WEDNESDAY, the eighteenth day of the month of January, in the third year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George VI, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the fourth session of the twentieth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable *Esioff Léon Patenaude*, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the "Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council".

Who being come thereto.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

I am happy to see you again met together to resume your parliamentary work, particularly for the study of several measures of public interest which the Government wishes to submit to you.

The religious ceremonies which took place in Quebec on the occasion of the first national Eucharistic Congress in Canada have left an ineffaceable memory for those who took part in or witnessed them. The success of these celebrations has once again proved that our Province is preëminently the land of the Faith and that it ever remains faithful to its best traditions.

You have learned with particular pleasure that Their Majesties King George VI and Queen Elizabeth will land in Quebec about the middle of May, to begin an official tour through the Provinces of Canada. The visit of Their Majesties, being the first with which British Sovereigns have ever honoured their subjects in North America, will be an outstanding event in Canadian annals. I shall without doubt be expressing the unanimous sentiment of Quebec in declaring that, nowhere, will our Gracious Sovereigns receive a more cordial, respectful and loving welcome than in our Province, where everyone takes pleasure in considering the Crown to be the symbol of the democratic institutions and of the constitutional liberties which we enjoy.

The Federal Commission on the relations between the Dominion and the Provinces met in Quebec during recess, and your Government availed itself of the opportunity to defend the provincial rights and to affirm that it appertains neither to the majority of the Provinces nor to the Ottawa Government to make changes in the Canadian constitution. The Government further expressed the opinion that, if there was any occasion to make any readjustment or reform, such readjustment and such reform could easily be affected within the scope of the present constitution and without the necessity of changing the latter. Lastly, the Government declared once again that it remains ready to collaborate in any measure of general interest not inconsistent with provincial rights, for it desires to reconcile respect for these rights with the realization of true progress in any form.

The laws voted by you at previous sessions would appear to be producing excellent results.

In our Province, as in fact in every country where the national economy is well regulated, agriculture must hold first place in the thoughts of legislators and administrators. The credit which you have established in favour

of farmers has not only permitted thousands to remain on their lands and to establish their sons, but has inspired in all greater confidence both in their success and in their noble occupation. Faithful to its policy of encouraging every initiative of a nature to advance agriculture, the Government will ask you to place additional sums at the disposal of the Farm Credit Bureau. It will furthermore submit proposed legislation respecting agriculture, particularly with a view to promote education and cooperation, to encourage fertilization of the soil and drainage of certain lands, and to re-organize the distribution of dairy products, so that they may be more remunerative for the farmers.

An effective method of properly helping agriculture is to assure the progress of colonization. According to the programme determined upon by it, the Department of Colonization is engaged in consolidating the organized parishes and in directing land clearers so that every new settlement shall be a natural extension of an old one. This policy is already producing good results, and the Government intends to carry it on vigorously by supplying settlers with entirely free lands, without injuring the legitimate rights of the important forest industry.

The latter industry, through the measures taken by the Government to regulate output, is now, according to experts, in a more favourable position. Confronted by decreased consumption, it has assuredly had to restrict its activities, but stocks accumulated by consumers for a rise in prices are becoming exhausted, and everything indicates that the demand for forest products will now be on the increase. You will be asked to study a bill intended to simplify the laws governing the Crown lands and to better adapt them to the present needs, in order to assure the forest industry of all the elements of security and stability indispensable to it.

Due to the measures which have been adopted and, particularly, to the inventory being made for the past two years, the mining resources of our Provinces are better known and their development is more vigorously carried on. A railway of one hundred miles, connecting the various mines in the Northwestern region of Quebec with Senneterre and Noranda, has lately been inaugurated. In a few months, a vehicular highway will place Abitibi in direct communication with Montreal. Consequent upon the authorization given by you, Laval University has opened a course in mining engineering at Quebec and the Government has fitted out a mine-school, to better train therein those who wish to adopt the career of prospector or operator of mines. Such undertakings and progress augur well; for the mining industry is closely linked with other industries and, in its development, cannot fail to contribute largely to the prosperity of our Province generally, and in particular to furnish work for youth, whose future the Government aims to assure.

The Government will ask you to study the means of enhancing and speeding up the improvements recently made by our fisheries.

Propositions for better assuring hygiene as well as public health will be laid before you.

Mindful of the future of youth, you authorized the establishing of several special schools calculated to develop each one's aptitudes. At this session, the Government will propose to you to provide a definite solution for the problem of university education. It will continue to interest itself in the vocational training of our youth, so as to afford the latter easier access to the various branches of commercial and industrial activities. The Government will, moreover, collaborate with the competent authorities to furnish all proper assistance to both primary and secondary education.

The special laws voted by you, at the Government's suggestion, have had the effect of remedying many abuses and of protecting many hundreds of thousands of workmen. The Government will neglect no means at its disposal to safeguard, in order and justice, the respective rights of employees and employers.

