## **An Act respecting the territorial boundaries of the town of Anjou**

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the town of Anjou that certain powers be granted to it;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

**1.** The territorial boundaries of the town of Anjou and of the city of Montréal may be altered by a by-law passed by the town council of Anjou before (*insert here the date of the day occurring two years after the date of assent to this Act*) and approved by the council of the city of Montréal and the Minister of Municipal Affairs.

**2.** The by-law shall contain a description of the areas affected by and may set out any condition relating to the alteration of the territorial boundaries.

The Commission municipale du Québec shall hold a public hearing on the by-law before it is approved by the Minister.

The Minister may approve the by-law with or without amendment. The amendment, if any, requires prior approval by the town council of Anjou and the council of the city of Montréal.

**3.** The Minister shall publish in the *Gazette officielle du Québec* a notice stating that he has approved the by-law with or without amendment.

The notice shall include a description of the areas affected. The description shall be prepared by the Minister of Energy and Resources.

**4.** The by-law shall come into force on the date of publication of the notice provided for in section 3 or on any later date indicated therein.

**5.** The conditions set out in the by-law may, for a period of not more than five years, establish a rule of municipal law or be an exception to any provision of any Act under the administration of the Minister of Municipal Affairs or to any special Act governing a local municipality or any instrument under such an Act.

**6.** Sections 168 to 173 and section 175 of the Act respecting municipal territorial organization (1988, chapter 19), adapted as required, apply to the alteration of territorial boundaries made under this Act.

**7.** This Act comes into force on (*insert here the date of assent to this Act*).
