An Act respecting the municipal corporation of the parish of Saint-Augustin-de-Desmaures, county of La Peltrie

WHEREAS the municipal corporation of the parish of Saint-Augustin-de-Desmaures, by the passing of by-laws 415-83, 416-83 and 453-84, wished to order that the election of November 1985 be held, in respect of all the offices, on the basis of a division of the territory into electoral districts, and for a term of four years;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. For the election of November 1985 and in the future, all the offices of members of the council of the parish of Saint-Augustin-de-Desmaures shall be open to nomination and the term of office of the persons declared elected shall be four years.

2. By-law 453-84, passed on 28 May 1984, concerning the division of the territory into electoral districts applies for the purposes of the election contemplated in section 1, subject to the approval of the Commission de la représentation in accordance with the Act respecting elections in certain municipalities (R.S.Q., chapter E-2.1).

3. This Act shall operate notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 7 to 15 of the Constitution Act, 1982 (Schedule B of the Canada Act, chapter 11 in the 1982 volume of the Acts of the Parliament of the United Kingdom).
