Coming into  
force

**2.** This Act comes into force on 20 June 1991 and has effect from 1 April 1991.
