An Act respecting Michel Dugas

WHEREAS Michel Dugas, who had been in the employ of Ultramar Inc. since 22 August 1977, was dismissed on 20 April 1982;

Whereas a collective agreement was in force between Ultramar Inc. and l'Union des employés du transport local et autres (local 931) affiliated to the International Brotherhood of Teamsters;

Whereas a grievance contesting the dismissal was filed by the association on the very day of the dismissal;

Whereas on 10 May 1982, without justification, the association advised Michel Dugas that it was no longer proceeding with the grievance;

Whereas in August 1982, Michel Dugas consulted a legal aid advocate who, a few weeks later, refused to proceed with the case;

Whereas owing to that refusal, Michel Dugas lost any recourse he had;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. Notwithstanding any applicable prescription, Michel Dugas may apply, before 1 June 1987, to the competent court in order to exercise the recourses provided in the Labour Code, following his dismissal by Ultramar Inc.
