

The Honorable the *Speaker* then took the chair at the foot of the Throne.

The Mace (which before lay under the table) was then laid on the table.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable Joseph Adolphe Chapleau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable *Speaker* of this House said : "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and acquaint that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto.

His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was then pleased to open the session by a gracious speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

I am greatly pleased to see you once more assembled at the seat of Government for the performance of the important duties which the Constitution and public interest impose upon you, and to welcome you here.

Our thanks are due to Divine Providence for the abundant harvest with which our country has been favoured.

May a remunerative market await our agricultural products. The effects of the prosperity amongst our farming community will then spread to other classes of society and we will no longer suffer from the crisis which, although it but slightly affected this country while making itself severely felt elsewhere, has nevertheless caused a depression in business.

My government has endeavoured as far as possible to direct dairy operations and, in order to prevent over-stocking of the cheese market, has specially favoured butter-making and awarded bounties for winter dairying. The quantity of butter manufactured in winter has more than doubled during the three years that these bounties have been granted.

This question of equilibrium in production having been placed on a sound basis, my Government has striven to restore the reputation of butter from the Province of Quebec, in England, a reputation which had greatly suffered from shipments made under unsuitable circumstances. The results hitherto obtained have been most satisfactory; butter from the Province is now classed in England amongst the best products of a similar nature of the whole world. The exports of this article which fell off in 1894 have again increased. Last year they were double those of the previous year and they promise to increase to still greater extent in the future.

The total production of our dairies of the Province of Quebec, which did not amount to three millions of dollars in 1890, exceeded seven millions in 1894.

If deposits in the savings banks by private individuals be a criterion of the prosperity of a country, we have a right to conclude from official information obtained that, in this respect, the Province of Quebec leads the Provinces of the Dominion.

While the progress which is being made in every branch of agriculture, is attracting the attention of our sister provinces and of foreign countries to this Province, new regions are being opened to agricultural settlement. The fertile lands of the Metapedia, of Lake St-John, Temiscamingue and the section north of Montreal are being colonized by hardy settlers from the old parishes and from some of the cities of Canada and the United States. This colonization movement, which my Government has fostered as much as possible, is chiefly explained by the success of agriculture throughout the Province and by the attention and solicitude manifested for farming by the leading classes of our community. Our people appreciate to an ever increasing extent the nobility and advantages of an agricultural career, and there is every reason to hope that this will prove an efficient remedy for the depopulation of our rural districts and for that emigration which has hitherto been so prejudicial to this Province.

The state of our finances will enable my Government to propose to you the abolition of "the manufacturing and trading licences and the direct taxes on certain persons." But the financial situation cannot be definitely settled until the railway enterprizes now being carried out have been completed or abandoned, nor until the commission appointed to arbitrate upon the disputed accounts between the Government of Canada and the Governments of Quebec and Ontario, has completed its task.

Under the laws you have already passed, the building of the railways subsidized by the Province has to be finished or given up within a very short delay.

As regards the arbitration, I, last year, expressed the hope that I would be able to inform you of its termination at the opening of this session. To my deep regret, this hope has not been fulfilled; not because my Government has neglected this important matter, nor because there was any unwillingness on the part of the others interested; but the study of the subjects under contention has met with more difficulties and requires more labour than had been foreseen. It is to be feared that several months will yet elapse before this arbitration is concluded. Let us hope that, to avoid so long a delay, the three governments will, by a compromise, settle some of the least important points in contestation.

Intemperance continues to cause great ravages in the midst of our population. It is the duty of the Government to have the laws governing the sale of intoxicating liquor carried out still more vigorously and effi-

ciently, and it is your duty as good citizens to facilitate the accomplishment of that task. It does not take long to learn how to evade laws enacted for the protection of society against the dangers of this traffic; therefore you will, this year again, be called upon to amend these laws.

The commission appointed to codify the laws of civil procedure has completed its labours. You will, this session, be in a position to study, in its entirety, the draft code which it has prepared. I am convinced that you will find in it the reforms which the magistracy, the bar and litigants have so long asked for.

The laws adopted by the Legislature of this Province some twenty years ago preserving purity in elections certainly produced excellent results in the first elections following their coming into force; but the ardour of party strife, the facility with which controverted elections are settled by compromise, certain amendments adopted by the Legislature, and perhaps also a less rigorous application of these laws by the courts have already lessened their efficiency. You will therefore be called upon to consider amendments to the election act and to the controverted elections act.

