WEDNESDAY, the seventh day of the month of January, in the fifteenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the second session of the sixteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Narcisse Pérodeau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec being seat-

ed in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The passing of the year 1924 should be the occasion of our special gratitude to Providence.

Our Province has once more been distinguished by the peacefulness and orderly spirit of our people. In spite of the economic depression experienced since the war, which has been felt here as elsewhere, capital and labour have continued in the midst of our Province to live together in harmony.

An abundant harvest has rewarded the labours of our agriculturists and, if the market prices have not been very remunerative, the quantity of the produce has compensated this to a considerable extent.

The flow of emigration which uncontrollable conditions brought about during the last few years has been practically stopped. Many of our people who had been tempted to go to the United States are returning to their old homes. They have discovered that life is quite as difficult there as it is here, and that it offers fewer compensations. The appeal made by the Government would seem to have been listened to by some who were preparing to follow an unfortunate example.

The Government intends to devote itself energetically to keeping and developing at home our immense natural resources. Our forests, water powers, mines and fisheries are the national patrimony on which partly depends the future of our Province. For this reason it is of importance to preserve jealously and to utilize wisely this patrimony, in order that the inheritance may be handed down unimpaired.

The new organization which the Government has set up for guarding the forest against fire, and the large sums expended for that purpose have produced excellent results. The Timber Limit Holders' Associations are themselves pleased to recognize this. It is the intention of the Government to render this preservation work still more effective.

Not satisfied with providing for the security of the forest regions, the Government is pressing on reforestation, by restoring to value lands ruined through unwise cultivation or fire, by improving the nursery at Berthierville, the output of which will be increased by several millions of saplings a year, by making plantations on the Crown lands and by encouraging private owners to plant their waste lands and fallow.

The Government also proposes to promote the progress of the Province by giving special attention to colonization, agriculture, public education and labour problems.

The principal highways of the Province will soon be completed. I am glad to notice the remarkable results which the Minister of Roads has obtained in the upkeep of the great highways. The burden is heavy from a financial point of view, but this policy has given us roads which are the equals of any on the Continent and it will considerably relieve the municipalities who had to bear the cost of their maintenance.

Attention must be called to the office of inspection and audit of municipal accounts which was instituted last Session, and is now fully organized and already justifying its existence.

Four important Commissions have finished or are on the point of finishing the tasks which were entrusted to them. These are the Commission for the Revision of the Statutes, for consideration of the Workmen's Compensation Act, for the revision of the salaries and classification of the Civil Servants, and for the examination of the school conditions in the Island of Montreal. The reports of these several Commissions will be laid before you, as well as the necessary legislation to give effect to their recommendations.

I have pleasure in informing you that the negotiations between my ministers and those of Ontario with regard to double taxation on successions, will probably be shortly concluded by a satisfactory agreement. The arrangement will somewhat diminish the amount which each Province levies at the present time, but it will put an end to an anomaly of which a number of taxpayers have complained.

You will be invited to pass legislation on a variety of subjects of general interest.

The working of our jury system leaves a good deal to be desired. Too many persons enjoy the privilege of exemption and the impaneling of a jury is not so well ordered as it should be to secure the ends of justice. A bill will be brought in to remedy the defects which have been found.

The Government will ask you to make an appropriation for the edu-

cation, in our elementary schools, of the children of workmen who are left without means by the death of their fathers whilst engaged at their work.

Other measures of less general interest will also call for your careful consideration.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

A report will be presented to you on the financial situation of the Province. The receipts will exceed the expenses, and our Province thus preserves the enviable position which it has held for years past.

You will be asked to grant supplies for the coming year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

Following that Parliamentary tradition by which you are inspired, you will devote to the bills which will be submitted to you your whole attention. I pray that Providence may bless your labours for the welfare and happiness of our Province.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Perron* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honourable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*, it was

Ordered, That the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor be printed in both languages for the use of the members.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*, it was

Ordered, That this House do take into consideration the Speech from the Throne of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, to morrow.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Perron*, it was

Ordered, That all the Legislative Councillors present during this session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and the privileges of the Legislature and that the said committee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

The Honourable *Pamphile Réal DuTremblay*, presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec summoning him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honourable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honourable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honourable *Pamphile Réal DuTremblay*, accompanied by the Honourable Messrs. *Perron* and *Bryson* advanced to the table and the Honourable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows:

“In His Majesty’s name, His Honour the Lieutenant Governor thanks His loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this Bill”.

After which His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province was pleased to closed the second session of the sixteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Session which is now coming to an end has been one of the longest which the Legislature of Quebec has held in recent years.

In the fulfilment of your task you have shown a constant diligence and devotion to duty which deserve to be recorded in our parliamentary annals.

I am pleased to sanction laws prepared with such care and evident desire of promoting the general welfare of our Province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for the supplies placed at the disposal of the various Departments. They will be used with the strictest economy.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Quebec stills enjoys, in our country and abroad, a most enviable reputation.

It is my hope that Providence will bless the generous efforts of our people, and that your labours will have the beneficial results which you expect of them.

The Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die* and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
