KNOW YE that reposing full trust and confidence in the loyalty, integrity and ability of *Robert Campbell*, Esquire, Advocate, and King's Counsel of the city of *Quebec* in our Province of *Quebec*, we, of our especial grace, certain knowledge and mere motion, have nominated and appointed and by these presents do nominate, constitute and appoint the said *Robert Campbell* to be Clerk of the Legislative Council of our Province of *Quebec* in the place of Mr. *Louis Frechette*, deceased, to have and to hold, exercise and enjoy the said office of Clerk of the Legislative Council, during our pleasure, together with all and singular the rights, powers, privileges, emoluments and advantages to the said office appertaining unto him the said *Robert Campbell* for and during our Royal Pleasure.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent, and the great Seal of our said Province to be hereunto affixed.

Witness our Trusty and well beloved the Honorable Sir Charles Alphonse Pantaléon Pelletier, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, member of our Privy Council for Canada, Lieutenant Governor of our said Province.

At our Government House in our city of *Quebec*, in our said Province, this second day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and nine, and in the ninth year of our Reign.

The Speaker informed the House that, by the usage of Parliament, the Clerk took the oath of office before the Speaker,

The Clerk then took and subscribed the oath in these words :

You do sincerely promise and swear, that you will be faithful and true, and bear true allegiance to His Majesty *Edward VII*, by the Grace of God, King as lawful Sovereign of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain and Ireland*, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, and to His Heirs and successors, that you will defend Him to the utmost of your power against all traiterous conspiracies or attempts whatever which shall be made against His Person, Crown and Dignity, and that you will use your utmost endeavors to discover and make known to His Majesty, His Heirs and successors, all treasons or traiterous conspiracies and attempts which you shall know to be against Him or any of them. And all this you do swear without any equivocation, mental evasion or secret reservation, and renouncing all pardons and dispensations, from any person or power whatever to the contrary. You shall also well and truly serve His Majesty in the office of Clerk of the Legislative Council of this Province making true entries and records of the things done and passed in the same. You shall keep secret all such matters as shall be treated in His said Legislative Council and not disclose the same before they shall be published, but to such as it ought to be disclosed unto and generally you shall well and truly do and execute all things belonging to you to be done, appertaining to the said office of Clerk of the Legislative Council.—So help you God.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Charles Alphonse Pantaléon Pelletier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO

The Honorable Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

"His Honor the Lieutenant Governor does not see fit to declare, the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec

until the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law, but when such choice shall have been made His Honor will declare the causes of his calling this Legislature."

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Charles Alphonse Pantaléon Pelletier, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

The Honorable *P. Pelletier* said:

"May it please Your Honor, the Legislative Assembly have elected me to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the important duties assigned me. If in the performance of those duties, I should at any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am, and who through me the better to enable them to discharge their duty to the King and country, humbly claim all their undoubted rights and privileges, especially that they may have freedom of speech in their debates, access to Your Honor's person at all seasonable times and that their proceedings may receive from Your Honor the most favorable interpretation,"

The Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Mr. Speaker,

"I am commanded by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to declare to you that he freely confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative Assembly to His Majesty's person and Government, and not doubting that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence, he grants, and, upon all occasions, will recognize and allow their constitutional privileges.

"I am commanded also to assure you that the Legislative Assembly will have ready access to His Honor upon all seasonable occasions, and that the proceedings, as well as your words and actions will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction."

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I am greatly pleased to see you here assembled to begin your parliamentary labours.

The pleasure I feel in welcoming you is not however unaccompanied by some diffidence. Succeeding as I do to a distinguished man who, for more than ten years, presided over the administration of this Province with as much wisdom as devotedness, I feel all the more, the weight of the responsibilities devolving on me and I therefore crave your kind assistance and most active co-operation.

The year 1908 will remain a memorable one in the annals of our Province and of its ancient capital. Two great anniversaries were celebrated : in June the two hundredth anniversary of the death of Monseigneur de Laval, and in July the three hundredth anniversary of the foundation of Quebec by Samuel de Champlain.

These celebrations were acknowledged by all to have been grand and imposing. I am convinced that I but voice your sentiments by respectfully tendering our grateful thanks to the governments that sent representatives to those solemnities and more especially to His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales whose presence added such brilliancy to the ceremonies in July, as well as to His Excellency the Governor General who so greatly contributed to the success of the celebrations and who wished himself to unveil the statue of the first Catholic bishop of Canada.

My ministers still continue their efforts with the Federal Government respecting the annexation of Ungava and there is reason to hope that such annexation will shortly be an accomplished fact.

You will, no doubt, be pleased to learn that all the bonds issued by the Province of Quebec when the loan of 1878 was effected, were redeemed at their maturity, on the first of November last.

