CHAPTER 77

An Act respecting the Parc industriel et technologique Québec — Sainte-Foy

[Assented to 21 December 1984]

Preamble WHEREAS it is in the interest of the city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy that they be empowered to pursue their economic development;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

Agreement **1.** Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of a general law or special Act, the city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy may enter into an agreement to promote the establishment of undertakings involved in technology-oriented activities or undertakings engaged in research and development activities in a territory called the “Parc industriel et technologique Québec — Sainte-Foy” and situated partly in each city.

Applicable provisions **2.** The agreement is governed by sections 468 to 469.1 of the Cities and Towns Act (R.S.Q., chapter C-19), adapted as required.

Restrictions However,

(1) in no case may the agreement provide for another mode of management than that of an intermunicipal management board;

(2) notwithstanding section 468.16 of the said Act, the cities may choose one or more delegates who are not members of their councils provided that these delegates do not form a majority of the members of the board of directors of the management board.

Applicable Act **3.** For the purposes of the agreement, the Act respecting municipal industrial immovables (1984, chapter 10) applies, adapted as required,

to the intermunicipal management board established for the purposes of this Act.

However, notwithstanding section 1 of the Act referred to in the first paragraph, the amount that the management board may spend for the purposes of the said Act is fixed in the agreement; the agreement and the by-law authorizing it are not subject to the approval of the persons qualified to vote on a loan by-law of the city.

Territory

4. The Government shall determine by order the boundaries of the territory mentioned in section 1. The order shall be published in the *Gazette officielle du Québec*.

Exception

5. This Act shall operate notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 7 to 15 of the Constitution Act, 1982 (Schedule B of the Canada Act, chapter 11 in the 1982 volume of the Acts of the Parliament of the United Kingdom).

Coming into
force

6. This Act comes into force on 21 December 1984.
