CHAPTER 89

An Act respecting the town of Anjou

[Assented to 18 December 1991]

Preamble WHEREAS it is in the interest of the town of Anjou that certain powers be granted to it;

THE PARLIAMENT OF QUÉBEC ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

Annual activity report **1.** Any corporation contemplated in section 5 of the Act respecting the town of Anjou (1979, chapter 113) shall, not later than 31 March of each year, present to the council a report of its activities for the preceding fiscal year. The report shall also contain any information that the council may prescribe.

Required information In addition, the corporation shall, at all times, furnish to the council any information it requires with respect to the transactions of the corporation.

Council authorization The council may authorize the payment of contributions in order to make up the deficit or finance the activities of the corporation. It may, in addition, secure any debt incurred by the corporation.

Anjou 80 **2.** Notwithstanding section 2 of the Act referred to in section 1, but subject to paragraph 2.1 of subsection 1 of section 28 of the Cities and Towns Act (R.S.Q., chapter C-19) which shall apply adapted as required, the council may authorize the Anjou 80 corporation to alienate an immovable which is owned by the corporation for a price less than the price required to cover all the expenses relating to this immovable.

Coming into force **3.** This Act comes into force on 18 December 1991.
