THURSDAY, the EIGHTEENTH day of the month of JANUARY, in the sixty third year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, being the third session of the ninth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Louis Amable Jetté, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated

in the chair on the Throne, the Honorable Speaker of this House said:
“ Gentlemen Usher of the Black Rod proceed to the Chamber of the Legis-
“ lative Assembly and inform that House that it is His Honor’s pleasure

His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious Speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly

At the beginning of this new year I tender you a hearty welcome and offer you my most sincere wishes for the success of the important work to be entrusted to you.

I cannot open this session of our Provincial Legislature without alluding to the war between the Imperial Government and the South African republics. I am sure that I only voice your sentiments when I take advantage of this occasion to again assure Our Gracious Sovereign of our entire loyalty, and to express our sincere wishes for the prompt restoration of peace in favor of the British Crown which has given us our religious, civil and political liberties.

I may add that our solicitude accompanies those of our fellow countrymen who have proved their patriotism by joining the ranks of the Canadian contingent to proceed to the seat of war.

Several bills affecting interests of the highest importance will be submitted to you for consideration. You will be called upon, among other things, to consolidate our Health and License laws, and amendments to the laws governing Crown Lands, factories and mining corporations will also be laid before you.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

My Government has assiduously applied itself since last session to continuing the work of restoring our finances which it had undertaken to perform, and I am happy to be able to state that it has at last accomplished that difficult task. As you will see by the Public Accounts, which will be at once submitted to you, equilibrium is at last restored in our finances and the ordinary receipts of the year show a surplus over all expenditure, both ordinary and extraordinary. With the kind assistance hitherto afforded my Government by the members, I am confident that this condition of affairs will continue. But to maintain this position it will be necessary to still keep the expenditure within its present limits for some time.

The settlement of accounts between the Governments of the Dominion, and of the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec has made marked progress during the year just ended.

Our Province has obtained from the board of arbitrators an important award condemning Ontario to pay into the Common School Fund an amount of nearly three hundred thousand dollars.

The Ontario Government has however notified my Government that it intends to apply to the Supreme Court for leave to appeal from that award

The question of the perpetual annuities to the Lake Huron and Lake Superior Indians under the Robinson treaties, presented considerable difficulties which, by means of an agreement with the two other Governments interested, my Government has been able to finally settle to its undoubted advantage.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly

My Government has neglected none of the undertakings which it had pledged itself to promote.

The education of youth has been the object of its particular care. It has increased the yearly grants to poor municipalities and to night schools; it has subsidized a normal school for female teachers which has just been founded in Montreal; the providing of free school books for primary schools continues to receive its attention and the system will shortly be inaugurated by the distribution of an excellent map of our Province to all the schools in municipalities desirous of benefiting by the same.

The school inspectors have given pedagogical lectures in their several districts which were attended by a great many teachers of both sexes at Government expense, and in order to encourage them in the performance of their scantily remunerated task, my Government has distributed money bonuses to the most deserving among them.

In order to encourage Colonization my Government has made considerable efforts to open new roads in regions suitable for settlement and many settlers have taken advantage of this to establish themselves there.

Agriculture has also received a liberal share of encouragement from my Government which has paid attention to improving the quality of butter and cheese, to propagating the best kinds of fruit trees and to providing municipalities with better highways.

In consequence of a judgment of the Privy Council, which was communicated last year to this Legislature, my Government has become vested with the ownership of a portion of the fisheries formerly under the administration of the Federal Government. The judicious application of the law passed on the subject last session and of the Game Law, together with the part taken by the Province in the New York Sportsmen's Exhibition in 1899, have resulted in a marked increase in the Provincial Revenue.

My Government has devoted its particular attention to protecting and profitably utilizing our immense forests, our splendid water-powers and mineral resources. Thanks to its assistance, a number of new industries continue to be established and populous manufacturing centres are springing up in regions until recently uninhabited.

Within the past few years pulp wood has assumed such importance in connection with the prosperity of our population and the public revenue, that my Government has deemed it advisable to take steps to increase the manufacture of pulp in this country to the benefit of our industrial and laboring population.

I now leave you to pursue your labors, which, I am convinced, will be enlightened by divine Providence.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor to retire.

The Honorable Mr. *Archangeault*, presented a bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said bill was read for the first time *pro-formâ*.

The Honorable *Speaker* reported the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor from the throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Archangeault*, it was,

Ordered, that the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor be printed in both languages for the use of members.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Archangeault*, it was

Ordered, that this House do take into consideration the speech from the Throne of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, to-morrow.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Archangeault*, it was

Ordered, that all the Legislative Councillors present during the session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and the privileges of the Legislature, and that the said committee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

The House adjourned.

The Librarian of the Legislature has the honor to submit his report for the recess of 1899 :

Since the opening of the session of 1899, the Library has been increased by 1,417 volumes and 274 pamphlets by purchase, exchange and gifts.

At present the Library contains 56,500 volumes and nearly 13,000 pamphlets bound in 438 volumes, by series of from fifteen to twenty, and which can be easily consulted by means of a special catalogue.

The Librarian again calls attention to the fact that the rooms at his disposal are overcrowded. He has had to place in other quarters, more or less accessible, about 23,000 volumes including the bound newspapers and most of the works that come to him by exchange with other countries. Such an anomaly cannot long exist without certain inconvenience to the daily service.

Since last year the Library has been resorted to more than usual. The registers contain the names of eight hundred readers, one half of whom at least display great regularity.
