TUESDAY, 11th JANUARY, 1927

TUESDAY, the eleventh day of the month of January, in the seventeenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India being the fourth session of the sixteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Sir François Lemieux, Administrator of the Government of the Province of

Quebec being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

His Honour the Administrator was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Although I have previously had, in the absence of the Lieutenant Governor, to discharge the duties of Administrator of the Province, this is the first time that it has been my privilege to preside over the opening of the session of our Legislature. I am much gratified at this opportunity of participating in your labours.

I am sure that I am expressing the sincere hope of each one of you in wishing the Honourable Mr. Perodeau an agreeable trip.

I know that I am also voicing you sentiments in telling the new Governor General of Canada, the Right Honourable Viscount Willingdon, that the choice of him by His Majesty to represent the British Crown in our country has delighted everyone and that his recent visit to our capital has conquered for his person as well as that of Lady Willingdon, the hearts of our people.

Our first duty is to return thanks to Providence for the blessings showered on our Province during the past year and especially for the abundant harvest bestowed upon us.

If, unhappily, the places at our Canadian hearths which the war has left empty can never be filled, Canada can derive satisfaction from the gradual overcoming of the economic crisis which it has suffered from the afterwar disturbance.

Industry and commerce have taken in Quebec a new impulse. Confidence is reviving everywhere and we are going vigorously forward. This movement is being promoted by the Government which is devoting itself to seconding the efforts of our people and is assuming the burden of the necessary initiative.

Whilst the European nations and even some of our neighboring Provinces are staggering under heavy financial charges, it gives me pleasure to state that the Quebec finances have never been in better condition than to-day.

The last fiscal year has not only closed with a considerable surplus but the Government has been able to repay, out of ordinary revenue, a million dollars of debt.

The Government hopes to obtain the same result in the coming year and effect a further repayment of our obligations.

The industrial development of the Province progresses in a marvellous fashion. Everywhere new workshops are rising up which bring us a double economic benefit. They contribute to keep our people at home and to create markets for our agricultural products.

The establishment of these great industries may sometimes involve most legitimate rights. What has happened at Lake St. John is an instance.

Therefore the Government is fully determined to see that such rights are protected. It will look to it that all persons who suffer from works carried out receive an indemnity entirely sufficient. At the outset of this Session it will ask you to provide for the creation of a tribunal, of which it will bear the entire cost. This tribunal, composed of competent and impartial men, will fix quickly, without expense and finally, the fair indemnity to which each man is entitled.

Our agricultural class which is the basis of our national prosperity has need of three elements to maintain and further its progress: roads, markets and schools.

You will be asked to make provision for these three requirements.

Thanks to the alcoholic regime the condition of our finances permits that after a number of years of consecutive experience we can adopt a still more generous road policy.

The Government will request you to authorize it to assume the entire maintenance of all improved roads in the Province, and also the cost of maintenance of other roads after they have been improved. Besides the considerable economy which will result to the municipalities, the unity of direction and work which will be so obtained will give us a still better system of roads.

In order to enable our agricultural products to be disposed of with advantage, the Government will invite you to vote the credits necessary for the creation and maintenance of markets abroad.

A Bill for an Act will also be submitted to you with the object of enabling the Government to undertake the payment of the amortization of loans contracted for construction of certain categories of rural schools. The Government in giving large assistance to the primary schools, will be tending towards the further aid which it proposes to accord at an early date to higher education.

I venture to hope that these measures, which are inspired by the desire of improving the lot of our agriculturists and colonists, will have the effect of encouraging them in their toils and holding them to the land.

To aid colonization and agriculture in the Lake St. John region, the Government also proposes to ask you to vote a money subsidy to a company which will construct and complete the railway around this great lake.

The Rouyn railway is now finished and has already inaugurated a regular service. It will allow of the great commercial centres of the Province supplying this magnificent mineral region, where one of the most powerful smelters in Canada is in course of construction.

We have good reason for believing that very shortly the wealth extracted from the Rouyn mines will bring in a considerable revenue to our Province.

The success of the pulp and paper industry in Quebec has brought hither the establishment of great mills which make considerable demand on our forest resources. The Government intends to protect these mills by following up actively its policy of safeguarding the forest, replanting, wise exploitation of the New Quebec reserves and the inventory of our forests, an inventory now completed over an extent of eleven millions of acres. At the same time it thinks that before favouring the establishment of additional mills, it would be wise to see that there is an abundant forest reserve for the mills already in existence or the construction of which has been decided on, except, however, in those new regions where such mills might become the source of unlooked for activities.

After having been the subject of study for nearly a year, the Workmen's Compensation Act will come into force on the 1st of April next. The Government is confident that it will give satisfaction alike to the workmen and their employers and that the rates of assurance to be fixed will not form too heavy a burden on industry.

The Commission which was charged with establishing the minimum salary of women has met several times and seems to have settled a considerable number of cases to the general satisfaction of the parties interested.

The Government hopes to make a further advance in its colonization policy by adding to the premium for clearing the land an additional sum for residence and first ploughing.

Other measures of a less general interest will call for your attention.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The public accounts for the past fiscal year will be submitted to you and you will note that the financial condition is exceedingly satisfactory.

You will be asked to vote supplies for the coming fiscal year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I beg that you will devote the greatest care to the work of this session, which I have the honour to inaugurate in the name of His Majesty, and on your labours I pray that God may pour out his blessings.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honour the Administrator to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Perron* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honourable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honour the Administrator from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Whilst you have been promoting the industrial development of the Province of Quebec, you have been mindful of the welfare of the agricultural class by having the Government undertake the general upkeep of our high-ways, and by aiding our worthy settlers with the grant of a premium for clearing and first ploughing the land and erecting a residence, besides helping them to build primary schools.

Thus you have found the means of holding a fair balance between the rural and urban people, and I pray that Providence may abundantly bless your praiseworthy efforts.

And then the Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

It is His Honour the Administrator will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die*: and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
