Who being come thereto.

The Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor does not see fit to declare the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec until a speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made His Honour will declare the causes of his calling the Legislature.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Sir Eugène Fiset, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto:

The Honourable *Bernard Bissonnette* said:

"May it please Your Honour, the Legislative Assembly have elected me to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the important duties assigned me. If, in the performance of those duties, I should at any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me, and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am, and who through me the better to enable them to discharge their duty to the King and country humbly claim all their undoubted rights and privileges, especially that they may have freedom of speech in their debates, access to Your Honour's person at all seasonable times and that their proceedings may receive from Your Honour the most favorable interpretation."

The Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Mr. *Speaker*,

"I am commanded by His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor to declare to you that he freely confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative Assembly to His Majesty's person and Government, and not doubting that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence, he grants, and, upon all occasions, will recognize and allow their constitutional privileges.

I am commanded also to assure you that the Legislative Assembly shall have ready access to His Honour upon all seasonable occasions, and that their proceedings, as well as your words and actions, will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction."

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The sudden passing of our Governor General, Lord Tweedsmuir, has caused profound grief throughout Canada. Owing to the personal interest that this eminent statesman was pleased to take in our old Province of

Quebec, sorrow for his loss will be nowhere more keenly felt than among our own population. We have the satisfaction of knowing that this worthy representative of our Sovereign cherished above all the happy memory of the respectful and affectionate welcome extended to Their Majesties King George VI and Queen Elizabeth in our Capital last May. He was also among those who rejoiced in the honour conferred upon our country through the choice of His Eminence Cardinal Villeneuve as Papal Delegate to the commemorative celebrations at Domrémy.

It is very gratifying to me to be called upon to interpret the sentiments of this Legislature in paying a well-deserved tribute to the fine qualities of my distinguished predecessor and to his devotion to the duties of his high office. He has carried on traditions which I shall endeavour faithfully to uphold.

In the terrible war which the British Empire has been forced to wage to ensure respect for treaties and the freedom of mankind, Quebec is doing its share nobly. Our sons are enlisting in large numbers and are preparing to maintain on the battlefield the reputation of the glorious 22nd.

This world-conflict is accentuating the gravity of the problems we already have to solve. It is imperative that the difference existing between receipts and expenditures be reduced in order to balance the provincial budget. We intend to curtail capital expenditure to a strict minimum. The heavy load of debt accumulated during recent years makes an increase in revenue indispensable, but my government will see to it that taxes are equitably distributed. In order to avoid laying too great a burden on future generations, and so as not to impair the credit of the Province, we shall endeavour to pay unemployment relief out of ordinary revenue. The closing date of the financial year will be changed to correspond with that of the Federal Government and of the Government of Ontario, thereby facilitating transactions and comparisons between the three governments.

With a view to creating employment, my government will encourage the establishment of new industries by repealing certain laws which are at present diverting such industries from our Province.

We will also provide employment for our workmen by carrying out a program of road-building entailing not only the repair of our roads, but the progressive construction of trunk highways, which will afford rapid means of communication for our trade and encourage an influx of tourists into our towns and our countryside. To ensure perfect co-ordination, the direction of all works carried out on our network of highways will be centralized in our Department of Roads.

Prevailing conditions warrant the development of our mineral deposits. For this purpose capital must be attracted by removing restrictions which tend to drive investors to place their money more profitably elsewhere. The act respecting the development of our natural resources as well as the securities act will both be amended.

You will be called upon to deal with special legislation the object of which will be to ensure that, in our woodland areas, our forest domain may be exploited for the benefit of the working classes and of small local industries, as well as of settlers and farmers.

Our attention must also be directed to our maritime fisheries, not only on account of the trade they are bound to supply, but also because they constitute the main source of revenue for our population of the North Shore and of the Gaspé Peninsula. We will set up an organization whose chief purpose will be to assist our fisherman to improve the marketing of their catch and to develop a wider variety of preserved fish.

