WEDNESDAY, 24th FEBRUARY, 1937

TUESDAY, the twenty-fourth day of the month of February, in the first year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George VI, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the second session of the twentieth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable *Esioff Léon Patenaude*, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the "Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is "His Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of "the Legislative Council".

Who being come thereto.

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You have been convened to continue the elaboration of the progressive measures which the Government wishes to apply without delay, to resume the consideration of private bills,—some of them of public interest,—which lapsed at the dissolution of the last Legislature, and also to examine several other matters to be submitted to you.

The accession of His Majesty King George VI, whose noble character and fine qualities had long won all hearts, was gladly welcomed by us. Amid present vicissitudes, it is comforting to observe that the throne remains not only the symbol of the bond uniting the British nations, but also the bulwark of our democratic institutions and of our constitutional liberties. May Heaven ever guide the actions of our new Sovereign and grant to him and to his most gracious Consort a long, happy and prosperous reign.

The economic recovery in our Province is proceeding gradually but surely. Thanks to the qualities of our population, to the initiative of the Government and also to the measures which you approved at the last session, the future promises to be brighter. No doubt the knowledge that politics and legislation are directed towards the protection of human capital, that agriculture and colonization hold, in the eyes of the administration, the rank which belongs to them, that the natural resources will serve the community and that care is being taken to give our youth its proper place in the development of our patrimony has restored confidence to young and old. This trust in a bountiful future the Government with the help of your valuable cooperation is endeavouring to foster.

You have already sought, by various acts, to insure honest elections, to improve the lot of workmen, to render the Old Age Pension act more effective, to procure for farmers and those desirous of becoming farmers the funds of which they may be in need, to help small property owners, to suppress the deception of ill-guaranteed industrial bonds; the Government, while seeing that such laws are enforced, has taken means to have reasonable salaries paid to workmen, to suppress the abuses of certain grantees, particularly of companies supplying electricity. In the course of this session you will be called upon to pursue the work of reform which you began last autumn.

Important measures will be submitted to you in view of helping to restore agriculture and promote colonization.

The Government bears in mind that, in this country, colonization is closely connected with agriculture. It accordingly seeks agricultural expansion by effecting on a general plan the separation of the arable from the forest domain, so that settlers and limit holders will be entirely free on their respective lands and may derive therefrom whatever profit they are entitled to expect.

During the recess two investigation committees were formed: one to point out means of safeguarding small property owners in urban centres, the other to make any suggestion calculated to improve the present act on collective agreements. In addition, a forestry convention was held in Quebec; its deliberations will assuredly have the best results, especially if they receive the valuable concurrence of the other provinces of Confederation, whose representatives will be convened for such purpose within the shortest possible delay. The Government proposes to welcome recommendations from these committees and from the proposed conference.

The future of the mining industry in Quebec is of the brightest. Its progress and the advantages at its disposal within the last few months enable us to found great hopes on it. But speculation must not compromise everything. You will therefore be asked to approve an act intended to prevent frauds in the sale of mining securities and to protect savings against the wiles of speculators.

Following the authorization which you gave it at the last session, the Government proceeds, through competent and impartial technicians, to make the inventory of our national patrimony, an inventory necessary to ascertain the value of our resources and our means of action, indispensable to afford to every initiative the elements of security and stability apt to assure success. The technicians began work with our hydro-electric resources.

The Government has granted no permit authorizing the development of water powers; it has induced certain companies to sell electricity at lower rates; but it does not intend to stop on the road to urgent reforms. Abuses in the distribution of electricity must cease wherever they exist, and the Government is fully determined to fight them strenuously by every means at its disposal, but with all the prudence wherefrom the administrators of public affairs must never depart. At this very session, it will submit all the legislation now possible for the purpose of remedying the abuses by electric companies. Amongst other things, it will propose to grant, in an effective and fair manner, to every municipality of the Province the right to municipalize the electricity service in its territory. Moreover, it will ask you to create an organism with power to instal certain electric plants, which shall remain the property of the Province and the exploitation of which, independent of the electricity companies and of political patronage, shall be effected in the general interest.

The Government desires to apply better means of assisting needy mothers and orphans, and will submit legislation to you on this matter.

Our laws, generally, need to be co-ordinated and the texts lack the necessary clearness and precision. You will be asked to authorize their revision.

The constitutionality of acts determining the organization of some of our courts has been questioned. These courts cannot so remain under the continual threat of suits for the invalidation of their decisions. A reorganization is urgent. A bill will be submitted to confirm the authority of such courts and to make their jurisdiction incontrovertible.

The Government desires, in so far as it is possible, to help maintain municipal credit, the base of the Province's credit. It will ask you to examine a bill for the voluntary conversion of municipal debts.

You will be called upon to legislate on roadwork, the activities whereof must be directed so as to benefit the whole Province; upon unemployment, which your ministers are striving to overcome, with the full determination to put an end thereto as soon as possible; on various other problems, particularly the protection of the working classes, public health, education and the fisheries.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The public accounts for last year will be distributed to you. Every thing indicates that the results of the current fiscal year will be more satisfactory. The Government is working to establish a balance between revenue and expenditure, by practising economy and by pressing for the collection of contributions. The study of a readjustment of our system of taxation is urgent, and you will give it all your attention.

The Government considers it to be in the general interest to continue and carry on the inquiry begun in the Public Accounts Committee.

The estimated expenditure for the next fiscal year will be submitted to you, and I ask you to approve it.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The questions which you will have to consider are both important and numerous, and I trust that your deliberations will be inspired by love of justice and a care for the public welfare. May God bless your labours, and may they contribute to the happiness and prosperity of our Province.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honourable *Louis-Arthur Giroux* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec summoning him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod placed the commission in the hands of the Honourable the *Speaker* who ordered that the Honourable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honourable *Louis-Arthur Giroux*, accompanied by the Honourable Messrs. *Chapais* and *Nicol*, advanced to the table and the Honourable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows:

After which the Honourable the Administrator of the Province was pleased to close the second session of the twentieth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It afforded me much pleasure, in the absence of the Lieutenant-Governor, to give the royal assent to the acts which have been submitted to my approval.

These acts, and those assented to by the Lieutenant-Governor before his departure, are evidently well advised. To recognize the independence of our religious institutions, to combat communistic propaganda, to safeguard and help youth, to assist the blind and relieve needy mothers; to raise the salaries of our country teachers, assure fair wages for the working classes, especially for forest workers, and to free the settler's land; to encourage people's savings, protect small property, restore the credit of municipalities and revise the various

methods of taxation in use in our Province; to further the progress of agriculture, colonization and fisheries, safeguard the interests of Quebec in the exploitation of our natural resources and promote the development of our mines and of our fish and game reserves; to facilitate the municipalization of electric services, control undertakings for the production, sale and distribution of electricity, authorize the Government to establish electricity generating plants and electricity distributing systems and supervise the shipment of timber outside the Province; to reorganize our Provincial courts, simplify and unify expropriation procedure and consolidate our general laws: such is in fact the object of the principal acts which you voted during the session. Your careful consideration of them is no doubt a guarantee that they will measure up to your expectations and perfectly serve the interests of our Province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In the name of His Majesty, I thank you for placing at the disposal of the various Departments the appropriations which they asked you to vote, and particularly for increasing the budgets of agriculture and colonization. Be sure that all these sums will be expended judiciously and for the purpose which you intended.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

On proroguing the Legislature, I express most earnest wishes for your happiness and that of your families, and I pray Divine Providence to bestow abundant blessings upon our beloved Province.

Then the Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

Honourable Members of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is the Honourable the Administrator's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die*; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
