**An Act respecting the Parc industriel et
technologique Québec — Sainte-Foy**

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy that they be empowered to pursue their economic development;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy may apply, in accordance with Part III of the Companies Act (R.S.Q., chapter C-38), for the incorporation of a non-profit corporation having as its object to promote the establishment, on a site situated in the territory of the cities, of undertakings involved in technology-oriented activities or undertakings engaged in research and development activities.

2. The city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy shall designate the persons who will be the applicants for the incorporation of the corporation.

The application and the memorandum of agreement must be accompanied with the resolution of each city authorizing the applicants to apply for the incorporation of the corporation.

3. Any application for supplementary letters patent must be accompanied with the resolution of each city authorizing the corporation to apply for amendments to its letters patent.

4. In the case of a winding-up, the remaining assets of the corporation shall be apportioned equally between the city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy or, as the case may be, in the proportion previously agreed upon by the cities.

5. Notwithstanding any general law or special Act, the city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy may

(1) make loans or grant subsidies to the corporation;

(2) sell, give or otherwise transfer land or other property to the corporation;

(3) instal, even free of charge, the municipal services on the land of the corporation; and

(4) furnish services to the corporation, even free of charge.

6. For the purposes of section 5, the city of Québec and the city of Sainte-Foy may borrow, in particular by means of an issue of bonds, in accordance with the laws governing them.

7. This Act comes into force on the day of its sanction.