In order that our population as a whole may derive full benefit from the waterpowers with which a bounteous Providence has so lavishly endowed the Province of Quebec, my government will take the necessary steps, through appropriate legislation, to ensure a more general and less costly distribution of electricity.

We will put into effect the act providing for the definite abolition of seigniorial rents.

Realizing that we will be contributing to the success of our war effort and the triumph of our cause by intensifying the production of food supplies, and that the progress of agriculture will serve the best interests of our Province, we will give a vigorous impulse to the tilling of the soil. We will encourage the cultivation of new crops, such as flax and sugar-beets. We shall endeavour to establish markets, in Montreal and at strategic points abroad, for the quick and profitable distribution of our products.

We will encourage the back-to-the-land movement by grouping in suitable colonization areas in the neighbourhood of existing parishes, the most promising settlers, and by granting them the required assistance solely in the form of premiums on land clearing and ploughing.

We shall strive to overcome the problem of unemployment in our cities by co-operating more closely with the Federal Government, without prejudice to our provincial autonomy.

Fully aware of our responsibility towards the working-classes, we will introduce a minimum wage law to replace the present Fair Wage Act. This law will be complementary to the Collective Labour Agreements' Act, which will be entrusted to a commission for study with a view to making thereto any desirable amendments. Two recent acts, which appear to be contrary to the interests of the workmen, will be repealed. We will strengthen our social legislation by setting up a labour council, similar to those which have proved so beneficial in Europe.

Special consideration will be given to the rising generation, which is passing through such difficult times. In addition to the numerous undertakings which we propose to set in motion, we will arrange without delay with the Federal Government for the renewal of the agreement respecting the Youth Aid Act.

Education claims our immediate attention. While assisting, as it is essential to do, higher education and our universities, we will take the necessary steps to improve teaching in the primary schools, in the schools of arts and trades, as well as in the technical schools, and bring about a closer co-ordination between all these institutions.

With a view to protecting the health of our people, we propose to submit to you legislation aiming at the prevention of those diseases whose spread, in Canada as well as in the United States, is causing such grave concern. We will wage unrelenting warfare against tuberculosis as well as against infantile mortality. You will be called upon to study legislation dealing with the protection of illegitimate children and foundlings.

Under modern conditions, women play an all-important part, and their co-operation has become indispensable in bringing about much-needed social reforms. The privilege of expressing their opinion in the conduct of public affairs can no longer be denied them. We propose, therefore, to grant women the franchise.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The public accounts for the past fiscal year will be laid before you, and a report will be made to you of the state of our provincial finances.

You will be asked to vote the necessary credits for the next fiscal year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will be called upon to pass laws on various matters of general and special interest.

I am confident that you will carefully study the questions to be submitted to you and that your decisions will be inspired by a true devotion to justice and the public weal.

That the said Commission be composed of one scientist, one forestry engineer, one pulp and paper technologist, one lumberman, one economist, with special knowledge of forest industry, finance and forestry finance, with its chairman to be selected by the members outside of political affiliations;

That the said Commission be established permanently as advisers and counsellors to the Government with the object of having our forests benefit the people of the Province of Quebec and serve the interests of all instead of a few.”

The Honourable Mr. *Giroux* moved the adjournment of the debate.

The Honourable the Speaker gave a decision on the Point of Order by the Honourable Mr. *Brais* on the amendment submitted to Bill No. 19.

"At the sitting on Thursday, the 9th May, the Honourable the Leader of the Government (Mr. Philippe *Brais*) having moved the third reading of Bill No. 19, "An Act to amend Article 654 of the Municipal Code", the Honourable Member for Wellington (Mr. Louis Arthur *Giroux*) moved that the House be put into Committee of the Whole to study and take into consideration certain amendments.

Objection having been made to the taking into immediate consideration of this motion, notice whereof had not previously been given, the Honourable Councillor for Wellington gave notice immediately that he would make his proposition at another sitting.