You will further have to legislate upon certain matters of minor importance.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Public Accounts will be laid before you as usual, and you will be asked to vote supplementary estimates for the current year and the sums required for the fiscal year 1896-97.

Honorable Gentleman of the Legislative Council,

Gentleman of the Legislative Assembly,

I trust that your deliberations will be governed by the sincere desire of rendering to the people whose interests have been confided to you, those services which they have a right to expect from you. May Divine Providence enlighten and bless your labors.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor to retire.

The Honorable Mr *Chapais* presented a Bill (A) intituled: "An Act respecting agriculture."

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro formâ*.

The Honorable Gedeon Ouimet presented himself at the bar of the House and placed in the hands of the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod a commission under the great seal summoning him to the Legislative Council of the Province of Quebec.

The Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod having placed this commission in the hands of the Honorable the Speaker, he ordered : " That the Honorable Councillor be admitted.

Then the said Honorable Gedeon Ouimet accompanied by the Honorable Messieurs *Larue* and *Sharples* advanced to the table and the Honorable the Speaker handed the commission to the clerk of the House who read it as follows :

Whereupon the clerk of this Honorable House declared that the said Honorable *Gedeon Ouimet* had taken the required oath, and signed his declaration of qualification.

The Honorable the Speaker presented to the House a statement of the affairs of the Montreal lying-in Hospital “Sœurs de la Miséricorde” for the year 1895.

The Honorable the Speaker laid before the House the Report of the Librarian of the Legislature for the year 1895, as follows :

The Librarian of the Legislature has the honour to submit the following report for the recess of 1895.

Since last session the Librarian has had the card-catalogue, commenced in 1893, completed. This catalogue comprises about 12,000 cards, with four copies of each. These cards have been placed in a special cabinet and re easily consulted.

On one side there is the catalogue by alphabetical order and on the other that by order of subjects. The two systems combined are an excellent substitute for a printed catalogue for those who frequent the library ; but the public generally would derive more benefit from a printed catalogue.

The library has been enriched by a rather considerable collection of works on the jurisprudence and Legislation of Belgium. Several members having expressed the desire of consulting works of this kind, the Librarian considered himself justified in meeting wishes so frequently expressed.

The number of volumes in the Library is now 48,000. The Librarian has purchased 1217 volumes and 631 pamphlets, since the beginning of the session of 1894.

The order of the day being read for the consideration of the speech from the throne of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor at the opening of the session,

The Honorable Mr. *Ouimet*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Wood*, moved That the following address be presented to His Honour the Lieutenant Governor thanking him for his gracious speech at the opening of the present session, namely.

To His Honor the Honorable Joseph Adolphe Chapleau, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec.

May it please your Honor.

We Her Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects the Legislative Council of the Province of Quebec in Provincial Legislature assembled humbly thank your Honor for your gracious Speech in which you declare that you are greatly pleased to see us once more assembled at the seat of Government for the performance of the important duties which the Constitution and public interest impose upon us, and extend a welcome to us.

We should, with you, render thanks to Divine Providence for the abundant harvest with which our country has been favoured.

We join with your Honor in praying that a remunerative market may await our agricultural products, and that we believe with your Honor that the effects of the prosperity amongst our farming community will then spread to other classes of society, and that we will no longer suffer from the crisis which, although it but slightly affected this country while making itself severely felt elsewhere, has nevertheless caused a depression in business.

We learn with satisfaction that the Government has endeavoured as far as possible to direct dairy operations and that in order to prevent over-stocking of the cheese market, it has specially favoured butter-making and awarded bounties for winter dairying, and that the quantity of butter manufactured in winter has more than doubled during the three years that these bounties have been granted.

We are pleased to learn that having placed on a sound basis this question of equilibrium in production, the Government has striven to restore the reputation of butter from the Province of Quebec, in England, a reputation which had greatly suffered from shipments made under unsuitable circumstances ; that the results hitherto obtained have been most satisfactory, butter from the Province being now classed in England amongst the best products of a similar nature of the whole world, that the exports of this article which fell off in 1894 have again increased ; that last year they were double those of the previous year, and that they promise to increase to a still greater extent in the future.

