An Act respecting the city of Sherbrooke

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the city of Sherbrooke that certain powers be granted to it;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The city is authorized to establish and operate a convention centre.

The city may assume the management of the convention centre or entrust such management to any person, company or corporation and sign any agreement for that purpose.

2. Notwithstanding section 477.1 of the Cities and Towns Act (R.S.Q., chapter C-19), the city may acquire and maintain an inventory of such equipment and supplies as it may need for the carrying out of municipal work.

The total value of the equipment and supplies shall not exceed two per cent of the total annual budget of the city.

3. Section 477.2 of the Cities and Towns Act is amended for the city by replacing the fourth and fifth paragraphs by the following paragraphs:

“Every authorization of expenditures granted under a delegation requires, to be valid, a certificate issued by the officer or employee

to whom the delegation was made indicating that there are sufficient funds available for that purpose. No such authorization is granted if it entails a financial commitment by the corporation for a period extending beyond the current fiscal year.

The officer or employee who grants an authorization of expenditures shall indicate it in a report that he shall submit to the treasurer. The latter must include such expenditures in the list of payable accounts presented to the council for approval.”