At the sitting on Wednesday last, the 15th May, the Assistant Clerk having called Item No. 2, the Honourable Leader of the Government moved that Bill No. 19, "An Act to amend Article 654 of the Municipal Code," be read a third time.

The object of the proposed act is to amend paragraph 11 of article 654 of the Municipal Code, replaced by article 10 of the Act 2 George VI, Chapter 103, by substituting, in the second line, for the words: "who are of the male sex", the words: "of either sex".

Article 654 in question, which it is desired to amend, enacts in part as follows:

"The following must be entered on the valuation roll in as many separate columns and in the following order: 11. The names and surnames of the following persons being males, British subjects, of the full age of twenty-one years and domiciled in the municipality".

The object contemplated by this bill is therefore to amend the provision of the Municipal Code which provides for the inscription on the valuation role of all persons qualified as electors according to the election act so that there may be agreement with the act which now grants to women the right to vote.

Before the motion of the Honourable the Leader of the Government was submitted to the House, the Honourable Councillor for Wellington moved in amendment to the said Bill the following amendments:

- "1. Insert after clause 1, as clauses 2, 3 and 4, the following clauses:
- "2. Paragraph 2 of article 227 of the said Municipal Code is repealed.

“3. Paragraph 2 of article 243 of the said Municipal Code is repealed.

“4. Replace the word sons wherever it occurs in articles 244 and 654 of the said Municipal Code by the word “children”.

“2. Clause 2 becomes clause 5.”

For fuller explanation, if reference be made to article 227 of the Municipal Code, paragraph 2, it will be seen that at the present time women cannot be put in nomination for the offices of mayor or of councillor, nor be elected to these offices, nor can they be appointed to any other municipal office, nor fill them.

As to article 243 of the same Code, it mentions that to be an elector and have the right to vote at the election of mayor and local councillors, etc., it is necessary, among other qualifications to be of the male sex, or be a spinster or widow.

Finally, by the amendments proposed to articles 244 and 654, it is wished to replace everywhere where it occurs, the word: “sons” by the word: “children”.

The Honourable Leader of the Government objected to the taking into consideration of the said amendments, in claiming that they were irregular and out of order, and during the debate, the Honourable Member for Bedford (Mr. Jacob *Nicol*), seconded the remarks and the pretention of the Leader of the Government.

As the matter seemed to be of some importance, I decided to take the question into deliberation.

I studied the latter carefully and attentively and I referred not only to the authorities quoted to me, namely, to the “Annotated Rules of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, and to May, “Parliamentary Practice”, eleventh edition, but also to what is said on the same subject by Bourinot, in his volume “Parliamentary Procedure and Practice”.

Article 464 of the “Annotated Rules of the Legislative Assembly” enacts as follows:

“A committee of the whole House may make any amendment to a public Bill, provided such amendment be relevant to the subject matter of the bill or pursuant to any special instruction, and neither inconsistent with the principle affirmed by the second reading nor contrary to the rules and orders of the House”.

May, in the above mentioned volume, page 485, states as follows:

“Amendments are out of order that are—irrelevant to the bill; governed by or dependent upon amendments already negatived; inconsistent with, or contradictory to, the Bill as agreed to by the committee; offered at a wrong place in the Bill or that are tendered to the committee in a spirit of mockery; and the chairman would decline to put such question from the chair.”

Bourinot speaks in the same sense, and at page 333, I read the following:

“Amendments to Bills also, like amendments to the orders of the day, “must strictly relate to the bill which the House, by its order, has resolved upon considering.”

These decisions seem to me to settle the question, and there seems to be no doubt, in my opinion, that the proposed amendments are out of order. I might add that the proposed act which is now before the House has not for its object the conferring on women of the right to vote in the municipal or school domain, which lends all the more weight to the objections made by the Honourable the Leader of the Government and the Honourable Councillor for Bedford.