We are pleased to learn that the total production of our dairies of the Province of Quebec, which did not amount to three millions of dollars in 1890, exceeded seven millions in 1894.

We admit with your Honour that, if deposits in the savings banks by private individuals be a criterion of the prosperity of a country, we have a right to conclude from official information obtained that, in this respect the Province of Quebec leads the Provinces of the Dominion.

We learn with satisfaction that, while the progress which is being made in every branch of agriculture, is attracting the attention of our sister provinces and of foreign countries to this province, new regions are being opened to agricultural settlement ; that the fertile lands of the Metapedia, Lake St-John, Temiscamingue and the section north of Montreal are being colonized by hardy settlers from the old parishes and from some of the cities of Canada and the United-States ; that this colonization movement, which the Government has fostered as much as possible is chiefly explained by the success of agriculture throughout the Province and by the attention and solicitude manifested for farming by the leading classes of our community, that our people appreciate to an ever-increasing extent the nobility and advantages of an agricultural career, and that there is every reason to hope that this will prove an efficient remedy for the depopulation of our rural districts and for that emigration which has hitherto been so prejudicial to this Province.

We are happy to learn that the state of our finances will enable the Government to propose to us the abolition of " the manufacturers and trading licenses " and the " direct taxes on certain persons " ; but that we admit with your Honour that the financial situation cannot be definitely settled until the railway enterprises now being carried out have been completed or abandoned, nor until the commission appointed to arbitrate upon the disputed accounts between the Government of Canada and the Governments of Quebec and Ontario, has completed its task.

We admit with your Honour that under the laws we have already passed, the building of the railways subsidized by the Province has to be finished or given up within a very short delay.

As regards the hope expressed last year by your Honour that you would be able to inform us of the termination of the arbitration at the opening of this session, we with your Honour deeply regret that this hope has not been fulfilled, not because the Government has neglected this important matter, nor because there was any unwillingness on the part of the others interested, but that the study of the subjects under contention has met with more difficulties and requires more labour than had been foreseen, and that it is to be feared that several months will yet elapse before this arbitration is concluded, and that we with your Honour hope that, to avoid so long a delay, the three governments will, by a compromise, settle some of the least important points in contestation.

We acknowledge, with your Honour, that, as intemperance continues to cause great ravages in the midst of our population, it is the duty of the Government to have the laws governing the sale of intoxicating liquours carried out still more vigorously and efficiently, and that it is our duty as good citizens to facilitate the accomplishment of that task ; that we admit that it does not take long to learn how to evade laws enacted for the protection of society against the dangers of this traffic, and that we are interested in learning that we will, therefore this year again, be called upon to amend these laws.

We are pleased to learn from your Honour that the commission appointed to codify the laws of civil procedure has completed its labours, and that we will, this session, be in a position to study, in its entirety, the draft code which it has prepared, and are with your Honour confident that we will find in it the reforms which the magistracy, the bar and litigants have so long asked for.

We admit with your Honour that the laws adopted by the Legislature of this Province some twenty years ago for preserving purity in elections certainly produced excellent results in the first elections following their coming into force ; but that the ardour of party strife, the facility with which controverted elections are settled by compromise, certain amendments adopted by the Legislature, and perhaps also a less rigorous application of these laws by the courts, have already lessened their efficiency, and that we learn with interest that we will therefore be called upon to consider amendments to the election act and to the controverted elections act.

We learn with interest that we will further have to legislate upon certain matters of minor importance.

We, with your Honour, trust that our deliberations will be governed by the sincere desire of rendering to the people, whose interests have been confided to us, those services which they have a right to expect from us, and join with him in praying that Divine Providence may enlighten and bless our labours.

The question of concurrence being put thereon it was unanimously resolved in the affirmative.

Your committee have examined the accounts and disbursements of the clerk from the 1st November 1894, date up to which the accounts were last audited, to the thirty first October last (1895).

The clerk has rendered a detailed account with vouchers numbered from 94 to 434 inclusive of his disbursements from the first November 1894 to the thirtieth June 1895, and from 1 to 91 inclusive, from the first of July 1895 to thirty first October last (1895), showing the disbursements of the Legislative Council between the said dates to be \$36,261.89, of which \$31,799.49 were disbursed from the said first November 1894 to the first July 1895 and \$4,462.40 were disbursed from the first July 1895 to the thirty first October last (1895).

