THURSDAY, the TWELFTH day of the month of JANUARY in the fifty sixth year of the Reign of Our Sovereign Lady Victoria, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, being the second session of the eighth Legislature of the Province of Quebec, as continued by several prorogations to this day.

At three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable JOSEPH

ADOLPHE CHAPLEAU, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable *Speaker* of this House said: " Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and acquaint that House that it is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council "

Who being come thereto.

His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the session by the following gracious speech from the Throne to both House

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

It is with feelings of pleasure that I welcome you at the opening of this session, the first since I had the distinguished honor of being appointed by the representative of Our Sovereign to the office of Lieutenant-Governor of this Province.

You will be pleased to learn that during the past year the financial situation has been markedly improved.

So far as it is possible to determine from the six months since the first of July last, the sums voted for the ordinary expenses of the year 1892-93, which showed a reduction of more than four hundred thousand dollars over those of the preceding year, will be sufficient and probably more than sufficient, while the usual ordinary receipts apart from the new sources of revenue will exceed the expectations of the government.

It is true that the act passed last session to meet the exigencies of the situation have been subject to criticism ; however I am pleased to find that such has generally been in a friendly spirit. It does not exhibit any tendency to refuse the government the means of meeting their obligations and of maintaining provincial institutions, but confines itself to requiring that public business be administered with the strictest economy, and that certain modifications be made.

My government is confident public opinion will be completely satisfied on examining the evidence of the retrenchments made, and on being assured that such amendments will be adopted as will be justified by the working of the present law and when fuller statistics and information will have been received than existed at last session.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

The public accounts for the last year will be laid before you as well as the estimates for the year commencing on the first of July next. I am convinced that you will not refuse to actively assist my government in the measures which they propose submitting to you so as to bring about further economy in the administration of public affairs.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

You will be called upon to legislate upon the pensioning of public officers, the salaries of registrars and of certain officers of justice and upon the establishment of agricultural associations.

Agriculture should, next after the reduction of the expenditure and the increasing of the revenue, be the chief object of your attention.

The system, so successfully inaugurated last fall, for the encouragement of butter making during winter gave results which exceeded expectations. It is truly a salutary revolution that is taking place in our system of agriculture, and my government wishes to continue this system for the next three years.

My government will continue to force as much as possible the establishment of butter and cheese syndicates so as to secure throughout the province the manufacture of a uniform article of excellent quality.

You will have to pronounce upon bills respecting the sale of intoxicating liquors, civil procedure, the construction and working of railways subsidized by the government, the granting of charters for that purpose, and the payment of debts incurred in the carrying out of these enterprises.

I pray that Providence will bless your labors, and I earnestly hope that your devotion to our dear province will safely guide you in the way of duty.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew and it pleased His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor to retire.

The Honorable *J. J. Ross*, presented a Bill (A) respecting agriculture.

The said Bill was read for the first time *pro forma*.

The Honorable Speaker reported the speech of His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor from the Throne and the same was then read by the clerk.

On motion of the Honorable *J. J. Ross*, it was.

Ordered, that the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor be printed in both languages for the use of members.

On motion of the Honorable *J. J. Ross*, it was

Ordered, that this House do take into consideration the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, to-morrow.

On motion of the Honorable *J. J. Ross*, it was.

Ordered that all the Legislative Councillors present during the session be appointed a committee to consider of the orders and customs of this House and the privileges of Parliament, and that the said committee have leave to sit in this House when and as often as they please.

On motion of the Honorable *J. J. Ross* seconded by the Honorable Mr *Starnes* it was

Ordered that as a mark of respect to the memory of the late Honorable *Elisée Dionne* this House do now adjourn.

And the question of concurrence being put on the said motion, it was *Resolved*, in the affirmative.

Then, the House adjourned until to-morrow at three o'clock P. M.

5. That we admit with His Honour that agriculture should, next after the reduction of the expenditure and the increasing of the revenue, be the chief object of our attention ;

6. 7. That we are happy to learn that the government will continue to favour as much as possible the establishment of butter and cheese syndicates, so as to secure throughout the province the manufacture of a uniform article of excellent quality ;

8. That we learn with interest that we will have to pronounce upon bills respecting the sale of intoxicating liquors, civil procedure, the construction and working of railways subsidized by the government, the granting of charters for that purpose, and the payment of debts incurred in the carrying out of these enterprises.

9. That we join with His Honour in his prayer that Providence will bless our labours, and thank him for his earnest desires that our devotion to our dear province will safely guide us in the way of duty.

The first paragraph having been read again.

The Honorable Mr. *Pelletier* moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Roche*.

That the same be adopted.

The question of concurrence being put thereon the same was

Resolved in the affirmative.

The 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th paragraphs of the said resolutions being severally read and the question of concurrence being put on each, they were unanimously agreed to.

The 9th paragraph having been read again and the question of concurrence being put thereon.

The Honorable Mr. *Starnes*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Archambeault*, then moved in amendment :

That the motion of the Honorable member for Grandville be amended by adding after the said paragraph, the following :

10. That this House regrets that it is not represented in the present Cabinet.

And the question of concurrence being put on the said amendment it was

Resolved in the affirmative on division.

And the question of concurrence being put on the said amended resolutions as a whole, it was,

Resolved in the affirmative on division.

On motion of the Honorable *J. J. Ross*, it was

Ordered, That the Honorable Messrs. *Pelletier*, *Roche* and the mover, be appointed a committee to draft an address founded on the foregoing resolutions.

