THURSDAY, 7th JANUARY, 1926

THURSDAY, the seventh day of the month of January, in the sixteenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India being the third session of the sixteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Narcisse Pérodeau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec being seat-

ed in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the "Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Providence has bestowed on us many blessings during the year which has just closed. It is only fitting that we should render thanks especially for the abundant harvest which has rewarded the labours of our farmers, and which should encourage them to continue their devoted attachment to the soil.

A double bereavement has deeply grieved our people: the death of the Queen Mother Alexandra, and that of His Eminence Cardinal Begin. It is my sad duty to renew, in your name as well as my own, the expression of the sorrow we have felt.

During my absence in Europe, the Chief Justice of the Superior Court, Sir François Lemieux, was good enough to undertake the duties of Administrator of the Province. He fulfilled them with characteristic care and ability. Permit me to express to him my grateful thanks.

Three important commissions have completed their task on which a report was made to you last session: the Civil Service Commission, the Commission appointed to study the Workmen's Compensation Act, and the Commission for the revision of the Statutes.

The Government has given effect to the report of the Civil Service Commission by a general revision of the salaries of Civil Servants. It has considerably increased these salaries in accordance with the promise which had been made to Civil Servants to improve their position, in addition to having already provided an excellent system of pensions and a group insurance, the premium on which is entirely paid by the State.

A Bill for a new Workmen's Compensation Act will shortly be submitted to you, and you will observe that it aims at doing equal justice to both employers and their workmen.

The new Revised Statutes came into force on the 31st of December last, and we have good reason to hope that they will facilitate the administration of our laws.

Hitherto, as you well know, the Government has devoted itself with care to preserving within our Province its natural resources, especially the hydraulic powers. It proposes to continue this policy on which our industrial future depends, and you will be asked to frame permanent legislation for this purpose without, however, extending to the Sister Provinces, the actual prohibition against the exportation of electric power.

Public education has not ceased to be the first concern of the Government, which is anxious to grant it still further aid, both in university teaching and in the primary schools. It will consequently ask the House to find new sources of revenue so as to render possible the additional grants which it intends to devote to the education of our people.

The Government considers that the time has come to modify the laws concerning technical schools in such a way as to render them more efficient.

Our mines are assuming a prodigious extension. With a view to increasing their development and working, you will be called on to consider whether it is not desirable to make certain changes in our mining laws.

I am happy to inform you that the construction of the railway which will connect the Rouyn Mines to our National Railway System is making rapid progress.

The provisions of the statute regarding enquiries into municipal affairs have given rise to many difficulties. You will be asked to study the best means of remedying these.

You will also have to consider the regulation of autobuses engaged in the public service.

The Government will request you to reorganize and establish on a better footing our London Agency. Our commercial relations with the Mother Country are taking on greater extension every day, and it appears that we might find in England a most advantageous market for the produce of our Province.

You will be asked to authorize the Government to contribute to the cost of constructing a bridge over the St. Lawrence River to connect Longueuil with Montreal.

Other measures of less general concern will equally require your careful consideration.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will notice from an examination of the accounts which will be laid before you, that the last financial year closed with a surplus of receipts over expenditure, notwithstanding the general increase in public grants. You will be asked to grant supplies to meet the expenses of the coming year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Faithful to the traditions of our Legislature you will, with devotion to the public welfare, study the matters brought before you.

I shall with constant interest follow your deliberations through the session which I have now the honour to inaugurate in the name of His Majesty the King.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Perron* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honourable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

You have zealously devoted yourselves throughout this session to the settlement of many and complex questions arising out of the rapid development of our Province.

Our workmen's compensation law has been revised and modified with a view to making it a still more efficacious instrument for promoting good will and mutual aid between employers and working men.

To answer urgent needs and pressing appeals you have found for public education and the reception of the sick in hospitals, fresh sources of revenue which will not be felt as a burden by the taxpayers.

You have been engaged in improving the laws governing the administration of justice and the administration of our municipalities.

You have provided for the completion of our national highways which are the pride of our Province and each year bring us thousands of tourists.

I have much pleasure in sanctioning in the name of His Majesty these as well as other laws which you have adopted to further the general welfare and the ends of justice.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

I thank you for the liberal supplies which you have voted to enable each of the departments to perform its task efficiently.

*Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

Your parliamentary labours will continue to entitle our Province to the high reputation which it has achieved for its legislation.

In your name and my own I pray that Divine Providence may continue to pour out on our people abundant blessings.

And then the Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die*: and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
