**An Act to amend the charter of the Provincial
Association of Protestant Teachers of Québec**

WHEREAS it is in the interest of the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers of Québec, incorporated by chapter 70 of the statutes of 1889, amended by chapter 106 of the statutes of 1945 and by chapter 193 of the statutes of 1958, that its charter be amended;

HER MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the National Assembly of Québec, enacts as follows:

1. The name of the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers of Québec is changed to that of "The Québec Provincial Association of Teachers", hereinafter called "the Association".

This change of name does not change the rights and obligations of the Association.

2. The Association is a corporation within the meaning of the Civil Code and is vested with the general powers of such a corporation and with the special powers granted to it by this act.

3. The head office of the Association is situated on the Island of Montreal at such place as may be determined by the board of directors.

A notice of the location or of any change of its head office shall be sent to the Minister of Consumer Affairs, Cooperatives and Financial Institutions.

4. The Association has as its objects the promotion of the cause of public education in Québec and the advancement of the professional, economic and social interests of teachers and other employees in the education sector of Québec.

5. From the coming into force of this act, the Bedford Association of Teachers, the Baie Comeau Teachers Association, the Chateauguay Valley Teachers Association, the Coaticouche Teachers Association, the Eastern Québec Teachers Association, the Eastern Townships Association of Teachers, the Gaspesia Teachers Association, the Laurentian Association of Teachers, the Lakeshore Teachers Association, the Montréal Teachers Association, the North Island Teachers Association, the St Lawrence-Richelieu Teachers Association and the Western Québec Teachers Association are members of the Association.

Any other association of employees in the education sector of Québec admitted in conformity with the by-laws, may also become a member of the Association.

The Association, in the manner prescribed by by-law, may appoint associate members and honorary members.

6. The Professional Syndicates Act (R.S.Q., c. S-40) applies to the Association, subject to any inconsistent provision of this act.

7. The Association may

(1) acquire, own, administer, alienate, lease and exchange moveable and immoveable property situated in Québec;

(2) borrow money on the credit of the Association;

(3) issue bonds or other securities of the Association and pledge them or sell the same at a price and for sums deemed fair;

(4) notwithstanding the provisions of the Civil Code, hypothecate, mortgage or pledge moveable and immoveable property, present and future, of the Association, to secure payment of such bonds or other securities, or give a part only of such guarantees for the same objects, and constitute such hypothec, mortgage or pledge by trust deed in accordance with sections 28 and 29 of the Special Corporate Powers Act (R.S.Q., c. P-16), or in any other manner;

(5) hypothecate or pledge its immoveables, give in security or otherwise encumber the moveable property of the Association or give all such guarantees to secure payment of the loans made otherwise than by the issue of bonds, and the payment or execution of the other debts, contracts or liabilities of the Association;

(6) establish a general secretariat and one or more permanent offices for the pursuit of its objects;

(7) advise, counsel and assist the members of the Association;

(8) ensure sufficient coordination, supervision and control of the members of the Association to ensure compliance with this act and the by-laws of the Association;

(9) pay to its officers and employees such remuneration as may be fixed by the board of directors.

8. The members of the board of directors in office on the date of the coming into force of this act remain in office until their successors are elected or appointed.

9. The by-laws of the Association in force on the day of the coming into force of this act remain in force until they are amended or replaced.

10. This act replaces sections 2, 2*a* to 2*e* and 3 to 6 of the Act to incorporate the Provincial Association of Protestant Teachers of Québec (1889, c. 70).

11. This act comes into force on the day of its sanction.
