TUESDAY, 9th JANUARY, 1934

TUESDAY, the ninth day of the month of January, in the twenty-fourth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord George V, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the third session of the eighteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

The mace, which before lay under the Table, was laid upon the Table.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, the Honourable *Henry George Carroll*, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

The Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The year which has just finished has maintained a period of depression which has been weighing on the whole world. I am however happy to see a new dawn appearing. Confidence is being renewed, commerce and industry are more active, our banks have preserved their entire stability, unemployment is diminishing in several places, and it begins to be better understood that work and economy, alike for governments as for families and individuals, are still the best and perhaps the sole decisive factors of a return to prosperity. The convalescence will be long, but it has begun.

Our Province was sorely tried, not to the same degree perhaps as the sister Provinces, but its economic life in every sphere has been affected, and, if praiseworthy initiatives have had to be abandoned, less on account of the necessity of economizing than in consequence of the considerable diminution of the revenue, they are still kept for the earliest programme of execution and progress which better days will permit us to carry out to its full extent.

Many Governments have desired to equalize by new taxes the fall in their revenues. The Government of Québec has thought that the burden which the taxpayers have to bear is sufficiently heavy without being further augmented, and it has preferred to courageously admit a deficit for the accounting period which has just expired rather than to add to the taxes, thinking that future generations which will profit by our progress ought to assume their part of the sacrifices of the present time.

I do not know what the new year has in store for us; whatsoever it may be however the Government declines to have recourse to the imposition of any new taxes.

In spite of the economic crisis, notable progress has however been realized in the Province.

The return to the land is certainly the best remedy for unemployment. The habit of direct relief destroys all spirit of initiative and is moreover

repugnant to the pride of the Canadian workman. This movement towards the land has taken great strides, for 3,500 families, say at least 17,000 persons have become colonists. The past year has even seen an increase in the exodus from the towns to the country.

Our mining industry has benefited by an unprecedented activity thanks to the diminution of the royalty exacted and to the construction of roads which have rendered easier of access the mines for the miners.

In spite of the depression, the Government has thought that it was necessary to maintain in good condition the roads constructed during the days of prosperity so as to preserve this precious capital. It has thought also that it was necessary to make these roads attractive for tourists and agreeable for our own people. During the past year 157 miles of roads have been built; 260 are being prepared.

We have generously contributed to the advancement of agriculture, and the produce of the harvest was superior to that of the previous year.

Grants to the schools, both superior and primary, have not been reduced and if the revenues of the Public Assistance are less, the funds of this Service have been aided out of the general funds of the Province. On this sole head, our charitable institutions have received over \$5,000,000.

But new problems are going to arise during this period of economic reconstruction.

Social and labour legislation, aid to colonization and to agriculture, development of our natural wealth, public instruction, health, mines and fisheries, all are so many questions that you will have to study.

The Government will submit proposals for laws allowing municipalities, in their respective territories, to municipalize their electric systems, if such is the desire of the tax-payers.

It will also ask you to authorize it to set up and maintain farms where unhappy men on coming out of prison instead of being thrown without means of subsistence on the great towns, where frequently their only resource is a relapse into crime, will be able to start again their life and take an honourable place in society.

The Government will also lay before you a Bill for controlling the price of milk, so as to render the dairy industry more remunerative for the farmer, but without adding to the charge to the consumer. This law will also assure the purity of dairy products.

Finally, you will have to study an insurance law which, I hope, will put an end to the conflict between the Dominion and the Provinces.

Various other measures of general interest will also be submitted to you. I may mention them briefly:

The protection of woodmen in the forest; the control of electric rates; the control of transportation by trucks; the revision of our police laws so as to give our Provincial Police the advantage of a single direction; permanence of the dues for the cutting of timber granted to concessioners who have conformed to the requirements of their permits; judicial extension of the collective convention of labour, a system loudly called for by our labour unions.

The study of these proposals for laws will demand on your part all the toil and care which I know you will be willing to give them. These laws are important and will contribute to the advancement of the Province, to the return to a more stable economic life and to the happiness of our people.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will be asked to vote the necessary credits for the coming accounting period. The public accounts for the last period will be submitted to you.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I pray that Divine Providence will enlighten you and bless your labours during the course of this session, which I have the honour to inaugurate in the name of His Majesty the King.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Bryson*, presented a bill (A), intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said bill was read for the first time *pro forma*.

The Honourable the *Speaker* reported the Speech from the Throne of the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor and the same was then read by the clerk.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

As you are about to leave for your homes, I tender you my best wishes for your personal happiness and that of your families. I also pray Providence to shower its blessings upon the people you represent, and upon the whole Province.

Then the Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,