The house adjourned during pleasure.

After some time the House was resumed and

The Honorable *J. J. Ross* reported an address prepared by the committee as follows :

To His Honor the Honorable Joseph Adolphe Chapleau, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec.

May it please Your Honor :

We, Her Majesty's loyal and faithful subjects, the Legislative Council of the Province of Quebec in provincial Legislature assembled, humbly thanking Your Honor for your gracious speech in which you declared that it is with feelings of pleasure that you welcomed us at the opening of this

session, the first since you had the distinguished honour of being appointed by the representative of Our Sovereign to the office of Lieutenant-Governor of this Province.

We are pleased to learn that during the past year the financial situation has been markedly improved and that, so far as it is possible to determine from the six months since the first of July last, the sums voted for the ordinary expenses of the year 1892-1893, which showed a reduction of more than four hundred thousand dollars over those of the preceding year, will be sufficient and probably more than sufficient, while the usual ordinary receipts, apart from the new sources of revenue, will exceed the expectations of the government.

We share your Honour's satisfaction in learning that, although it is true that the acts passed last session to meet the exigencies of the situation have been subject to criticism in certain parts of the province, such however has generally been in a friendly spirit. That it does not exhibit any tendency to refuse the government the means of meeting their obligations and of maintaining provincial institutions, but confines itself to requiring that public business be administered with the strictest economy, and that certain modifications be made ;

We are pleased to learn that the government is confident that public opinion will be completely satisfied on examining the evidence of the retrenchments made, and on being assured that such amendments will be adopted as will be justified by the working of the present law and when fuller statistics and information than existed last session have been procured ;

We learn with interest that we will be called upon to legislate upon the pensioning of public officers, the salaries of registrars and of certain officers of justice and upon the establishment of agricultural associations :

We admit with your Honour that agriculture should, next after the reduction of the expenditure and the increasing of the revenue, be the chief object of our attention ;

We learn with satisfaction that the system, so successfully inaugurated last fall, for the encouragement of butter making during winter, gave results which exceeded expectations, that a truly salutary revolution is taking place in our system of agriculture, and that the government wishes to continue this system for the next three years :

We are happy to learn that the government will continue to favour as much as possible the establishment of butter and cheese syndicates, so as to secure throughout the province the manufacture of an uniform article of excellent quality.

We learn with interest that we will have to pronounce upon bills

respecting the sale of intoxicating liquors, civil procedure, the construction and working of railways subsidized by the government, the granting of charters for that purpose, and the payment of debts incurred in the carrying out of these enterprises.

We join with your Honour in his prayer that Providence will bless our labours, and thank him for his earnest desires that our devotion to our dear province will safely guide us in the way of duty.

This House regrets that it is not represented in the present Cabinet.

Which address being read by the Clerk, was adopted.

The committee appointed to examine and report on the contingent accounts of the Legislative Council for this session, have the honor of presenting their second report.

Your committee have examined the accounts from 1st May 1892 date up to which the accounts were last audited to the first of January 1893.

The accounts have been kept by Mr. R. Campbell since the first of May to the first of December, 1892, and by Mr. Frechette clerk of the Legislative Council, since the 1st December last.

Mr R. Campbell has to the satisfaction of your committee, rendered a detailed account of his disbursements with vouchers numbered from 1 to 312 inclusive, showing the disbursements of the Legislative Council from the first of May 1892 to the first December 1892 to be \$33,979.67, of which \$27,904.05 were disbursed from the first of May 1892 to the 30th June 1892 and \$6,075.62 from the first of July 1892 to the first December, 1892.

The statement of disbursements made from the first of December 1892 to the first January 1893, with vouchers numbered from No. 1 to No. 60 have been found correct and shows the disbursements of the Legislative Council, from the first December 1892 to the first of January, 1893 to have

been \$2582.77, and the balance, in the hands of the clerk on 1st January 1893 to have been \$760.55.

In Her Majesty's name, the Lieutenant Governor thanks Her loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this bill.

After which, His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the second session of the eighth Legislature of the Province of Quebec with the following speech

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

In sanctionning the laws which you have passed this session, I have much pleasure in congratulating you on the manner in which you have performed your duties.

I hope that through the encouragement you have given to dairying and to agricultural clubs, agriculture will make further progress in our province, especially if you continue, among our population, the work you have so well inaugurated in this Legislature. I urge you to use the influence, which your position gives you, to make every one understand the advantages of good farming and the necessity of replacing routine by rational methods. There is nothing more deserving of your attention than the agricultural question.

The railway policy carried on with such liberality by the various administrations which have succeeded each other since confederation has been the occasion of great abuses. I trust that the acts which have just been sanctioned will put a stop thereto and protect the public interests as well as those represented by these important undertakings.

I have reason to hope that, with the very cordial assistance which the public, through the institutions having most authority in such matters hastened to offer you, the financial situation of the province and its foreign credit will be proof against all attack.

My Government confidently expects that you will, during the recess, carefully study, the Bill respecting the reorganization of the law courts, recently submitted to you.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.

In Her Majesty's name, I thank you for the supplies which you have voted for the public service. My Government will see that they are judiciously expended for the purposes for which they are intended.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I taking leave of you I pray for the prosperity of the province for, your happiness and that of your families.

Then the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council ;

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this provincial Legislature be prorogued until Thursday, the sixth day of April next, to be here held ; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Thursday, the sixth day of April next.
