



CHAPTER 67

An Act respecting Société Générale S.A. (Canada) Inc.

[Assented to 19 December 1980]

Preamble. WHEREAS it is in the interest of Société Générale S.A. (Canada) Inc., a corporation constituted by letters patent dated 29 November 1974 and issued under Part I of the Québec Companies Act, to be converted into a bank governed by the banks and banking law;

HER MAJESTY, with the advice and consent of the National Assembly of Québec, enacts as follows:

Conversion.

1. Société Générale S.A. (Canada) Inc. may, provided it is authorized to do so by the Banks and Banking Law Revision Act, 1980 or the Canada Business Corporations Act (S.C., 1974-1975-1976, c. 33) or any other act of the Parliament of Canada, apply to be converted, continued, extended or constituted a corporation governed by those acts as if it had initially been incorporated under those acts.

Filing of letters patent.

2. From the date on which the company is converted, continued, extended or incorporated under any of those acts, Société Générale S.A. (Canada) Inc. ceases to be governed by the Companies Act (R.S.Q., c. C-38) and must file with the Minister of Consumer Affairs, Cooperatives and Financial Institutions a certified copy of the letters patent or, as the case may be, the document certifying that it has been converted, continued, extended or incorporated.

Coming into force.

3. This act comes into force on the day of its sanction.
