TUESDAY, 10th JANUARY, 1928

TUESDAY, the tenth day of the month of January, in the eighteenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India being the first session of the seventeenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Narcisse Pérodeau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being

seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

The Honourable Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor does not see fit to declare the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec until a speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made His Honour will declare the causes of his calling the Legislature.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew:

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Narcisse Pérodeau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council.

Who being come thereto.

The Honourable *Hector Laferté* said:

"May it please Your Honor, the Legislative Assembly have elected me to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the important duties assigned me. If in the performance of those duties, I should at any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me, and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am, and who through me the better to enable them to discharge their duty to the King and country humbly claim all their undoubted rights and privileges, especially that they may have freedom of speech in their debates, access to Your Honor's person at all seasonable times and that their proceedings may receive from Your Honor the most favorable interpretation."

The Honourable *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Mr. *Speaker*,

“I am commanded by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to declare to you that he freely confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative Assembly to His Majesty’s person and Government, and not doubting that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence, he grants, and, upon all occasions, will recognize and allow their constitutional privileges.

I am commanded also to assure you that the Legislative Assembly shall have ready access to His Honor upon all seasonable occasions, and that their proceedings, as well as your words and actions will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction.”

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

At the opening of this seventeenth Legislature, I am glad to welcome both the old and the new Members of the Legislative Assembly. I wish, to offer to them, as well as to the Members of the Legislative Council my best wishes for the New Year.

Two important events marked the year which has just closed. Our Province received the visit of Their Royal Highness the Prince of Wales and Prince George, who were accompanied by Mr. Baldwin, the Prime Minister of Great Britain. These distinguished visitors met with a most cordial welcome, and our people were pleased on that occasion to show their attachment to the institutions by which our country is ruled. Quite recently the Archbishop of Quebec, Monseigneur Rouleau, has been created a Cardinal. This is a signal honour for Quebec, and I take this first opportunity to present to the new Dignitary, in both your name and my own, our respectful congratulations.

Last year’s harvest was one of the best our farmers have ever enjoyed, and our agricultural territory has been enlarged by some thousands of acres.

Our industrial growth has been also remarkable, and the starting of new centres of production has provided our workmen with abundant and profitable employment. This development has taken place mostly in the districts of Lake Saint John, Quebec and the Gatineau, and also in the Eastern Townships. It is to be attributed to the policy of not ex-

porting electric power which my Ministers have adopted, and which will be strictly adhered to.

The premiums on clearing and first ploughing the land have produced excellent results and colonization has been going on rapidly.

Our mineral areas have disclosed a wealth beyond all hopes, and Rouyn now possesses a smelter where they have just started refining copper. Our Province has attained such importance from the mining point of view that the Mining and Metallurgic Associations of the British Empire held here their latest triennial congress.

Two important reports will be laid before you, one that of Judge Boyer concerning the burning of the "Laurier Palace", and the other that of the Commission of Enquiry into the Catholic Schools of Montreal.

Judge Boyer deals with the admission of children to cinematographic performances and the giving of such performances on Sundays. It will be for you to consider his conclusions on these subjects.

As regards the Sunday observance in our pulp and paper factories, there has been a considerable improvement. Some abuses still continue, and the Government is anxious to do everything it can to put a stop to these. It cannot, however, undertake their prevention throughout the whole Province. For the due observance of the Lord's Day, it looks to the proper spirit of employers and their workmen as well as to the co-operation of certain associations, and it must rely on the help of municipal authorities which unfortunately has too often been wanting.

An Interprovincial Conference was held in Ottawa in November last. All the Provinces of the Dominion were represented there, and questions of the greatest importance were discussed.

My Ministers believe that Canadian unity and the future of Canada will be best assured by respecting provincial autonomy and by all remaining loyal to the British North America Act in spirit as well as in the letter. This declaration is the more timely in view of the celebration in 1927 of the sixtieth anniversary of the Canadian Confederation. The progress hitherto achieved, marked by such splendid festivities, should move us to forestall any possible source of discord.

During the Session now beginning, three questions of considerable interest will call for your attention.

Our workmen desire a law providing more generous compensation in case of accidents befalling them at their work than that now in force. After long and careful study, my Ministers believe that they have form-

ulated a scheme which will contain all that is best in our own and foreign legislation. This scheme will satisfy both employers and workmen. To indemnify the workman on a generous scale without injuriously affecting industry has been the aim in drafting a Bill for the new law, which will be submitted to you.

My Ministers attach supreme importance to considerations of the Public Health, and they will give further evidence of this. It is the duty of all to strive to improve hygienic conditions to save our young children and protect our people against contagious disease.

The establishment of agricultural credit, in co-operation with the Federal Government, will afford a fresh proof of the constant interest my Ministers take in the welfare of the rural folk.

To render agricultural settlements lasting and profitable, the Government will also take pains to see that settlers are directed to the best colonization centres such as Abitibi and Temiscamingue. It hopes thus to prevent their being scattered about in parts little suitable for the large cultivation.

A bill for a law to promote the repatriation of Canadians who have gone to the United States will be introduced, provided the Federal authorities proceed with the project which they have sketched out and submitted to my Ministers.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will find a most satisfactory condition in the public accounts which will be presented to you.

You will be asked to grant the supplies needed for the coming year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will have to legislate on several matters of general import.

I pray that God may bless your labours during this Session, which I have the honour to open in the name of His Majesty the King.

In the name of His Majesty, I thank you for the supplies which you have granted for the expenses of carrying on the administration of each of the Departments of the Government.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I have to thank you for the zeal which you have displayed in the accomplishment of your duties. I pray that Providence may render your parliamentary labours fruitful and that it will pour forth its blessings on all our people.

And then the Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die*; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