There is not the shadow of a doubt that the Honourable Councillor for Wellington could present directly a bill extending to other domains the women's vote, but he cannot do so by means of an amendment to the Bill now before the House, which has only for its object the preparing of the necessary machinery for putting into force the act granting to women the right to vote.

For these reasons, and basing myself on the authorities above mentioned, I declare these amendments irregular and out of order.”

The Honourable Mr. *Laferté* from the mixed committee appointed by both Houses to assist the Speakers in the administration of the Library, presented their first report:

The 30th May 1940.

The mixed committee of the two Houses appointed, at this session, to assist the Speakers in the administration of the Library of the Legislature have the honour of presenting their first report.

The Honourable Mr. *Laferté* has been elected Chairman of this committee, and the Clerk of the Legislative Council Secretary.

The quorum of the committee has been reduced to five members.

The committee are of opinion that the basement of the Library, where the newspapers and parliamentary documents are kept, ought to be better protected against the risk of fire and that the rooms of this basement which were taken away from the Library ought to be returned to it in order to permit of a better classification.

The committee recommend that a new counter be installed to expedite the service and provide a constant supervision of the shelves of the Library.

The committee hopes that the hours during which the Library must remain open, while the Houses are adjourned, will be the same as the hours to which the functionaries are subject.

The committee suggest that the articles of section V of Chapter 3 of the Revised Statutes 1925 be amended so as to be better adapted to present day needs.

The committee have appointed a sub-committee composed of the Honourable Messrs. *Chapais, Fisher, Laferté, Sauvé* and Messrs. *Casgrain* (Gaspé-Nord) and *Dumoulin*, to revise the rules of the Library and report to the committee at the next session.

The committee wish that henceforth the Speakers of the two Houses will form part *ipso facto* of the mixed committee on the Library.

“In His Majesty’s name, the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor assents to these Bills.”

Then the Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly addressed the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor, and presented for His Honour’s acceptance a Bill intituled:

1— 52 An Act granting to His Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th of June, 1940, and on the 31st of March, 1941, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

To this Bill the royal assent was pronounced by the clerk of the Legislative Council in the following words:

“In His Majesty’s name the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor thanks His Loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this Bill”.

After which the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province was pleased to close the first session of the twenty-first Legislature of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech:

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

It is particularly pleasing to me to give on His Majesty's behalf the royal assent to the laws which you have passed during this session just ended.

Proposed enactments of great importance to all classes of our population have been submitted in the course of your deliberations, Bills relating to agriculture, to colonization, to trade and commerce, to labour questions and to certain particular matters, amongst others the establishing of agencies outside of the Province. Women's suffrage, so long sought, is now an accomplished fact.

DECISION
of
THE HONOURABLE Mr HECTOR LAFERTÉ
SPEAKER OF THE
LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

Sitting at 2.30 p. m.

Friday, 17th May 1940.

"At the sitting on Thursday, the 9th May, the Honourable the Leader of the Government (Mr. Philippe *Brais*) having moved the third reading of Bill No. 19, "An Act to amend Article 654 of the Municipal Code", the Honourable Member for Wellington (Mr. Louis Arthur *Giroux*) moved that the House be put into Committee of the Whole to study and take into consideration certain amendments.

Objection having been made to the taking into immediate consideration of this motion, notice whereof had not previously been given, the Honourable Councillor for Wellington gave notice immediately that he would make his proposition at another sitting.

At the sitting on Wednesday last, the 15th May, the Assistant Clerk having called Item No. 2, the Honourable Leader of the Government moved that Bill No. 19, "An Act to amend Article 654 of the Municipal Code," be read a third time.

The object of the proposed act is to amend paragraph 11 of article 654 of the Municipal Code, replaced by article 10 of the Act 2 George VI, Chapter 103, by substituting, in the second line, for the words: "who are of the male sex", the words: "of either sex".

