TUESDAY, 7th NOVEMBER, 1916

TUESDAY, the seventh day of the month of November, in the seventh year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the first session of the fourteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

The Honourable Legislative Councillors convened were

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Sir Pierre Evariste LeBlanc, Knight, Commander of Our Most distinguished order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honourable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed " to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House " that it is the Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the " Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO

The Honourable *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

"His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, does not see fit to declare the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec, until a Speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made, His Honour will declare the causes of his calling this Legislature."

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and His Honour the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o'clock in the afternoon, His Honour the Honourable Sir Pierre Evariste LeBlanc, Knight, Commander of Our Most distinguished order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honourable *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed " to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House " that it is His Honour's pleasure they attend him immediately in the " Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

The Honourable *A. Galipeault*, said:

"May it please Your Honour, the Legislative Assembly have elected "me to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the "important duties assigned me. If in the performance of those duties, I "should at any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me "and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am and who "through me the better to enable them to discharge their duty to their "King and Country, humbly claim all their undoubted rights and privileges, "especially that they may have, freedom of speech in their debates, access "to your Honour's person at all reasonable times and that their proceedings "may receive from your Honour the most favorable interpretation.

The Honourable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Mr. *Speaker*,

“I am commanded by His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to declare
“to you that he fully confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative
“Assembly to His Majesty’s person and government; and not doubting
“that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence
“he grants and upon all occasions will recognise and allow, their constitu-
“tional privileges. I am commanded to assure you that the Legislative
“Assembly will have ready access to His Honour upon all reasonable
“occasions and that their proceedings as well as your words and actions,
“will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction.”

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

It affords me pleasure to see you assembled here to begin your parliamentary labours.

The Duke and Duchess of Connaught, accompanied by Princess Patricia, have just returned to England after bidding adieu to the Canadian people. Our Province, for its part, will retain a pleasant remembrance of their stay in this country as well as of the interest Their Royal Highnesses have been good enough to take in Canada. If their departure is universally regretted, it may, however, be said that the choice of the new Governor General has given universal satisfaction, and, on behalf of all, I extend to the Duke of Devonshire a most hearty welcome.

It is fitting that we should rejoice at the successes the Allies have so valiantly achieved since last session, and at the glorious part so often played in such successes by our Canadian troops. With you, I am proud of the heroism of our soldiers and I bow my head in respect to the memory of those who have fallen on the field of honour.

To relieve our volunteers from all anxiety respecting the material well-being of their families and to give a good example to all our people, my Government has decided to contribute an amount of one million dollars to the Partiotic Fund, in order to induce it to continue its most excellent work. A bill to authorize such gift will be laid before you.

My Government has also considered it was its duty to subscribe half a million to the second national loan, and I am convinced that this patriotic act will meet with your unanimous approval.

I call your attention to the importance of the commission appointed by my ministers for the purpose of finding employment for soldiers returning from the front. Through the devotedness of the members of that commission and the good feeling of the public towards our troops, a great many of the latter have been enabled to obtain positions on their arrival in this country.

The Quebec-Montreal, Levis-Jackman, Sherbrooke-Derby Line and Montreal-Rouses' Point roads, now constitute four of the finest arteries in all Canada, and I have no doubt that they will largely contribute to the development of the regions through which they run.

Work on roads was so actively carried on in all the centres of the Province that it became necessary to increase the amount my Government was authorized to place at the disposal of municipalities. A bill to that effect will be submitted to you. You will also be asked to study a bill respecting the maintenance of roads.

The condition of agriculture is most satisfactory, and I call your attention, with pleasure, to the constant improvement in our dairy products and to the good reputation they now enjoy on all markets. The legislation you have already adopted in connection with the inspection of butter and cheese factories has begun to produce good results, and leads us to entertain the brightest hopes for the future.

The honours awarded for agricultural merit, are being more and more appreciated by our farmers and the number of competitors increases yearly.

The building of the dams on the St. Maurice and St. Francis rivers is making good progress. My Government is now studying the advantages that might be derived from undertaking similar works on other parts of the Province.

In several agricultural centres, there are vast timber limits the soil within which is quite suitable for cultivation and which their owners would be disposed to exchange for lands in more remote regions. Legislation will be submitted to you to authorize the Government to effect such exchanges when it deems the same advisable in the public interest.

The act you passed last session respecting the protection of forests against fire has had a most beneficial effect.

To foster the return of our people to the soil, a most desirable movement, and to facilitate settlement, the Government has actively pushed the making of new roads in colonization centres. Through increases in the grants, the length of roads made and improved is greater this year than ever.

Everything leads to the belief that many families will come from Europe to settle in America and especially in Canada when the war is over. My Government is at present considering the steps to be taken to enable the Province of Quebec to benefit by that current of migration.

Our Province possesses mineral deposits of considerable value and it affords me pleasure to point out to you the importance our mining industry has already assumed. My ministers have every reason to believe that copper, lead and molybdenite mines will be worked before long as well as new asbestos mines.

My Government has not failed to devote its best attention to the needs of education, and has carefully distributed the appropriations you voted for that purpose.

The Sherbrooke normal school is now being built, and will be ready to receive pupils next September.

The law governing the privileges of builders and workmen gives rise to difficulties in application which sometimes render it illusive. My Government will submit a new bill which will give workmen all the protection to which they are entitled.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The public accounts for the past year will be distributed to you and you will observe that receipts have again exceeded expenditure.

The estimates for the coming year will be laid before you, and I will ask you to be good enough to approve them.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

You will be called upon to legislate on several matters of public interest and I am confident that you will carefully study all the questions submitted to you.

In conclusion, I pray divine Providence to bless your labours and I especially beg it to protect the Canadian soldiers and to cause the armies of Our Gracious Sovereign and of his Allies to triumph.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.

And it pleased His Honour the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honourable Mr. *Pérodeau* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honourable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Pérodeau*, it was
Ordered, That the Speech of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor be
printed in both languages for the use of the members.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Pérodeau*, it was
Ordered, That this House do take into consideration the Speech from
the Throne of His Honour the Lieutenant Governor, to-morrow.

On motion of the Honourable Mr. *Pérodeau*, it was
Ordered, That all the Legislative Councillors present during this
session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of
this House and the privileges of the Legislature, and that the said com-
mittee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

The Honourable *Louis Jules Allard* presented himself at the Bar of the
House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod
a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec sommoning
him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission
in the hands of the Honourable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honourable
Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honourable *Louis Jules Allard*, accompanied by the
Honourable Messrs. *Pérodeau* and *Bryson*, advanced to the table and the
Honourable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House

You have voted the appropriations needed for the administration

of public affairs and I thank you for them in His Majesty's the name. You may rest assured that they will be expended economically and for the purposes for which they are destined.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council

and of the Legislative Assembly,

In dismissing you from your legislative labours, I beg you to accept my best wishes for your happiness, and I pray Providence to shower its blessings on the people of this Province.

Then the Honourable Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Legislature be prorogued until Tuesday the 30th of January 1917, to be here held, and the Provincial Legislative is accordingly prorogued until the 30th day of January 1917.
