



## CHAPTER 2

An Act granting to Her Majesty moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending 31 March 1979, and for other purposes connected with the public service

[Assented to 25 May 1978]

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,

Preamble. WHEREAS it appears, by a message from the Honourable Jean-Pierre Côté, P.C., Lieutenant-Governor of this Province, and the estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned are required to defray certain expenses of the Government of the Province, not otherwise provided for, for the fiscal year ending 31 March 1979, and for other purposes connected with the public service; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it be enacted, and be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, with the advice and consent of the Assemblée nationale du Québec, that:

1. This act may be cited as *The Appropriation Act No. 2, 1978/1979*.

2. There shall and may be taken out of the consolidated revenue fund of this Province a sum not exceeding, in all, \$885,923,458.33 for defraying, for the fiscal year ending 31 March 1979, the charges and expenses of the Government and public service of the Province, not otherwise provided for, being the aggregate of

(a) one-twelfth of the amount of the appropriations under each programme of the estimates of the Province, for the said fiscal year, as laid before the Assemblée nationale at the present session of the Legislature, viz.: \$883,207,875.00;

(b) an additional two-twelfths of the appropriations under programme 3 for the Ministère des terres et forêts, viz.: \$2,715,583.33.

**3.** Detailed accounts of all moneys expended under this act shall be laid before the Legislature of the Province, in conformity with section 72 of the Financial Administration Act (1970, chapter 17).

**4.** The application of all sums expended under this act shall also be accounted for to Her Majesty.
