TUESDAY, 8th JANUARY, 1929

TUESDAY, the eighth day of the month of January, in the nineteenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the second session of the seventeenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Narcisse Pérodeau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being

seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber "of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honour's "pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative "Council."

Who being come thereto.

His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

Whilst it is a pleasure for me to welcome you and to add my best wishes for you and your families on the occasion of the New Year, I cannot but reflect with deep regret on my approaching departure. My term of office will expire in a few days, but I shall ever keep in remembrance the relations so full of cordiality and sympathy which have existed between us.

The one who will shortly occupy my place has played an important part in our Province. Your recollection of him is still fresh, and I well know how warm a welcome awaits him. I join in that with all my heart, and I speak for all of us in assuring Sir Lomer and Lady Gouin how delighted we are to see them once more amongst us.

I am sure that I am expressing the feelings of all our people in saying how we rejoice at the recovery of our Gracious Sovereign. Nowhere throughout the Empire have more ardent prayers than ours been put forth for the restoration of his health. The Royal Family will, we trust, believe how sincerely we have taken part in their anxiety, and how we rejoice at the convalescence of His Majesty.

Few years have been more prosperous than the one just ended. An excellent harvest has crowned the labour of our farmers, who have besides had the benefit of a remunerative market. Our Province has remarkably maintained its industrial and commercial position. We start out on the new year under most happy auspices.

The Workmen's Compensation Commission began its sittings in September last. Thousands of cases have been brought before it. I am glad to be able to inform you that they are being settled rapidly and without expense to the workmen. This law is fully realizing the hopes of the Government.

There has been no slackening in the works on our highways. Our mining development has been carried on vigourously. Thanks to an excellent protection service we have had practically no forest fires. Statistics will show you the progress which has been accomplished in colonization, as well as in public health.

The developement of the Province requires every year new laws which the Government is preparing with care, in order that Quebec may hold its place among the sister provinces and not fall behind other people in its legislation. Several proposals for laws will therefore be submitted to you.

Public opinion calls for a law regarding the press which, whilst protecting newspapers against proceedings that are sometimes vexatious, will nevertheless not allow them to abuse the greater liberty which might be accorded to them. A bill will be introduced with both those ends in view.

The radio has today become one of the great instruments of information and instruction. The Government intends to establish a broadcasting station for the Province so as to bring to our homes things of Canada and of Quebec both agreeable and instructive.

The Department of Roads is making the experiment of keeping open some of our main highways during the winter so as to permit of automobiles circulating at all seasons. If the experience succeeds, this maintenance will be extended. An important scheme will also be submitted to you for completing in a few years the system of our provincial highways with materials which will insure their permanence.

The Government cannot ignore the number and gravity of accidents occurring at railway crossings. It proposes to co-operate with the Federal Government to bring about gradually the disappearance of these level crossings on the main highways and at exposed places. It will likewise bring before you a Bill for the immediate construction of several large bridges the want of which hinders a quick circulation.

Experience has shown that the short courses of agriculture during the winter, as well as the work of agricultural experts and the experimental farms, give excellent results. A Bill will be submitted to you for furthering this mode of agricultural education.

The Government will ask you to make more effectual the existing laws relating to the sale of shares and bonds of companies carrying on business in our Province, some of which have seriously imperilled the savings of the people.

Whilst doing all in its power to favour public education both elementary and secondary, the Government thinks the time has come for aiding the University of Montreal to arise from its ruins and be suitably reconstructed to enable it to fulfil its great mission.

Measures will be proposed to you for creating a department of geology to assist in the development of mines, which is acquiring further and greater importance. You will also be asked to afford better protection for the fish in our lakes and rivers, and also for the trees which constitute the ornament and charm of our main highways. The Government desires, finally, to accede to the representations which have been addressed to it by workmen with reference to fair wages.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The public accounts which will be submitted to you show the flourishing state of our finances. The surplus of the last year is one of the most considerable which we have ever known. Part of it has been employed in the redemption of our Provincial debt. Our revenue has reached an amount unprecedented since Confederation. Secured without any increase in taxation, it shows the progress achieved by our Province.

You will be asked to grant supplies to meet the expenses of the coming year.

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

You will have to legislate on various matters of general interest. I pray that God may enlighten you and bless your labours in the course of this session, which I have the honour to open in the name of His Majesty the King.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.
And it pleased His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Perron* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honourable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*, it was
Ordered, That the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor be printed in both languages for the use of the members.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*, it was
Ordered, That this House do take into consideration the Speech from the Throne of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, to-morrow.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*, it was
Ordered, That all the Legislative Councillors present during the session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and the privileges of the Legislature and that the said committee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

Then on motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*,
The House adjourned.

Then the Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly addressed His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, and presented for His Honour's acceptance a bill intituled:

Chap. 1— 19 An Act granting to His Majesty the moneys required for expenses of the Government for the financial years ending on the 30th of June, 1929, and on the 30th of June, 1930, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

To this bill the royal assent was signified in the following words:

“In His Majesty's name, His Honour the Lieutenant Governor thanks His loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this bill”.

After which His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province was pleased to close the second session of the seventeenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

We are still profoundly affected by the sudden death of Sir Lomer Gouin.

Our Province has lost one of its most distinguished sons and our country one of its most faithful servants. The honours paid to the memory of our lamented Lieutenant-Governor sufficiently prove this. You are the better able to attest it, since you have had the privilege of seeing him at his task and the honour of being closely associated with him in his labours during so many years.

Now that I am called to succeed this eminent statesman and to prorogue the Legislature, a function so tragically interrupted, I feel all the more how great is the loss our Province has sustained. I will endeavour to be ever faithful to the noble traditions so well upheld by my distinguished predecessors.

During the Session now ending you have applied yourselves with zeal to the solution of the difficult problems to which the rapid development of the Province of Quebec gives rise.

You have promoted both agricultural instruction and the higher university teaching, and you have provided an annual contribution for our public charitable institutions which will enable them to take care of a greater number of indigent persons.

By appropriating a sum of seventeen millions for our main highways, you have completed a programme of road construction involving incalculable advantages for our rural districts as well as for the towns.

Amongst the numerous measures of general interest which you have adopted, it is well to notice the law regarding the press which will put an end to certain abuses of which our newspapers complained.

I have pleasure in sanctioning all these laws in the name of His Majesty.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for the supplies which you have voted for the various public services, and for the generous manner in which you have increased the budget of several Departments which have to provide for new needs.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In closing this session I pray Divine Providence to pour out abundant blessings on our Province.

Then the Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die* and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
