Bill 74

An Act to amend the Territorial Division Act

HER MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the Assemblée nationale du Québec, enacts as follows:

1. Section 10 of the Territorial Division Act (Revised Statutes, 1964, chapter 5), amended by sections 52 to 56 of chapter 10 of the statutes of 1965 (1st session) and by section 2 of chapter 8 of the statutes of 1971 and replaced by section 1 of chapter 7 of the statutes of 1975, is again amended:

(a) by replacing paragraph 3 by the following:

«3. **Beauce**, Chief Place: Saint-Joseph-de-Beauce.

The judicial district of Beauce comprises the territory bounded as follows: starting from the north corner of lot 92 of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Isidore; thence, successively, the following lines: a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Henri-de-Lauzon from the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Isidore and Saint-Anselme to the dividing line between lots 476 and 477 of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Anselme; in that cadastre, a broken line dividing lot 477 from lots 476 and 475; the northeast line of lot 475; the northwest line of lot 469; the northeast line of lots 469 and 470; the northwest line of lots 397, 396, 395, 394, 393 and 392; the northeast line of lot 392; part of the dividing line between the Saint-Luc and Saint-Marc concessions; a broken line limiting northeasterly and southeasterly, as the case may be, the Sainte-Anne concession; in the cadastre of the parish of Sainte-Claire, a broken line dividing the Sainte-Claire northeast and Saint-Amable concessions from the Saint-Octave and Sainte-Elizabeth concessions; a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Lazare from the cadastres of the parishes of Sainte-Claire and Saint-Malachie to the dividing line between ranges III and IV.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The purpose of this bill is, on the one hand, to rectify the list of the municipalities in the case of seven judicial districts and, on the other hand, to withdraw the city of Chambly from the judicial district of Iberville and place it within the judicial district of Montreal. Finally, the bill proposes to withdraw a certain number of municipalities from the judicial district of Beauce and place them within the district of Saint-François.

of the township of Buckland, in the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Malachie; in the latter cadastre and in the said township of Buckland, part of the dividing line between ranges III and IV; the dividing line between lots 24*c* and 25*a* of range IV; part of the dividing line between ranges IV and V; the dividing line between lots 28 and 29 of ranges V and VI; part of the northeast limit of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Malachie; part of the northwest limit and the northeast limit of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Léon-de-Standon to the centre line of the Etchemin river; the centre line of the said river southwesterly to the extension of the dividing line between ranges XII and XIII of the township of Ware; the said extension and the said dividing line between ranges; part of the dividing line between the townships of Ware and Langevin to the north corner of lot 23 of range XII of the township of Langevin; in the cadastre of that township, part of the dividing line between ranges XII and XIII; the northeast line of lot 17 of ranges XII and XI; part of the dividing line between ranges X and XI and part of the northeast line of the township of Langevin southeasterly; the Québec/United States boundary line in a generally southwesterly direction to the dividing line between the townships of Marlow and Risborough; part of the broken line dividing the said townships to the dividing line between ranges III and IV of the township of Marlow; the said dividing line between ranges and part of the northwest line of the township of Marlow, extended to the centre line of the Chaudière river; the centre line of the said river downstream; part of the north line of the township of Dorset to the dividing line between ranges IX South and X South of the cadastre of the township of Shenley; in that cadastre, part of the said dividing line between ranges; the south line of lot 5*a* of range X South; part of the dividing line between ranges X South and XI South; the south line of lots 13*a*, 13*b*, 14*a*, 14*b*, 15*a*, 15*b*, 16, 17*a*, 17*b* and 18*b* of range XI South; part of the dividing line between ranges XI South and XII South; the south line of lots 34 of range XII South and 34*a* of range XIII South; part of the dividing line between ranges XIII South and XIV South; the south line of lot 37*a* of range XIV South; part of the southeast and southwest lines of the township of Tring to the southeast line of the township of Adstock; part of the said southeast line and part of the dividing line between ranges XI and XII of the said township; the northwest line of lots 3*b* of range XII and 3 of range XIII of the cadastre of the township of Adstock and part of the northeast line of the said township to the northwest line of lot 528 of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Éphrem-de-Tring; in that cadastre, the said northwest line; part of the dividing line between ranges X and XI; the southeast line of lot 538; part of the southwest line of the townships of Tring and Broughton; in the cadastre of the latter township, the southeast line of lot 26*b* of range IX to the

