TUESDAY 21st JANUARY, 1919

TUESDAY, the twenty first day of the month of January, in the ninth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India being the third session of the fourteenth Legislature of the Province, of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, member of Our Most Honourable Privy Council

Knight Grand Cross of Our Most distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is the Honor's pleasure "they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO

His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the Session by a gracious speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is all the more agreeable to me to welcome you here that I formerly had the honour of sitting as member of the Assembly, and your coming brings back to my mind most pleasant remembrances of the past. Among these I wish particularly to recall the memory of a man well known to all of you, who was my predecessor and whom the hand of death snatched from our midst but a few months ago. The Honourable Sir Pierre Evariste Le Blanc has left a most enviable reputation behind him; he won the respect of our people and it affords me pleasure to voice your regrets and mine in homage to his memory.

After four long years of continual fighting on bloodstained battlefields, the war has at last ended with a victory which the Allies would never have hoped to be so complete and brilliant. It is but fitting that we be grateful to heaven for it, and also thank the heroic soldiers who so generously sacrificed themselves to protect us and to secure a regime of liberty and justice for the world.

The cessation of hostilities has given rise to new and weighty problems, which Canada and our Province must face at once.

Our soldiers, after writing one of the most glorious pages of our history, have begun to come back to our country. We have contracted a debt of gratitude to them and they will have to be aided in resuming their place in civil life. My government intends to offer free lots of lands to such as may wish to take up farming, and a bill to that effect will be laid before you. My Government proposes also to devote special attention to establishing employment bureaus in the principal centres of the Province, in order that soldiers, artisans and workmen may more easily and rapidly find work and employment.

Our technical schools, which have already done such remarkable work since their foundation, should be of great service to the soldiers who follow their courses, and they are already in a position to receive the greatest possible number of students.

So many million lives have been lost in the war, that it has become

urgent to devote special attention to the preservation of health, either by fighting tuberculosis or again by giving workmen more sanitary dwellings. A bill relating to these two matters will accordingly be submitted to you.

Notwithstanding the scarcity of labour, a considerable amount of work was done on roads during the fine weather season and it is satisfactory to state that the total length of roads permanently improved is now nearly 2,600 miles. Work will be resumed with renewed energy at the beginning of next summer.

Roadmaking in colonization centres has also been pushed as actively as possible. My Government unceasingly devotes its efforts to promoting land clearing and our colonization regions, that of Abitibi in particular, continue to develop in an encouraging manner.

Agriculture is enjoying a period of unprecedented prosperity. Through the initiative taken by the Department of Agriculture and the extra work our farmers did not hesitate to undertake, the greater agricultural production campaign met with un hoped for results, and our Province is to day in a very favourable position for helping to supply Europe, and the mother-country especially, with food. The improving of agriculture is ever one of the matters to which my Ministers devote all their care.

During the session, you will be asked to study amendments to the joint stock companies act, as well as a bill to complete the law you have already passed respecting the prohibition of intoxicating liquors.

In order that the Government may be in touch with all the needs and aspirations of the working classes, it has become necessary to appoint a Deputy Minister of Labour and a bill on this subject will be submitted to you.

It affords me pleasure to point out to you the continual progress made in the mining industry for some years past.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The accounts for the past year will be laid before you and you will observe that receipts have greatly exceeded expenditure. You will also be called upon to vote the appropriations for next year.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will have to legislate on various matters of general interest and you will be asked, among other things, to pass an act for the revision of the statutes. I am convinced that you will devote to the study of these matters all the attention and zeal their importance calls for. In conclusion, I pray Providence to bless you and to shower its blessings on our beloved Province.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Pérodeau* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honourable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

After which His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close
the third session of the fourteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec
with the following Speech:

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You have devoted particular care to the study of the measures sub-
mitted to you during the session, and I heartily congratulate you.

It affords me much pleasure to give the royal sanction to the acts you
have passed, and I am convinced that they will not fail to contribute to
the prosperity of the Province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for having voted the necessary appropriations for the ad-
ministration of the public service. You may rest assured that they will
be expended judiciously.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

As you are about to leave for your homes, I tender you my best wishes for your personal happiness and that of your families. I also pray Providence to shower its blessings upon the people you represent, and upon the whole Province.

Then the Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued until Thursday, the twenty-fourth day of April next, to be here held; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Thursday the 24th April next.
