TUESDAY, 10th JANUARY, 1922.

TUESDAY, the tenth day of the month of January, in the twelfth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India being the third session of the fifteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as summoned for this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, member of Our Most Honourable Privy Council, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most distinguished Order of St. Michael and

St. George, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honor's pleasure "they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I have pleasure in bidding you a cordial welcome on behalf of our Most Gracious Sovereign.

Since prorogation our Capital city has been the scene of several notable events.

Here the Canadian People addressed to His Excellency the Duke of Devonshire, when leaving for England, their parting salutation and thanks for his services whilst presiding over the destinies of our country during the troubled years of the war.

We also had the privilege of welcoming His Excellency Lord Byng upon his arrival in Canada, and of manifesting the kindly feelings we already entertained for him through his leading and care for our Canadian troops.

A public reception was held in honour of Marshal Foch in the Chamber of the Legislative Council to mark our admiration of this illustrious Leader in the great War.

The laws you passed last Session have borne fruitful results.

The division of the administration of Public Lands suitable for cultivation and those for forest industries between the Ministries of Colonization and Lands and Forests respectively has already proved advantageous in promoting colonization. More than fifteen thousand lots have been placed at the disposal of the Minister of Colonization, which will enable him to group the settlers in the most suitable areas and concentrate public works therein.

The establishment of demonstration farms gives every promise of equally successful results. Four of these are now being operated, and

seven others are in process of organisation. The construction of an intermediate agricultural school at Rimouski will be commenced shortly

The working of the Public Charities Act is very encouraging. More than fifty public charitable institutions have availed themselves of the assistance offered them by the Government for providing medical treatment and caring for the indigent.

The Alcoholic Liquor Act has abundantly realised the hopes founded upon it. Many abuses have already disappeared. The revenue which the alcoholic regie brings in to the Government will enable it to afford important aid to public education, colonization, roads and other administrative services.

The excellent terms on which our Province was able to contract its last loan of four million dollars have shown our strong financial position and favourable economical and social conditions.

The unemployment crisis, which is a source of trouble the world over, is far less acute in our Province than elsewhere. Our working classes are exhibiting a fine spirit which should greatly aid in restoring former activities. My Government is hastening the carrying out of works at Montreal and other places with a view to providing employment during the winter months.

Various important measures will be submitted to you.

Great damage was caused to our forests by fire last summer. A bill will be laid before you, having for its objects the taking of an inventory of our forest resources, affording better protection for the forests and promoting reforestation.

Thirty five million dollars have been spent in the last few years in road making. It is necessary to maintain the roads which have been constructed in good condition. A measure has been drafted for ensuring their upkeep without putting an undue burden upon municipalities.

You will be asked to make certain amendments to the Alcoholic Liquor Act to improve its efficacy.

My Government considers that the time has come for revising the Cities and Towns Act, the law relating to Coroners and the Public Health Act.

There is urgent need of a code of procedure for the speedier and simpler enforcing of penalties for infractions of Provincial Laws. A measure making provision for this will be laid before you.

The Quebec Court House is no longer equal to the growing needs of the administration of Justice. The Government will ask for authority for its enlargement.

The Government will also propose an alteration in our judicial system, so as to allow of Judges of the Superior Court giving more of their time to causes brought in that Court.

In furtherance of the policy which, whilst making ample provisions for primary schools, seeks to encourage higher education, literature and the arts, you will be asked to provide for a prize to be awarded each year for the best work from amongst our writers.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

On examining the financial statement you will observe with satisfaction that the receipts far exceed the expenditure.

You will be asked to grant the supplies needed for the coming financial year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will have to pass legislation on a variety of matters of general concern calling for your attention. Your labours will be so much the more fruitful as they are inspired by the highest considerations, and for this I pray that Providence may guide your counsels and pour out blessings upon our Province.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew
And it pleased His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to retire

The Honourable *Paul Tourigny* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec summoning him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod placed the commission in the hands of the Honourable the *Speaker* who ordered that the Honourable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honourable *Paul Tourigny* accompanied by the Honourable Messrs *Pérodeau* and *Kaine* advanced to the table and the Honourable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The measures adopted by you during the present Session are of great importance, and affect various branches of the Administration.

I have particular pleasure in sanctioning them, since they meet urgent needs and are manifestly inspired by a desire to promote the general welfare of the Province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for the ample supplies which you have provided for the public service. The Government intends to observe the strictest economy in the application of the allotted grants.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

Notwithstanding the want of employment which has prevailed in our principal towns during a part of the winter, our Province is showing an economic vitality which is of the best augury for the future.

May Providence, realizing our hopes, reward the persevering toil of our agricultural and industrial people, and bring to abundant fruition your legislative labours.

The Honourable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued *sine die* and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued *sine die*.