southwest side of a public road; the southwest side of the said road to the southeast line of lot 24*d* of range XI; the southeast line of the said lot and the southeast line of lot 24*b* of range X; part of the dividing line between ranges IX and X; the southeast line of lot 23*a* of range IX; the southwest side of the road between ranges VIII and IX; the southwest line of lot 23*c* of range VIII for approximately 8 arpents; a straight line parallel to the road between ranges VIII and IX on the width of lots 24*a* and 24*b*; part of the northwest line of lot 25*a* of range VIII for approximately 8 arpents and its extension to the southwest side of the road between ranges VIII and IX; the southwest side of the said road to the extension of the southeast line of lot 25*b* of range VIII; the said extension and the said southeast line; the southwest side of the road between ranges VII and VIII to the southeast line of the township of Broughton; part of the said southeast line; in the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Victor-de-Tring, the southwest side of the road between ranges VI and VII to the extension of the southeast line of lot 713; the said extension and the said southeast line; the southwest side of the road between ranges V and VI; part of the southeast line of the township of Broughton and part of the dividing line between ranges III and IV of the said township; the dividing line between the cadastres of the township of Broughton and the parish of Saint-Séverin; part of the northwest line of the township of Broughton; a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Sylvestre from the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Séverin and Saint-Elzéar; a broken line limiting on the southwest and northwest the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Bernard; finally, another broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Lambert from the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Isidore to the starting point.

This judicial district includes the following municipalities: the towns of Beauceville, Lac Etchemin, Saint-Georges, Saint-Georges-Ouest, Saint-Joseph-de-Beauce and Sainte-Marie; the villages of Lac Poulin, Linière, Saint-Anselme, Saint-Bernard, Saint-Elzéar, Saint-Éphrem-de-Tring, Saint-Isidore, Saint-Victor, Saint-Zacharie, Tring-Jonction and Vallée-Jonction; the parish municipalities of L'Enfant-Jésus, Notre-Dame-de-la-Providence, Saints-Anges, Saint-Anselme, Saint-Benoît-Labre, Saint-Bernard, Sainte-Claire, Sainte-Clothide, Saint-Côme-de-Kennebec, Saint-Cyprien, Saint-Édouard-de-Frampton, Saint-Éphrem-de-Beauce, Saint-Frédéric, Sainte-Germaine-du-Lac-Etchemin, Saint-Georges-Est, Sainte-Hénédine, Saint-Honoré, Saint-Isidore, Saint-Jean-de-la-Lande, Saint-Joseph-de-Beauce, Saint-Jules, Sainte-Justine, Saint-Léon-de-Standon, Saint-Luc, Saint-Malachie, Sainte-Marguerite, Sainte-Marie, Saint-Martin, Saint-Maxime, Saint-Nazaire-de-Dorchester, Saint-Odilon-de-Cranbourne, Saint-René and Saint-Séverin; the municipality of the township of Shenley; the municipalities of Aubert-Gallion, Louis-Joliette, Saint-Alfred,

Sainte-Aurélie, Saint-Benjamin, Saint-Elzéar-de-Beauce, Saint-François-de-Beauce, Saint-François-Ouest, Saint-Joseph-des-Érables, Saint-Louis-de-Gonzague, Saint-Philibert, Saint-Prosper, Sainte-Rose-de-Watford, Saint-Simon-les-Mines, Saint-Théophile, Saint-Victor-de-Tring, Saint-Zacharie and Taschereau-Fortier. It also comprises an unorganized territory formed by the township of Metgermette-Sud.”;

(b) by adding after the words “Coteau-du-Lac” in the twenty-second line of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Beauharnois (paragraph 4), the words “, Saint-Isidore”;

(c) by replacing the twenty-ninth, thirtieth and thirty-first lines of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Bedford (paragraph 5), by the following: “Saint-Pierre-de-Véronne à Pike River, Stanbridge-Station, Stukely-Sud and Venise-en-Québec; the parts of the city of”;

(d) by adding after the word “Lamarche,” in the sixteenth and seventeenth lines of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Chicoutimi (paragraph 7), the words “Rivière-Éternité,”;

(e) by replacing the last line of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Drummond (paragraph 8), by the following: “Saint-Eugène, Saint-Nicéphore and Wickham.”;

(f) by replacing paragraph 12 by the following:

“12. Iberville, Chief Place: Saint-Jean.

