The Speaker informed the House that, by the usage of Parliament, the Clerk took the oath of office before the Speaker, then the Clerk took and subscribed the oath in these words :

You do sincerely promise and swear, that you will be faithful and true, and bear allegiance to Her Majesty Queen *Victoria*, by the Grace of God, as lawful Sovereign of the United Kingdom of *Great Britain* and *Ireland*, and of this Province, and to Her Heirs and successors,

that you will defend Her to the utmost of your power against all traitorous conspiracies or attempts whatever which shall be made against Her Person, Crown and Dignity, and that you will do your utmost endeavour to disclose and make known to Her Majesty, Her Heirs and successors, all treasons or traitorous conspiracies and attempts which you shall know to be against Her or any of them.

And all this you do swear without any equivocation, mental evasion or secret reservation, and renouncing all pardons and dispensation, from any person or power whatever to the contrary. You shall also well and truly serve Her Majesty in the office of Clerk of the Legislative Council of this Province making true entries and records of the things done and passed in the same. You shall keep secret all such matters as shall be treated in Her said Legislative Council and not disclose the same before they shall be published, but to such as it ought to be disclosed unto and generally you shall well and truly do and execute all things belonging to you to be done, appertaining to the said office of Clerk of the said Legislative Council.

At three o'clock in the afternoon His Honor the Honorable *Auguste Réal Angers*, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the chair on the Throne, The Honorable *Speaker* of this House said: "Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly and acquaint that House, that it is His Honor's pleasure that they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council."

Who being come thereto :

His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was then pleased to open the Session by a gracious speech from the Throne to both Houses.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

I extend to you a cordial welcome to these legislative halls, in which you are to discuss matters of the highest interest to this country, and tender you, at the commencement of the new year, my best wishes for your happiness and prosperity and for the happiness and prosperity of your families and of all the people of this Province whom you represent.

My Government has decided to continue as much as possible to convene the Legislature early in the winter, so as to allow you to conclude your parliamentary labours before the spring, if you so desire.

On the fifth of November last, the date agreed upon, the Province paid, to those who were entitled to it, the four hundred thousand dollars granted by the act of 1888, as being the share of the Roman Catholics in the settlement of the Jesuits' Estates ; and a discharge was signed, containing the assignments and subrogations authorized by law.

The sixty thousand dollars, being the share mentioned in the law as coming to the Protestants in respect of the said settlement, were not placed at the disposal of the committee of the minority of the Council of Public Instruction, because the members of that committee raised certain objections which seem reasonable. A bill for the definite disposal of these objections will be submitted to you.

We should all rejoice at the final and satisfactory settlement of this important question.

A very earnest movement has recently manifested itself in this Province in favour of night schools for the working classes ; my Government considered it wise and even necessary under the circumstances to encourage such schools in the cities of *Quebec* and *Montreal*, and you will be asked to vote a special grant for that purpose.

The necessity of improving the roads in the country has induced my government to further encourage the stoning of our public roads ; and you will be asked to vote an appropriation for that purpose, as an experiment. The stoning of these vicinal roads will necessarily entail the abolition of turnpikes and toll bridges.

The revenues generally and especially those from Crown Lands have gone on increasing during the past three years, and the latter, that is the revenues from the Crown Lands, now exceed one million dollars per annum. This is very satisfactory, and there is every reason to hope that this state of things will continue.

The work of colonization is successfully and energetically carried on, and several powerful companies organized by influential persons in Canada, the United States and even Europe, have applied for public lands for colonization purposes in the Province. If these companies offer suitable guarantees, they should have every facility afforded them, so that they may aid us in settling our public lands. In order to give a new and more vigorous impetus to these great projects, you will be called upon to pass two acts : one for the purpose of fostering the legitimate operations of colonization societies, and the other granting a lot of land of one hundred acres to the father and mother of at least

twelve living children, born in lawful wedlock, such lot to be their homestead.

As authorised by the Legislative Assembly, a large sum of money was placed at the disposal of a special committee to enable them to distribute seed grain in the Province of Quebec wherever the frost and rain had destroyed the crops in 1888. This committee has concluded its entirely disinterested labours with an impartiality and success beyond all praise. This aid, so opportunely distributed, throughout the country, has produced excellent results by preventing emigration and famine and by supplying good seed grain.

