THURSDAY, the seventh day of the month of January, in the fifth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord, George V, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the third session of the thirteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Horace Archembeault, Administrator of the Government of the Province of Quebec,

being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO :

His Honor the Administrator was pleased to open the session by a gracious speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

It affords me pleasure to greet you on your return to your legislative labors, but I much regret that His Honor the Lieutenant Governor should be deprived of that pleasure, and I am sure I voice the feelings of all in wishing him a prompt return to health.

The British Empire is passing through one of the gravest periods of its existence, and I cannot open this session without assuring our Gracious Sovereign of our entire fidelity and that our prayers are offered up for the success of his arms and the triumph of the cause he upholds.

I think I also reflect the sentiments of the people of this province in testifying to our admiration for the intrepidity and bravery of the allied armies, and specially in applauding the patriotic spirit of our Canadian volunteers.

You will doubtless approve the action of my Government, at the outbreak of hostilities, in making gifts to His Majesty in accordance with the means and resources of our province, and in contributing to relieve the victims of the war in France and Belgium.

As you are aware, the venerable Archbishop of Quebec has been raised to the high dignity of the cardinalate. We should rejoice at this promotion, for, if it honors His Eminence, it proves at the same time the growing influence of our province.

Since last session, two of my ministers have been struck down by the hand of death and I am sure that I express your feelings in paying them this last tribute. Honorable Mr. Devlin and Honorable Mr. Mackenzie ever served their province with as much ability as disinterestedness and all who knew them will long cherish the remembrance of their amiable qualities.

My Government has devoted special attention to the needs of agriculture. To mention merely matters in which it has taken the initiative, I may say that it has promoted the draining of land, founded three schools of sugar-making, appointed new district agronomists, caused short courses of instruction in the agricultural colleges to be given to those who wish to study special

subjects, and has established an abattoir where farmers are taught free of charge by an expert how to prepare and cure bacon.

There is every reason to hope that the best results will flow from all these. Present events demonstrate the importance of farming and my Government intends to neglect nothing that may stimulate agricultural production, just as it proposes by every possible means to encourage people to return to the soil which is so much to be desired for the prosperity of our province.

It is my agreeable duty to tell you that a considerable amount of work has been done on roads during the past open season and that those which the Government has undertaken to improve will, in all probability, be completed within the delays specified in the contracts.

On their part, a large number of municipalities have availed themselves of the Act of 1912 and have manifested truly remarkable activity. My Government will submit fresh legislation to you for the purpose of continuing the work it has begun and of carrying it to a successful ending.

My Government has persistently devoted its attention to favouring the clearing of land and its efforts will soon be crowned with success, especially in Abitibi. A good many settlers, who have carefully been grouped together, have already hewn out homes for themselves in that fertile region and have begun to seed the land. The forthcoming opening of the Transcontinental traffic cannot fail to contribute to the growth of that colony, and everything indicates that the development of the Abitibi territory will be without precedent in the annals of colonization in our province.

The disasters that have befallen Belgium will inevitably compel many of its sons to exile themselves. The Belgians are, beyond contradiction, among the best immigrants our province can welcome. Consequently, my Government invites those among them who are seeking for a new country to come and share our lot, and it proposes to facilitate their advent among us.

The question of Education is one to which my Government devotes its best attention and nothing can afford more satisfaction than to see the happy results obtained every year through the devotedness, efforts and willingness of all.

The Bureau of Statistics is now organized and I am pleased to be able to inform you that the first Statistical Year Book of the Province has been published.

My Government has given effect to the acts passed last session relating to the inspection of hotels and to stationary engineers. These two services are now organized and will, I am convinced, give satisfaction to the travelling public and to workmen.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The accounts for the past year will be laid before you and you will notice that the receipts have greatly exceeded expenditure.

You will also be asked to vote the appropriations for the coming year.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

You will be called upon to legislate on several matters of public interest, amongst others on the inspection of butter and cheese factories and the classification of rivers. I am sure that you will devote to the study of the questions to be submitted to you, all the attention they deserve.

In leaving you to your labors, I pray for your happiness and that of your families, and also that divine Providence may shower its blessings on our beloved province and, at the same time, grant that the cause of the King and his allies may triumph on the battlefields.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew.
And it pleased His Honor the Administrator to retire.

The Honorable Mr. *Pérodeau* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honorable *Speaker* reported the Speech of His Honor the Administrator from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Pérodeau*, it was
Ordered, That the Speech of His Honor the Administrator be printed in both languages for the use of members.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Pérodeau*, it was
Ordered, That this House do take into consideration the Speech from the Throne of His Honor the Administrator, to-morrow.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Pérodeau*, it was
Ordered, That all the Legislative Councillors present during this session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and the privileges of the Legislature, and that the said committee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

The Honorable *John Hall Kelly* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal of the Province of Quebec summoning him to the Legislative Council.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honorable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable *John Hall Kelly*, accompanied by the Honorable Messrs. *Pérodeau* and *Turner*, advanced to the table and the Honorable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows :

To this Bill the Royal Assent was signified in the following words :

“In His Majesty's name, His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor thanks His loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this Bill.”

After which, His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was pleased to close the third session of the thirteenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec with the following Speech :

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

Notwithstanding the pleasure I feel in the performance of my new duties, I cannot refrain from expressing the deep grief I feel at the death of my lamented predecessor.

Sir François Langelier died in the evening of a brilliant career which was an honour to his province and which inspired universal regret in the bosoms of our population.

Before closing this session, I wish to congratulate you on the attention you have devoted to the study of the questions submitted to you. The acts I have just sanctioned will, I am convinced, not fail to add to the happiness and prosperity of our province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

I thank you for having placed the moneys required for the administration of public affairs at the disposal of my government.

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

As you are about to part and return to your homes, I pray Providence to shower its blessings on you, on your families, and on all the inhabitants of the

province and I earnestly beg It to bless and protect His Majesty's soldiers and to bring victory to the arms of the Allies.

The Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honourable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

“ It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that ”
“ this Legislature be prorogued until Wednesday, the 14th day of April, ”
“ 1915, to be held here ; and this Legislature is accordingly prorogued until ”
“ Wednesday, the 14th day of April next. ”