The judicial district of Iberville comprises the territory bounded as follows: starting from the point of intersection between the centre line of the Richelieu river and the extension of the dividing line between the cadastres of the parishes of Notre-Dame-de-Bonsecours and Saint-Athanase; thence, successively, the following lines: the said extension and the said dividing line between cadastres; a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Grégoire from the cadastres of the parishes of Notre-Dame-de-Bonsecours, Sainte-Marie-de-Monnoir and Saint-Angèle; part of the dividing line between the cadastres of the parishes of Sainte-Angèle and Sainte-Brigide; in the cadastre of the parish of Sainte-Brigide, the centre line of a road bounding on the northeast lots 215, 216, 245, 244 and 243; the north line of lot 449; the northeast line of lots 449, 450 and 451; part of the east limit of the said cadastre; the northeast line of lots 506 and 377; part of the east line of lot 315 and the east line of lots 316 to 322; part of the dividing line between lots 325 and 368; the east line of lot 326; the southwest line of lots 326, 327 and 328; part of the east line of lot 329 and the southwest line of lots 329, 330 and 331; the west line of lots 332 and 333; part of the southwest line of lot

96; in the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Alexandre, the east line of lot 41; the southwest line of lots 41 and 40; the southeast line of lot 92; the northeast line of lots 209 to 225; the southeast line of lots 225 and 226; the northeast and east limits of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Alexandre; the east limit of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Sébastien; in that cadastre, part of the south line of lot 153; the east line of lots 179 and 345; the dividing line between lots 345 and 368; the northeast and west lines of lot 318; the south line of the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Sébastien and Saint-Georges-d'Henryville extended to the centre line of the Richelieu river; the centre line of the said river upstream and running west of de l'Hôpital and Ash islands and continuing to the Québec/United States boundary line; the said boundary line westerly; part of the west limit of the cadastre of the parish of Lacolle; a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Patrice-de-Sherrington from the cadastres of the township of Hemmingford and the parish of Saint-Jean-Chrysostome; the southwest limit of the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Michel and Saint-Rémi; a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Rémi from the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Isidore and Saint-Constant; another broken line dividing the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Michel-Archange, Saint-Édouard and Saint-Jacques-le-Mineur from the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Constant and Saint-Philippe; another broken line dividing the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Philippe and Laprairie de La Madeleine from the cadastres of the parishes of Sainte-Marguerite-de-Blairfindie and Saint-Luc; the dividing line between the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Joseph-de-Chambly and Saint-Luc, the last segment of that line extended to the centre line of the Richelieu river; finally the centre line of the said river downstream to the starting point.

This judicial district includes the following municipalities: the city of Saint-Jean, the towns of Iberville, Saint-Luc and Saint-Rémi; the villages of Henryville, Lacolle, Napierville, Saint-Alexandre and Saint-Grégoire; the parish municipalities of Notre-Dame-du-Mont-Carmel, Saint-Alexandre, Sainte-Anne-de-Sabrevois, Saint-Athanase, Saint-Bernard-de-Lacolle, Saint-Blaise, Saint-Cyprien, Saint-Édouard, Saint-Grégoire-le-Grand, Saint-Jacques-le-Mineur, Saint-Michel, Saint-Patrice-de-Sherrington, Saint-Paul-de-l'Île-aux-Noix, Saint-Sébastien and Saint-Valentin; the municipalities of Henryville and Lacadie; the municipality of Sainte-Brigide-d'Iberville less that part comprised in the township of Farnham; that part of the city of Farnham comprised in the cadastre of the parish of Sainte-Brigide and that part of the municipality of Saint-Mathieu comprised in the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Édouard.»;

(g) by striking out, in the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Joliette (paragraph 13), the word "Maski-

nongé,” in the ninth line, the words “Saint-Joseph de Maskinongé,” in the thirty-second and thirty-third lines and the words “Saint-Justin,” in the thirty-third and thirty-fourth lines;

(h) by replacing paragraph 19 by the following:

“19. Montreal, Chief Place: Montreal.

