MONDAY, the seventeenth day of the month of December, in the fourteenth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India being the first session of the sixteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Louis Philippe Brodeur, member of the Privy Council of Canada, Lieutenant-

Governor of the Province of Quebec being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO

The Honourable Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor does not see fit to declare the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec until a speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made His Honour will declare the causes of his calling the Legislature.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew:

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Louis Philippe Brodeur, member of the Privy Council of Canada, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council.

Who being come thereto.

The Honourable *J. N. Francoeur* said:

"May it please Your Honor, the Legislative Assembly have elected me to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the important duties assigned me. If in the performance of these duties, I should at any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me, and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am, and who through me the better to enable them to discharge their duty to the King and country humbly claim all their undoubted rights and privileges, especially that they may have freedom of speech in their debates, access to Your Honor's person at all seasonable times and that their proceedings may receive from Your Honor the most favorable interpretation."

The Honourable *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Mr. *Speaker*,

"I am commanded by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to declare to you that he freely confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative Assembly to His Majesty's person and Government, and not doubting that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence, he grants, and, upon all occasions, will recognize and allow their constitutional privileges.

I am commanded also to assure you that the Legislative Assembly shall have ready access to His Honor upon all seasonable occasions, and that their proceedings, as well as your words and actions will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction."

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I bid you welcome on this, the first, occasion of your assembling since our Most Gracious Sovereign was pleased to appoint me to my present post. After assuring you of the pleasure I have in meeting you, I am convinced that I shall be expressing your desire and that of all our people by paying homage to my predecessor. He placed at the service of the Province his eminent qualities as a statesman and a jurist. At Spencerwood, he dispensed a distinguished and openhanded hospitality. You will, I feel sure, preserve the most sympathetic recollection of his connection with you.

In spite of grave international and economic crisis, the distinctive feature of the now closing year has been the continuous effort of all nations to mend the disastrous conditions brought about by the war.

Our Province has done its part in this universal toil. But though the sense of order and willing disposition to work common to our people has kept the Province in the foremost rank, yet, as a member of the Canadian Confederation, it cannot escape the heavy burden which weighs on the whole Dominion. Fortunately some relief may be looked for in a harvest which on the whole has proved abundant, a prosperous financial situation, the rapid development of our natural resources, and the vigour and energy of our people.

My Ministers consider that the progress of the Province can best be assured, at the present time, by an increased assistance to colonization and agriculture, a prudent and far-sighted exploitation of our forests, the bring-

ing of our water-falls to value, the development of our fisheries, the spread of public education, a vigorous promotion of hygiene and the execution of such road works as are most urgently called for.

The reports of the departments administering these matters will enable you to see the progress already made in each of them.

An important Colonization Congress has just been held in Quebec. Both colonists and holders of timber limits took part in it. The discussion of the thorny problems which colonization and the exploitation of the forest involve, was carried on in the most harmonious vein. Those in attendance joined in expressing certain wishes, which the Government will endeavour to satisfy, particularly such as concern the separation of timber and colonization areas, the protection of the forest against fire, and the return to their native land of our fellow-countrymen who have wandered into foreign parts.

You will be pleased to notice that some recent enterprises of the Government have met with complete success. Special mention may be made of the Liquor regie, the Public Charities' Act and the opening of Schools of Fine Arts.

The Commission appointed by the Government to look into the Workmen's Compensation Act, with a view to its affording them relief as far as possible without fettering industries, is actively pursuing its labours. The results will shortly be laid before you.

You will be invited to pass legislation on various subjects of general interest.

Certain circumstances call for a more efficacious control of the finances of municipalities. Whilst leaving them their full autonomy, the Government considers it necessary to set up a system of accounting and audit which will uphold their credit and also enable the Government to co-operate with them in many works for which its help is needed.

The Government is also anxious to protect the savings of the people against such schemes as have made serious inroads upon them in the past. It has not the slightest intention of interfering with regular business nor of setting any hinderance in the way of financial operations, but it considers that they should be so regulated as to reassure and protect the public.

Our Province has always considered it a point of honour to observe in educational matters a strict impartiality between the two great religious bodies by whom it is divided. As the Superintendent of Public Education is a member of the Larger body, it seems fair that there should be an official possessed of wide authority to deal with questions affecting the Pro-

testant minority. Such an official must, of course, be under the Superintendent who has the general control of public education in the Province.

The Government proposes to amend the Succession Duties Act with a view to making it less onerous in certain cases. It also desires to decrease the cost of automobile licenses by means of a new classification.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

A report on the financial condition of the Province will be presented to you. You will be glad to see that the revenue has considerably exceeded the expenditure, with the consequent high-standing of the credit of Quebec in the financial world. Estimates of the supplies required for carrying on the public service will be presented to you.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Bills for various measures in connection with colonization, roads, agriculture and the administration of justice will be introduced in the course of the Session. I beg you to give these due and careful consideration.

I pray that Providence may bless your labours that so they may promote the advance and welfare of our Province.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew

To this bill the royal assent was signified in the following words:

"In His Majesty's name, His Honour the Lieutenant Governor thanks His loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this bill."

After which His Honour the Lieutenant Governor of the Province was pleased to close the the first session of the sixteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

At the close of the first Session of the sixteenth Legislature of Quebec we cannot but recall the day when, in this same House, it was opened with all splendour by one whose recent appointment to the post of Lieutenant Governor had been a source of gratification to all of us. Scarcely two weeks passed before he, who so worthily represented our Sovereign, was taken from our midst, and remembering him I am deeply moved.

Important and difficult matters have come before you. Our people will be grateful for the devotion you have displayed in dealing with them and it affords me great pleasure to assent to the Bills you have passed.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for the supplies which you have granted. The money will be disbursed with the strict economy on which the Government has resolved.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The difficulties in which the great nations of Europe are involved are reflected in the economic situation in every country. It is my ardent hope, as it must be yours, that all these troubles may soon be ended and the way opened for the ever growing prosperity of our Province.

And then the Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council addressed the Legislature as follows:

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die*; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