Article 654 in question, which it is desired to amend, enacts in part as follows:

"The following must be entered on the valuation roll in as many separate columns and in the following order: 11. The names and surnames of the following persons being males, British subjects, of the full age of twenty-one years and domiciled in the municipality".

The object contemplated by this bill is therefore to amend the provision of the Municipal Code which provides for the inscription on the valuation role of all persons qualified as electors according to the election act so that there may be agreement with the act which now grants to women the right to vote.

Before the motion of the Honourable the Leader of the Government was submitted to the House, the Honourable Councillor for Wellington moved in amendment to the said Bill the following amendments:

DECISION:—*(Continued)*

“1. Insert after clause 1, as clauses 2, 3 and 4, the following clauses :

“2. Paragraph 2 of article 227 of the said Municipal Code is repealed.

“3. Paragraph 2 of article 243 of the said Municipal Code is repealed.

‘ 4. Replace the word sons wherever it occurs in articles 244 and 654 of the said Municipal Code by the word “children”.

‘ 2. Clause 2 becomes clause 5.”

For fuller explanation, if reference be made to article 227 of the Municipal Code, paragraph 2, it will be seen that at the present time women cannot be put in nomination for the offices of mayor or of councillor, nor be elected to these offices, nor can they be appointed to any other municipal offices, nor fill them.

As to article 243 of the same Code, it mentions that to be an elector and have the right to vote at the election of mayor and local councillors, etc., it is necessary, among other qualifications to be of the male sex, or be a spinster or widow.

Finally, by the amendments proposed to articles 244 and 654, it is wished to replace everywhere where it occurs, the word: “sons” by the word: “children”.

The Honourable Leader of the Government objected to the taking into consideration of the said amendments, in claiming that they were irregular and out of order, and during the debate, the Honourable Member for Bedford (Mr. Jacob Nicol), seconded the remarks and the pretention of the Leader of the Government.

As the matter seemed to be of some importance, I decided to take the question into deliberation.

I studied the latter carefully and attentively and I referred not only to the authorities quoted to me, namely, to the “Annotated Rules of the Legislative Assembly of Quebec, and to May, “Parliamentary Practice”, eleventh edition, but also to what is said on the same subject by Bourinot, in his volume “Parliamentary Procedure and Practice”.

Article 464 of the “Annotated Rules of the Legislative Assembly” enacts as follows:

‘ A committee of the whole House may make any amendment to a public Bill, provided such amendment be relevant to the subject matter of the bill or pursuant to any special instruction, and neither inconsistent with the principle affirmed by the second reading nor contrary to the rules and orders of the House”.

May, in the above mentioned volume, page 485, states as follows:

“Amendments are out of order that are—irrelevant to the bill; governed by or dependent upon amendments already negatived; inconsistent with, or contradictory to, the Bill as agreed to by the committee; offered at a wrong place in the Bill or that are tendered to the committee in a spirit of mockery; and the chairman would decline to put such questions from the chair.”

Bourinot speaks in the same sense, and at page 333, I read the following:

DECISION:—(*Continued*)

“Amendments to Bills also, like amendments to the orders of the day, “must strictly relate to the Bill which the House, by its order, has resolved upon considering.”

These decisions seem to me to settle the question, and there seems to be no doubt, in my opinion, that the proposed amendments are out of order. I might add that the proposed act which is now before the House has not for its object the conferring on women of the right to vote in the municipal or school domain, which lends all the more weight to the objections made by the Honourable the Leader of the Government and the Honourable Councillor for Bedford.

There is not the shadow of a doubt that the Honourable Council or for Wellington could present directly a bill extending to other domains the women's vote, but he cannot do so by means of an amendment to the Bill now before the House, which has only for its object the preparing of the necessary machinery for putting into force the act granting to women the right to vote.

For these reasons, and basing myself on the authorities above-mentioned, I declare these amendments irregular and out of order.”