The judicial district of Montreal comprises the territory bounded as follows: starting from the point of intersection between the centre line of lake Saint-Louis and the extension of the northeast line of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Joachim-de-Châteauguay; thence, successively, the following lines: the said extension and the said northeast line; a broken line dividing the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Isidore from the cadastres of the seigniory of Sault-Saint-Louis and the parish of Saint-Constant; a broken line dividing the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Rémi, Saint-Michel-Archange and Saint-Édouard from the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Constant and Saint-Philippe; the dividing line between the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Philippe and Saint-Jacques-le-Mineur; a broken line dividing the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Philippe and Laprairie de La Madeleine from the cadastres of the parishes of Sainte-Marguerite-de-Bairfindie and Saint-Luc; the dividing line between the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Joseph-de-Chambly and Saint-Luc, the last segment of that line extended to the centre line of the Richelieu river; the centre line of the said river downstream to the extension of the dividing line between the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Joseph-de-Chambly and Saint-Mathieu-de-Beloëil; the said extension; a broken line dividing the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Joseph-de-Chambly, Saint-Bruno and Sainte-Famille-de-Boucherville from the cadastres of the parishes of Saint-Mathieu-de-Beloëil, Sainte-Julie and Varennes to the meeting point between the southwest line of lot 100 of the cadastre of the parish of Varennes and the bank of the St Lawrence river; in the St Lawrence river, a line perpendicular to the southwest line in the said lot 100 and southwesterly to the centre line of the river; an irregular line running halfway between the left bank of the river and the southwest and west sides of Saint-Patrice, au Héron, au Veau, aux Cochons, Sainte-Thérèse, aux Asperges and à l’Aiglon islands to an irregular line in the des Prairies river running halfway between the south bank of the said river and the north shore of Bonfoin island on the one side and the southeast and southwest shores of Bourdon island on the other; the said irregular line and the centre line of the Mille Îles river upstream and running to the northwest of the islands bearing numbers 202, 204, 207 and 212 of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-François-de-Sales, the islands bearing numbers 597 to 601 inclusive and 616 of the cadastre of the

parish of Saint-Louis-de-Terrebonne, to the west of all the islands included in the cadastre of the parish of Sainte-Rose and to the northwest of the island bearing number 235 of the cadastre of the parish of Sainte-Dorothée to the centre line of lake des Deux Montagnes; the centre line of the said lake and an irregular line in the said lake and the Ottawa river, running to the west and southwest of all the islands included in the cadastre of the parish of Sainte-Anne, and running halfway between Montreal island and Perrot and Dowker islands and continuing in the centre line of lake Saint-Louis downstream to the starting point.

This judicial district includes the following municipalities: the cities of Beaconsfield, Chambly, Côte-Saint-Luc, Dorval, Lachine, LaSalle, Laval, Longueuil, Montréal, Montréal-Nord, Outremont, Pierrefonds, Pointe-aux-Trembles, Pointe-Claire, Saint-Hubert, Saint-Lambert, Saint-Laurent, Saint-Léonard, Verdun and Westmount; the towns of Anjou, Baie-d'Urfé, Boucherville, Brossard, Candiac, Carignan, Delson, Dollard-des-Ormeaux, Greenfield Park, Hampstead, Île-Dorval, Kirkland, La Prairie, LeMoynes, Montréal-Est, Montreal-West, Mount-Royal, Roxboro, Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue, Saint-Basile-le-Grand, Saint-Bruno-de-Montarville, Sainte-Catherine, Saint-Constant, Sainte-Geneviève and Saint-Pierre; the village of Senneville; the parish municipalities of Saint-Jean-de-Dieu, Saint-Philippe and Saint-Raphaël-de-l'Île-Bizard; the municipality of Notre-Dame; the municipality of Saint-Mathieu less that part comprised in the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Édouard. It also includes the Indian reserve of Caughnawaga.”;

(i) by replacing the first ten lines of the first paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Québec (paragraph 21), by the following:

“The judicial district of Québec comprises the territory bounded as follows: starting from the point of intersection between the northeast line of the township of Michaux and parallel 48° 00' North latitude; thence, successively, the following lines: the northeast line of the townships of Michaux, Borgia, Gendron and Laure; the southeast line of the township of Laure and its extension to the line”;

(j) by adding, after the words “Saint-Casimir” in the twenty-sixth line of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Québec (paragraph 21), the words “Saint-Casimir-Est,”;

(k) by adding after the words “Sainte-Anne-de-Sorel,” in the fourteenth and fifteenth lines of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Richelieu (paragraph 22), the words “Saint-Antoine-de-la-Baie-du-Febvre,”;

(l) by replacing paragraph 27 by the following:

“27. Saint-François, Chief Place: Sherbrooke.

