THURSDAY, 2nd MARCH, 1905

THURSDAY, the second day of the month of March, in the fifth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord Edward VII, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the Dominions beyond the seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, being the first session of the eleventh Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Louis Amable Jetté, lieutenant governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO.

The Honorable Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

"His Honor the Lieutenant Governor does not see fit to declare, the causes of his summoning the present Legislature of the Province of Quebec until the speaker of the Legislative Assembly shall have been chosen according to law."

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

At three thirty o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Louis Amable Jetté, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable the *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

The Honorable A. Tessier said:

"May it please Your Honor the Legislative Assembly have elected me to be their Speaker, though I do not feel very able to discharge the important duties assigned me. If in the performance of those duties, I should at any time fall into error, I pray that the fault be imputed to me and not to the Legislative Assembly, whose servant I am, and who through me the better to enable them to discharge their duty to the King and country, humbly claim all their undoubted rights and privileges, especially that they may have freedom of speech in their debates, access to Your Honor's person at all seasonable times and that their proceedings may receive from Your Honor the most favorable interpretation,"

The Honorable the *Speaker* of the Legislative Council said:

Mr. *Speaker*,

"I am commanded by His Honor the Lieutenant Governor to declare to you that he freely confides in the duty and attachment of the Legislative Assembly to His Majesty's person and Government, and not doubting that their proceedings will be conducted with wisdom, temper and prudence, he grants, and, upon all occasions, will recognize and allow their constitutional privileges.

I am commanded also to assure you that the Legislative Assembly shall have ready access to His Honor upon all seasonable occasions, and that the proceedings, as well as your words and actions will constantly receive from him the most favorable construction."

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I am pleased to see you assembled at the seat of government to begin the work of this new Legislature.

Since last session the term of office of Lord Minto, Governor General of Canada, expired. We witnessed his departure from this country with regret, for he had won an honorable place amongst the distinguished men who have been called upon to represent our Sovereign here.

By the appointment of Lord Grey as his successor this Province is guaranteed a continuation of that happy policy of which the fundamental idea is a desire to assure the free administration of autonomous representative institutions in every part of the Empire.

• It affords me satisfaction to state that the balance sheet for the past fiscal year shows an excess of receipts over expenditure. I congratulate myself all the more on this result that it has been achieved notwithstanding an increase in the requirements of the various services.

Public Instruction, Agriculture and Colonization have been the constant object of the attention, study and care of the Government. It has endeavoured to promote their progress and development as fully as the resources of the Province would permit. The success obtained by our farm produce at the St. Louis Exhibition is a manifest proof of the excellence of the methods introduced or encouraged by the government. Its solicitude with regard to education is still further stimulated by the improvements effected within recent years in primary, agricultural and technical instruction in the

various provinces of Canada and the neighboring States, as well as by the resultant necessity of introducing corresponding changes in certain branches of our system of teaching, in order that our population may have at its disposal educational facilities equal, if not superior, on all points, to those enjoyed by our neighbors. This alone can allow of our developing the immense natural resources of our province, of our deriving every possible benefit therefrom and of our being in a position to hold our own against outside competitors in trade, agriculture and industry.

In accordance with an act passed last session, a commission has been appointed to revise the provincial statutes of general interest. This commission has begun its task and will continue it vigorously.

Several contracts in connection with reformatory and industrial schools and the care of the insane will expire shortly. My government will submit for your approval the contracts that have been entered into for the continuation of such services. I am confident you will find that they contain satisfactory guarantees that the interests of the Province are fully protected.

You will be called upon to consider various measures of a general nature. I particularly direct your attention to those which tend to modify the License Law.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Public Accounts for the past fiscal year will be at once submitted to you.

The Estimates for the coming year will also be laid before you without delay. They have been prepared with all due economy consistent with the efficiency of the public service.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In leaving you to your labors, I appeal to your patriotism that you may study with the closest attention the questions to be submitted to you, that you may discuss them with calmness and moderation and that your decisions may be inspired solely by consideration for the public weal and the desire to protect the general interests entrusted to your guardianship.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor to retire.

The Honorable Mr. *Archambault*, presented a bill (A) intituled : “ An Act respecting agriculture.”

Since last session the Library has been increased by 1450 volumes and 100 pamphlets, by purchase, exchange and private gifts.

The purchases were effected with the most scrupulous attention and also with an economy that has enabled the Librarian to balance his yearly accounts. Fresh purchases are always paid in cash and it will be easy to continue this desirable system in future.

The exchanges are as numerous as they are important. By its generosity in this respect, the Government of the neighbouring Republic contributes to the increase of a nucleus of official works, the consultation whereof becomes more and more necessary.

The necessity of erecting a special building for the Library becomes more and more imperative every year. Every delay in that respect becomes a source of serious drawbacks and of injury to the books which we are compelled, in spite of ourselves, to pile up in the attics where vermin, dust and dampness carry on their work of destruction.

Each year's delay in the erection of such a building entails expense in providing temporary accommodation.

The present number of volumes in the Library is 67,750 and that of the pamphlets 18,000.

After which, His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the first session of the eleventh Legislature of the Province of Quebec with the following Speech:

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

In relieving you from your parliamentary labors, I am happy to congratulate you on the zeal you have displayed in the performance of your duties. I am convinced that the legislation you have adopted in connection with the matters of public and private interest submitted for your deliberation, will have the effect of maintaining constant progress in the province.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I thank you for the supplies you have generously voted for the administration of public affairs.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

I beg to express my most sincere wishes for the prosperity of the province as well as for your happiness and that of your families.

Then the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said:

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Thursday the 29th day of June next, to be here held; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Thursday the 29th day of June next.
