**An Act respecting the Collège militaire Royal de Saint-Jean**

WHEREAS the Collège militaire Royal de Saint-Jean, established under the National Defence Act (R.S.C. 1970, chapter N-4), has filed an application to be recognized as an institution providing university education;

Whereas the application is supported by the Minister of National Defence;

Whereas the Conseil des universités approves the application;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

**1.** The Collège militaire Royal de Saint-Jean is authorized to award university degrees, diplomas or certificates to members of the Armed Forces in respect of programs corresponding to the following degrees:

- (a) Bachelor of Business Administration;
- (b) Bachelor of Arts (Canadian Administration Studies);
- (c) Bachelor of Arts (Military and Strategic Studies);
- (d) Bachelor of Arts (with specialization) (Military and Strategic Studies);
- (e) Bachelor of Science (Mathematics and Physics);
- (f) Bachelor of Science (General Science);
- (g) Bachelor of Science (Computer Science);
- (h) Bachelor of Science (with specialization) (Physics).

**2.** This Act does not confer on the Collège militaire Royal de Saint-Jean the status of a university establishment within the meaning of the University Investments Act (R.S.Q., chapter I-17) nor does it render the Collège eligible for grants to universities made by the Government of Québec.

**3.** This Act shall operate notwithstanding the provisions of sections 2 and 7 to 15 of the Constitution Act, 1982 (Schedule B to the Canada Act, chapter 11 in the 1982 volume of the Acts of the Parliament of the United Kingdom).

**4.** This Act comes into force on the date fixed by proclamation of the Government.