My Government considers that it is now time to increase the number of members of the Legislative Assembly, and a bill to that effect will be submitted to you.

The carrying out of the amendments made, last year, to the Election act, granting the franchise to farmer's sons and other persons, was prevented by the want of the legal machinery required for the preparation of the valuation rolls in rural municipalities. New provisions will be submitted to you to obviate this difficulty.

My Government has diligently carried on negotiations with the federal authorities for the purpose of definitely fixing the northern limits of the Province, and, although its efforts have not been entirely successful, it hopes soon to secure the triumph of the legitimate claims of the Province ; and it requests you, in a very special manner, to carefully consider the resolutions which will be submitted to you in this connection, and which are calculated to hasten the solution of this important question.

The jury system, especially in criminal matters, has been the subject of special studies and inquiries on the part of my Government ; the drawbacks of the present system as regards the selection, summoning, qualification and the pay and treatment of jurors may necessitate certain changes which you will shortly be called upon to consider.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,

The Public Accounts for the year ending the 30th June last, as well as the ordinary and supplementary Estimates, will be submitted to you without delay, so that their consideration will not retard your parliamentary labours.

You will, doubtless, be pleased to learn that the receipts and expenses again show a satisfactory surplus in favour of the former.

A proclamation was issued putting into force the act of last session establishing distinctions for agricultural merit, and you will be called

upon to provide for the necessary expenditure in order that our agriculturists may receive the rewards to which they are entitled.

You will also be requested to increase the number of bursaries to be placed at the disposal of pupils in our agricultural schools, in order to enable a greater number to attend such schools and to further popularize the theoretical and practical instruction required for our farmers' sons.

The mayor shall not have the right to vote at the deliberations of the Council only in the case of an equal division of votes.

In Speaker's decisions 1841-1872 by Aug. Laperrière, at page 91.

The following was decided by Mr. Speaker Wallbridge, in Upper Canada :

The pecuniary interest which would disqualify a Member from voting on a bill must be direct and personal not one in common with others.

Upon a division having taken place upon a Bill respecting Permanent Building Societies, in Upper Canada, which had been introduced by T. C. Street, Esq., Thos. Scatterd, Esq., raised the point of order that under the rule of the House no Member having a direct pecuniary interest, could vote upon a question. The Honorable Member for Welland (T. C. Street, Esq.,) was interested in a building society within the meaning of the 16th rule. "Mr. Speaker said that the interest which disqualifies must be a direct pecuniary interest, separately belonging to the person whose vote is questioned and not in common with the rest of Her Majesty's subjects and that in his opinion as the Bill relates to building societies in general, the Member for Welland is not precluded from voting." After some further conversation the Bill was read a third time and passed.

In Bourinot, page 395, note 7 :

In 1875, Senator Ryan asked if he could vote on a public bill respecting Marine Electric telegraphs as he was a shareholder in a company affected by that Bill. The Speaker said that there was no rule to prevent him voting for a Bill in which he had only an indirect interest and he voted accordingly.

Accordingly the Honorable Speaker ruled that Mr. *Tourville's* interest was the same, as all other subjects of Her Majesty who could become members of the corporation now being incorporated, and therefore he was not disqualified from voting.

June, 1890, and on the 30th June, 1891, and for other purposes connected with the public service."

To this bill the Royal Assent was signified in the following words :

In Her Majesty's name, the Lieutenant Governor thanks her loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this bill.

After which His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the fourth session of the sixth Legislature, of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly;

I come, in Her Majesty's name, to sanction the numerous acts which you have passed during this session and to thank you for the zeal and intelligence you have displayed in the performance of your legislative duties.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly;

You have generously voted the supplies asked of you for the various branches of the public service ; I thank you for them, and will see that the sums placed at the disposal of the Government be expended with economy and according to law.

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council ;

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly ;

In Her Majesty's name I terminate your labors, relieve you from your legislative duties and tender you my best wishes for your individual happiness and that of your families and for the welfare of this Province.

Then the Honorable the Speaker of the Legislative Council said :

Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council ;

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly ;

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's will and pleasure that this Provincial Legislature be prorogued until Monday, the twelfth day of May next, to be here held ; and the Provincial Legislature is accordingly prorogued until the twelfth day of May next.