Your committee recommend that all moneys unexpended on the 30th of June, in each year, should be returned to the Treasury Department.

Your committee have found that Rule 8 and 9 adopted by the Legislative Council, on the 8th June 1892, has not been complied with and recommend that in future it be carried out, under the direction of the speaker.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

COMMITTEE ON THE CODE OF PROCEDURE.

Report of the Committee

Your committee have had several meetings at which they have examined a portion of the draft code.

Your committee first took into consideration two important questions which presented themselves at the very outset of the discussion.

1. Whether the Code should be adapted to the act respecting judicial reorganization introduced by the Honorable the Attorney General in the session of 1893.

2. Whether article 23 of the present Code of Procedure should be altered so as to deprive notaries of the right of representing parties in non-contentious proceedings,

On the first point, the Attorney General declare that an understanding had been come to with the Right Honorable Sir John Thompson, while the latter was minister of Justice whereby the new judges of dis-

strict courts were to be appointed immediately, but that he has not had an opportunity of making the same arrangement with Sir Charles H. Tupper, the new minister of Justice.

It was therefore moved and resolved that the re-organization of the law-courts be left in suspense for the moment and, consequently, that the code be adopted to the rules of judicature as they now exist.

Your committee had the honor of receiving a very influential deputation on behalf of the notarial profession and, after discussion, it was decided not to make any change in the code of Civil Procedure. After having disposed of these two questions, your committee proceeded to examine the draft code in detail. They adopted the order of subjects as set forth in the third report of the Commissioners. They then proceeded to examine the various articles of the draft and studied 128 which they adopted with some alterations suggested to the Commissioners.

The Commissioners, with one of the secretaries, attended a meeting of the Committee and gave the necessary explanations to allow of their studying the draft. The committee also employed a stenographer who took note of all the suggestions made either by the members of the committee or by other persons who were present at the sittings.

Several members of the Committee after having studied the whole of the draft as submitted by the Houses, have expressed the opinion that they approved it on the whole.

Your committee recommend that the draft be left before the public for consideration between now and next session and they ask all those who are interested in it to examine it carefully and to send to the Attorney General any suggestions or recommendations they may deem advisable to make.

Your committee further recommend that, at the beginning of the next session, a committee be appointed to resume the study of the draft which will then be considered in its entirety, discussion being confined to contested articles.

- “ 1—59. An Act granting to Her Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the government for the financial years ending on the 30th June, 1896, and on the 30th June, 1897, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

To this Bill the royal assent was signified in the following words :

In Her Majesty's name, His Honor the Lieutenant Governor thanks Her loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this bill.

After which, His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the fifth session of the eighth Legislature of the Province of Quebec with the following speech.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

In closing the labors of this session I desire to thank you for your diligence in the accomplishment of your duties; the careful attention which you have manifested in both private and public legislation will produce the most beneficial results.

Your election legislation, based on the laws now in force in the United Kingdom will assure more independence on the part of the electors in voting and give the courts more efficient means for the repression of corrupt practices.

Agricultural progress which has attained such development through the encouragement you have given it, has again been the object of your consideration. I trust that it will continue to receive the attention of the Legislature and be the most prominent feature of the policy of my Government as agricultural prosperity is the best security for the welfare of the people.

I regret that the present resources of the Province did not permit my Government to grant the applications for railway subsidies which were submitted to it. I hope, however, that it will find means to protect those undertakings which, if abandoned, would cause a serious loss to the Province.

Through its policy of economy my Government has been able to do away with certain taxes and I have no doubt that if the same policy be prudently carried out, other taxes will before long, be removed.

The financial situation of the province is improving in a marked manner and I am convinced that with renewed vigilance my government will succeed in maintaining the credit of the Province.

The result of the labors of the commission entrusted with revision of the laws concerning civil procedure has been submitted to you and I am confident that this long wished for revision will be completed during next session.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

[D In Her Majesty's name I thank you for the supplies you have so generously voted for the various branches of the public service.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly

Now that you are about to separate and to return to your homes I sincerely wish you all happiness and I pray God to extend his protection to your families and to all the inhabitants of this faithful and loyal Province.

Then the Honorable the speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

It is His Honour the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Friday, the thirty first day of January next, to be here held; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until the thirty first day of January next.