It is a very agreeable duty to observe that fathers of families appreciate more and more the importance of a good education, and are making praiseworthy efforts to improve the instruction given their children. My Government is eager to encourage the progress of popular education and it will, accordingly, ask you to increase, this year again, the appropriations for primary schools.

Three new normal schools for girls were opened in September last : one at Nicolet, one at Three Rivers, and a third at Valleyfield. Another will be founded at Hull during the course of the present year.

The organization of two technical industrial schools and of the school of higher commercial studies, subsidized by the Province, is being carried on with all possible diligence.

My Government, which takes a lively interest in the diffusion of agricultural instruction, was pleased to see the Oka agricultural school affiliated with Laval University. By means of new grants, that school was enabled to further improve its material equipment and its curriculum last year, and we have reason to believe that those who intend to devote themselves to agriculture will receive the most modern and complete education there.

Our Dairy School of St. Hyacinthe renders services to agriculture which are more and more appreciated. The experiments recently made on the homogeneisation of milk have had excellent results, and it is to be hoped

that they will contribute to introduce among us that method of treating milk which seems to offer such great advantages both to producers and to consumers.

It is my Government's intention to actively pursue the educational campaign it has undertaken in favour of the improvement of our roads. In order that this campaign may be more fruitful, it will ask you to contribute still more towards the improvement of roads and the building of iron bridges.

The abolition of tolls calls for your consideration and I am sure that you will devote special attention to that important question.

Our lands are being more and more sought after by settlers. To encourage the latter, the Government is vigorously pushing the making of roads in new colonization centres. It will also propose to you to amend the law governing lands for the better protection of the public domain against speculation and to still further assure the clearing of conceded lands.

You will be asked to authorize the appointment of a commission to inquire into and point out the best means of preventing and fighting tuberculosis.

The growth of the population in some parts of the Province has necessitated the re-modeling of our electoral representation. A bill creating new districts will be submitted to you.

The commissioners appointed to study the question of accidents to workmen have finished their inquiry. The report they have drawn up will be distributed to you and I venture to believe that it will be of use to you in preparing an act that will equally protect the rights of employers and employees.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Estimates for the coming year and the Public Accounts for the past year, will be submitted to you.

You will, no doubt be pleased to observe that the excess of receipts over expenditure has been greater last year than ever and that equilibrium in our finances seems definitively restored.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

You will be asked to consider a bill providing for the appointment of a permanent commission to which disputes arising between municipal corporations and contractors for public utilities, will be referred.

To facilitate the utilization of our water-powers my government will ask you to grant the right of expropriation in certain cases.

You will be asked to legislate on several other matters of general interest, among others the electoral system, the Civil Service, Mines, Fisheries and Game and the floating of timber.

I am confident that you will carefully study each of the questions that

will be submitted to you and I pray that your decisions may all be inspired by love for justice and regard for the common weal.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to retire.

The Honorable *Hector Champagne* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the the Great Seal summoning him to the Legislative Council of the Province of Quebec.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honorable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable *Hector Champagne*, accompanied by the Honorable Messrs *Allard* and *Bryson* advanced to the table and the Honorable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read is as follows :

The Librarian has the honour to submit his report for the recess of 1908-1909.

Since the opening of last session the library has been increased by 1410 volumes and 130 pamphlets, by purchase, exchange and private gifts.

The present number of volumes is 73,000 and of pamphlets 18,330.

As the Librarian has already had occasion to inform the House in his report for last year, about one-half of these books and pamphlets are in the library and the other, the less important half, are in six different rooms, some in the attics and some in the basement of the Parliament buildings.

Such a scattering of the books is very prejudicial to the working of the Library, besides the fact that it is calculated to make the public believe that there is no progress in so important a department.

In any case, all the empty space is literally filled up either with shelves or book-cases. Soon the only thing to be done will be to put the books in double rows to postpone as long as possible the hour when several collections will have to be sent to the attics.

The Librarian appeals once more to the generosity of the House by asking it to get built as soon as it deems necessary, a special building in which the books may be kept in a more suitable manner and more in harmony with the position occupied by the Province of Quebec in the Dominion of Canada.

Before closing the present session, I wish to express the pleasure I felt in sanctioning the measures you have passed. These measures have been inspired by an earnest regard for the public weal and I am confident that they will contribute to the greater happiness and prosperity of the inhabitants of this province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for placing the appropriations required by the administration, at my disposal. You may rest assured that they will be expended for the purposes for which they are voted.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In relieving you from your legislative labours, I beg you to accept my best wishes for your happiness and for the welfare of those whom you represent.

Then the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Wednesday, the seventh day of July next, to be here held ; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Wednesday, the seventh day of July next.
