THURSDAY, the thirteenth day of the month of FEBRUARY, in the second year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lord Edward VII, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, King Defender of the Faith, being the second session of the tenth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

The Speaker informed the house that a commission under the great seal has issued appointing Frank Pennée, Esquire, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Sir Louis Amable Jetté, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable Speaker of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor's pleasure "they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

WHO BEING COME THERETO.

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

I am happy to see you once more assembled for the performance of the duties entrusted to you by the Constitution.

During the last Parliamentary recess our country was honored by the visit of Their Royal Highnesses the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York. We were the first in this Province to bid them welcome to Canadian soil and it afforded me great satisfaction to see the people everywhere uniting with the authorities to give our noble visitors a sincere proof of their respect and esteem for Our Most Gracious Sovereign and the members of the Royal Family.

Colonization is admitted to be of the greatest importance in connection with the development of this Province. Although there is manifest unanimity in public opinion on this point, it is none the less true that there is extreme diversity as to the methods to be followed to attain the end that all have in view. The system now followed is frequently criticized ; changes are asked for and many plans are proposed. My Government, being convinced that on a question so exclusively national all the opinions expressed are in good faith and that no one has any other end in view than the public weal, considers therefore that it would be in the interest of the Province to take advantage of these good intentions manifested by all, and of the amount of labour and reflection already expended on these new projects, to refer to a special commission the task of seeking the most suitable means of removing everything that might hinder or retard the progress of colonization in our Province. A bill will accordingly be submitted to you for the appointment of a commission, whose duty it will be :

1. To make a careful study of the existing law and to seek the means of improving it ;
2. To examine and report upon such new projects or systems as may be submitted to it ;
3. Finally, to consider all questions relating to colonization and the granting and settlement of the public lands without losing sight of the slender resources of the Province and the interests of the lumber industry.

The negotiations opened some time ago with the Dominion Government to secure the recognition of our rights to the fisheries in the territorial waters of the Province, have been continued. My Government has further submitted to the Federal authorities two important claims connected with this question of the fisheries : one for the reimbursement to the Province of the amounts collected since 1867 for fishing licenses and permits ; the other for its share of the indemnity paid by the United States for the privilege granted the citizens of that country by the Washington treaty to fish along our shores.

The various reforms effected in the past few years in our educational system, have produced satisfactory results. The free distribution of school books and maps has been well received by the people of the Province. I have much satisfaction in informing you that a great many school municipalities and educational establishments have availed themselves of the offer made by my Government and that over one hundred thousand copies of "*Mon Premier Livre*" have already been distributed.

The aid granted to municipal councils for the improvement of roads has awakened the attention of the rural population to this important question and I am pleased to state that there is marked progress in the making and maintenance of highways.

My Government continues to encourage the advancement of agriculture and of dairy produce by providing for the improvement of stock-breeding, by granting premiums for cheese factories, and by diffusing the necessary technical knowledge through the medium of special publications and special lectures.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The Public Accounts for the year ending on the 30th June last, and the Estimates for the coming fiscal year, will be submitted to you immediately so that their consideration may not delay your labours.

Notwithstanding several unforeseen expenses the balance in the Treasurer's hands on the 1st July last was still larger than in the previous year.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

A great many bills will no doubt be submitted to you. Whatever may be the nature of the measures presented to you, your work as legislators is ever of the highest importance. I am convinced that in the performance of this task, you will display the attention, zeal and devotedness that the Province expects of you.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor to retire.

The Honorable Mr. *Archambeault*, presented a bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said bill was read for the first time *pro-forma*.

The Honorable *Nemese Garneau* presented himself at the Bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the Great Seal summoning him to the Legislative Council of the Province of Quebec.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed the commission in the hands of the Honorable the *Speaker*, he ordered that the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable *Nemese Garneau*, accompanied by Honorable Messrs. *Perodeau* and *Turner* advanced to the table and the Honorable the *Speaker* handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows :

Ross, deceased*, and We do command you the Honorable *Nemese Garneau*, that all difficulties and excuses whatsoever laying aside you be and appear for the purposes aforesaid, in the Legislative Council of Our said Province at all times whensoever and wheresoever our Legislature or Parliament of our said Province may be therein convoked and holden, and this you are in nowise to omit.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said Province of *Quebec* to be hereunto affixed : Witness, Our Trusty and Well Beloved the Honorable Sir Louis A. Jetté, Knight commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of *Quebec*.

At our Government House, in Our City of Quebec, in Our said Province, the 23rd day of November, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand nine hundred and one, in the first year of Our Reign.

The Honorable the *Speaker* laid before the House the report of the Librarian of the Legislature for the recess of 1901-1902, which reads as follows :

To the Honorable Speaker and Honorable Members

of the Legislative Council.

The Librarians have the honor to submit their report for the recess of 1901-1902.

Since the last session of the Legislature the Library has been increased by 3,700 bound volumes and 3,965 pamphlets through purchase, exchange and donation.

This increase, an almost unprecedented one, is chiefly due to the fact that the Federal Government of the great American Republic has courteously sent us a large number of official documents through the medium of the Smithsonian Institute.

This happy innovation in the history of our system of exchanges deserves more than a passing mention. Consequently the Librarians cannot sufficiently express their thanks to the exalted personages who conceived the idea of restoring our interrupted relations of friendship and courtesy with the Government of the United States. In 1856, under the Union, the Canadian House of Assembly resolved to send a special delegate to Washington with the view of establishing a regular system of exchange between the central government and the legislatures of the various States. The Honorable Mr. Moore, legislative councillor, was selected as the delegate from Canada, and he received a cordial welcome from the President and high officials of the Congress and Senate. After brief negotiations this matter of exchange was settled to the general satisfaction.

The system worked uninterruptedly until Confederation. Washington continued to exchange its documents for those of the Ottawa Government, and Quebec was forgotten.

Thus a period of thirty-five years has elapsed before we succeeded in being replaced on our former footing and we are finally convinced that in future the Library will have the inestimable advantage of being able to exchange the official documents of the province with those of the American Government.

The numerous volumes received from this source comprise all the documents published since 1869, viz: about 2,550 bound volumes and 3,650 pamphlets. The Librarians have made a special department of them in a large room, in the attics, and so arranged that the public can easily consult them, until the time when these valuable books are incorporated with the others in a new library.

The Librarians have also received from Paris through the Honorable Paul Deschanel, President of the *Chambre des Députés*, the fine collection of volumes published in connection with the celebrated Ribot investigation respecting secondary education in France. The materials collected by that investigation fill six large quarto volumes.

The Library now contains 62,200 bound volumes and 17,500 pamphlets all put in order and easily consulted by means of a manuscript card catalogue.

Your committee have examined this statement and found it correct.

I trust that, through your labors, a fresh impetus will be given to the various works of improvement already begun, and that the progress of the Province will be maintained.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :

I thank you for the supplies you have generously voted for the public service.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :

Your loyalty and devotedness to our Most Gracious Sovereign and the constitution by which we are governed, are an assurance that I can rely on your co-operation in carrying out the laws and in the administration of public affairs.

Then the Honorable Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :

It is His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prolonged until Friday, the second day of May next, to be here held : and the Provincial Legislature is according prolonged until Friday, the second day of May next.
