CHAPTER 118

An Act respecting the Arthur Bousquet estate

[Assented to 18 December 1982]

Preamble. WHEREAS Arthur Bousquet, who died on 15 April 1973, disposed of his property by means of a notarial will made on 22 January 1965;

Whereas Arthur Bousquet gave and bequeathed, subject to certain special legacies, the use and usufruct of all his property to his spouse, Alice Goineau, during her lifetime;

Whereas Arthur Bousquet bequeathed the remainder of all his property, in equal shares, to nine various religious and charitable institutions;

Whereas each of those religious and charitable institutions will receive its share upon the death of the testator's spouse;

Whereas the testator's spouse is 80 years of age and suffers from various illnesses;

Whereas the total income from the estate and the personal income of the testator's spouse is insufficient to cover the cost of care at home by nurses or other health professionals that the testator's spouse may need if her condition deteriorates;

Whereas the nine religious and charitable institutions that the testator instituted as legatees by general title have been notified of the presentation of this Act and are not opposed to its passing;

HER MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the National Assembly of Québec, enacts as follows:

Use of the
capital.

1. Notwithstanding the will of Arthur Bousquet made on 22 January 1965, the testamentary executrix, Alice Goineau, her mandatary, La Fiducie du Québec, or any other mandatary appointed by the testamentary executrix, is authorized to cut into the capital of the estate to meet the cost of the care at home by nurses or other

health professionals that may become necessary on account of any serious and lengthy illness of Alice Goineau.

Costs.

2. The costs incurred for the passing of this Act shall be paid out of the mass of the succession.

Coming
into force.

3. This Act comes into force on the day of its sanction.