The judicial district of Saint-François comprises the territory bounded as follows: starting from the north corner of the township of Wolfestown; thence, successively, the following lines: the north-east line of the townships of Wolfestown and Garthby, the latter line extended to the centre line of the Saint-François river; the centre line of the river and of lake Saint-François to the extension of the centre line of the Coldstream river; the said extension and the centre line of the said river northerly to the extension of the northwest line of the township of Adstock; the said extension and the said northwest line; part of the southwest line of the township of Tring to the southeast line of lot 538 of the cadastre of the parish of Saint-Éphrem-de-Tring; in that cadastre, the said southeast line; part of the dividing line between ranges X and XI; the northwest line of lot 528; part of the northeast line of the township of Adstock to the northwest line of lot 3 of range XIII of the cadastre of the township of Adstock; in that cadastre, the northwest line of lots 3 of range XIII and 3*b* of range XII; part of the dividing line between ranges XI and XII; part of the southeast line of the township of Adstock; part of the southwest and southeast lines of the township of Tring to the south line of lot 37*a* of range XIV South of the cadastre of the township of Shenley; in that cadastre, the said south line; part of the dividing line between ranges XIII South and XIV South; the south line of lots 34*a* of range XIII South and 34 of range XII; part of the dividing line between ranges XI South and XII South; the south line of lots 18*b*, 17*b*, 17*a*, 16, 15*b*, 15*a*, 14*b*, 14*a*, 13*b* and 13*a* of range XI South; part of the dividing line between ranges X South and XI South; the south line of lot 5*a* of range X South; part of the dividing line between ranges IX South and X South; part of the north line of the township of Dorset extended to the centre line of the Chaudière river; the centre line of the said river southerly; part of the northwest line of the township of Marlow and the dividing line between ranges III and IV of the said township; part of the broken line dividing the townships of Marlow and Risborough to the Québec/United States boundary line; the Québec/United States boundary line running in a generally southwesterly direction to the centre line of lake Memphrémagog; the centre line of the said lake to the extension of the south line of lot 14*d* of range XV of the cadastre of the township of Magog; the said extension; a broken line between the townships of Magog and Bolton; part of the south line and the west line of the township of Orford; the west line of the township of Brompton; part of the southwest line and part of the northwest line of the township of Melbourne to the dividing line between ranges VII and VIII of the cadastre of the township of Durham; in that cadastre, part of the said dividing line between ranges; the northwest line of lots 557, 556, 465, 467, 363,

362, 270, 119, 120, 83 and 82; part of the dividing line between ranges I and II southeasterly and its extension to the centre line of the Saint-François river; the centre line of the said river upstream to the extension of the northwest line of the township of Cleveland; the said extension and the northwest line of the townships of Cleveland and Shipton; part of the northeast line of the township of Shipton to the centre line of the Nicolet river; the centre line of the said river and the centre line of lake Richmond to the extension of the dividing line between lots 1166 and 1167 of the cadastre of the township of Tingwick; the said extension across lake Richmond and lot 1156 of the said cadastre; part of the northeast line of the said lot 1156; finally, part of the northwest line of the township of Wotton and the northwest line of the townships of Ham and Wolfestown to the starting point.

(*m*) by replacing the twenty-sixth, twenty-seventh, twenty-eighth, twenty-ninth and thirtieth lines of the first paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Saint-Maurice (paragraph 29), by the following: "the township of Ingall; part of the northeast line of the township of Ingall; the north line of the townships of Papin, Chaumonot and Michaux; the northeast line of the townships of Michaux, Borgia, Gendron and Laure; the southeast line of the township of Laure and its extension to the centre";

(*n*) by replacing the seventeenth, eighteenth, nineteenth, twentieth and twenty-first lines of the second paragraph of the description of the judicial district of Saint-Maurice (paragraph 29), by the following: "Saint-Tite; the township municipalities of Hunterstown and Langelier; the municipalities of Belleau, Boucher, Charette, Haute-Mauricie, Lac Édouard and Saint-Jean-des-Piles."

2. This act shall come into force on the date to be fixed by proclamation of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council for the coming into force of chapter 7 of the statutes of 1975.