Owing to the measures carried out by the present Government, the old and the blind of Quebec are receiving monthly a sum of approximately one million dollars. Aid to needy mothers also marks fresh progress, a new reform. The Government will continue to effect every reasonable improvement in matters of social legislation.

Although it has not received all the help to which, in its opinion, it is entitled, the Government has made great effort to substitute, wherever practicable paid work for the demoralizing dole.

The National Electricity Syndicate has begun the establishing of a power plant in Temiscamingue, and the work is being rapidly pushed. The Government is of opinion that the natural resources of the Province should serve and not enslave the people; without prejudicing lawful acquired rights, it will continue to apply the policy which, for the past two years, has produced fruitful results.

The present Government has undertaken extensive work to improve our highway system. Its intention is to remedy, as economically as possible, a situation which it did not create, and to direct its activities in this field so as to benefit the entire Province.

The Committee appointed to study our system of taxation has made recommendations, and you will be called upon to amend some of our laws on taxation.

You will be asked in addition to legislate on various matters, amongst other on small property problems, instalment sales, the distribution of administrative duties as between the several departments, and the supervision of sports.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Public Accounts for the last fiscal year will be distributed to you, and I shall ask you to vote the estimated expenditure for the next fiscal year.

The Public Accounts Committee will be called upon to continue the work begun by it.

“In His Majesty’s name, the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor assents to these Bills.”

Then the Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly addressed the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor, and presented for His Honour’s acceptance a Bill intituled:

- 1— 33 An Act granting to His Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th of June, 1939, and on the 30th of June, 1940, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

To this bill the royal assent was pronounced by the clerk of the Legislative Council in the following words:

“In His Majesty’s name the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor thanks His Loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this bill”.

After which the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province was pleased to close the fourth session of the twentieth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech:

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

The acts you have passed bear on the most varied subjects, and I am pleased to note that they all appear to be inspired by the desire of serving the best interests of Quebec and its population.

Thus, to speak only of those which touch upon the fundamental problems of our Province, your aim has been to give ever-increasing expansion to agriculture and colonization, by authorizing the Farm Credit Bureau to loan an additional eight million dollars to our farmers, by helping the sale of farm products, by placing new territories at the disposal of our settlers, by encouraging the draining of certain marsh-lands, by better protecting our arable domain against unlawful wood-cutting, by further promoting the back to the land movement, establishment of settlers, and also agricultural co-operation and teaching. In order to consolidate the work of higher education, you have assured the completion of the new buildings of Montreal University and have generously increased the annual grants to the universities of Laval, McGill, Bishop's College and Montreal. You doubled the grant of one million which you voted last year for the better training of our youth for various active professions and the opening up of new careers in which youth will find a successful future. You have created an Economic Reconstruction Bureau and have approved the establishment of an agricultural orphanage to train for agriculture orphans who are without resources. You applied yourselves to further safeguard the respective rights both of employers and employees, to facilitate unemployment insurance, to more efficiently defend people of humble means against vexatious seizures, as well as to protect the victims of accidents against settlements too often hastily sought from them to the prejudice of their interests. Your solicitude has again been extended to small property owners. In order to prevent intemperance, you have placed restrictions on the sale of alcoholic liquors. You have made the construction of sanitary dwellings easier, have promoted public health and created a Provincial Sports' Council. You have taken measures to establish a better control of transportation and communication companies. You have fully assured free voting for the election of members and have altered the electoral divisions so as to afford fairer representation in the Legislative Assembly. In order that more benefit be derived from our natural resources, you have granted permission to fish co-operatives to form federations and to the Government to regulate the preparation of fish, to organize mining villages and to encourage the utilizing of certain mineral waste. For better assurance of a balanced budget, you have readjusted the distribution of the administrative powers between the Departments, have created a general purchasing service, have improved the control over expenditure, have provided for the amortization of certain loans and have amended a part of our fiscal laws.

In assenting in the name of His Majesty to the various acts which you have adopted, I had no doubt that they would bring into being the common welfare which you intended to serve and that they would produce the most beneficial results.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for having voted the necessary appropriations for the administration of the various public services and beg you to rest assured that the Government will see that they be employed judiciously and solely for the purposes authorized.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Although international relations are still strained in Europe, it seems assured that Their Majesties King George VI, and Queen Elizabeth will land at Quebec on the 15th of May next. We shall then have the honour and joy of having our gracious Sovereigns in our midst, and I am certain that the welcome which They will receive in our Province will be worthy both of the high estate of our visitors and of the reputation for loyalty which we have long enjoyed.

In bringing your deliberations to a close, I pray Heaven to reward you for your devotedness to the public weal, by showering its blessings upon you, upon your families and upon those whom you represent here.

Then the Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

Honourable Members of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die*; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
