It was read as follows :

To the Honorable the Legislative Council.

The librarian of the legislature has the honor to submit on the state of the library, the following report :

The moderate sum of 2,000 dollars, voted annually during several sessions in favor of the library, for the purchase of books, does not permit a rapid increase in the number or variety of your works.

In obedience to the desire of the committee, the librarian has confined himself to purchasing Canadian books and standard works of history science and law.

Twice already the legislature has decided by the adoption of reports of the committee, to enclose, by means of the light trellis, the compartments in which the most valuable works are, and yet nothing has been done.

Your library is already pretty well filled and the classification of certain subjects is becoming difficult on account of the want of space.

The number of volumes now in your possession is 33,804. These volumes are not all in the library itself. Some of them have been placed for greater convenience in a space adjoining the Legislative Assembly Chamber. There is also a large quantity in a room in the top story. These are composed of, among others, duplicates of the sessional documents. This however, is not without some inconvenience, and necessitates, during the sessions, a more numerous staff.

About thirteen hundred volumes loaned have not yet been returned.

We beg to express our hope that Providence may always deign to protect our Gracious Sovereign and all those who are dear to Her.

Your committee recommend the following rules and regulations for adoption by the Legislative Council.

1. No orders of any kind shall be issued for the purchase of supplies for the stationery department without the express authority of the committee on contingent accounts previously given. The stationery clerk shall submit an estimate of the quantities and cost of each description of stationery and other articles included under that head, as may be required for the use of the Legislative Council. Such estimate shall be for those things that may be required for the ensuing year and shall be presented to the committee on contingent accounts at such period of the session as it shall have determined.

No further order shall be given or purchase made than of the articles contained in such estimate until after the meeting of the following session of the Legislature.

2. Upon the meeting of the Legislature, further requisitions may be laid before the committee on contingent accounts from time to time, for such articles as may be needed during the session.

3. There shall be supplied to each Councillor and to each officer entitled to a seat on the floor of the House, at the beginning of each session such articles and of such quality as shall be decided upon by the committee on contingent accounts, and also to each Councillor during the session such stationery required for actual use while the Legislature is sitting as he may order by written requisition signed by himself upon the officer in charge of the stationery.

4. Stationery required for use for the various officers of the Legislative Council shall be furnished only on written requisition initialed by the Speaker.

5. The subordinate clerks and other employees of the Legislative Council shall receive such allowance of stationery for their private purposes as the committee on contingent accounts shall determiné.

6. It shall be the duty of the stationery clerk to carefully file and preserve for reference all orders drawn upon him.

7. All stationery shall be placed in one room under the charge of the Stationery clerk, who shall be held accountable for its safe keeping and shall deliver no article other than those mentioned in rule 3 without a proper written order.

8. Stock shall be taken at the close of the current fiscal year and a stock book shall be kept regularly and continuously by the stationery clerk, which shall be laid before the committee on contingent accounts at its first meeting each session.

9. The foregoing shall be printed and placed in the hands of the Legislative Councillors at the beginning of each session.

10. No book or periodical shall be purchased except by direction of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

In Her Majesty's name, I thank you for the supplies which you have voted for the public service.

My Government will see that they are judiciously expended for the purposes for which they are intended.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly ;

I pray that God may reward your labors in the public interest and that he will bestow His blessings upon you and your families.

Then the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly ;

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Wednesday the third day of August next, to be here held ; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until Wednesday the third day of August next.
