Friday, 28th May, 1880.

FRIDAY, the TWENTY EIGHTH day of MAY, in the forty third year of the reign of our Sovereign Lady Victoria by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen Defender of the Faith, being the third session of the fourth parliament or Legislature of the Province of Quebec as continued by several prorogations to this day.

A three o'clock in the afternoon, His Honor the Honorable *Theodore Robitaille*, Lieutenant Governor of the Province of Quebec, being seated in the Chair on the Throne, the Honorable the Speaker of this House commanded the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod to proceed to the Chamber of the Legislative Assembly, and acquaint that House, « It is His Honor's pleasure they attend him immediately in the Chamber of the Legislative Council. »

Who being come thereto,

His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor was pleased to open the session by a gracious speech from the throne to both Houses :

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,*

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

I have much pleasure in welcoming you to the seat of Government where you are assembled to deal with the affairs of the Province.

I am confident that the representatives in Parliament, in commencing their labors, are animated with that spirit of good understanding and harmony, which is so necessary for the proper working of our political institutions and the progress of our Country.

I am happy to unite with you in expressing our sentiments of gratitude and loyalty to Our Gracious Sovereign, on the occasion of the visit of His Royal Highness, Prince Leopold. His Highness is the fifth member of the Royal Family who has honored Our Country with his presence, and we take great pleasure in regarding his visit as a further proof of the affection of Our August Sovereign.

We should all rejoice at the thought that the general depression, which has been felt in all branches of industry, is beginning to disappear. The lumbering in our forests and the development of our mineral resources, were paralysed by the crisis, but you will be happy to learn that there is every reason to hope that the new impetus given to these and other industries will largely contribute to our national prosperity, while, at the same time, it will perceptibly increase the revenue of the Province.

Two enterprises which the previous Legislatures and Government had specially protected, viz : the mining of phosphates and the manufacture of beet-root sugar, have received the special attention of the Government, and are in a fair way to fulfill the hopes of the friends of Agriculture and Industry in this Province.

A general Dominion Exhibition will be held in the Province of Quebec, in the course of the year. My Government has thought proper to encourage, in a particular manner, this agricultural and industrial competition, and I am confident that you will approve what has been done towards that end.

Since the prorogation of the House, on the 31st October last, the Government has taken possession of the Eastern section of the Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa and Occidental Railway, and has united, under one management, both sections of the road. The statements which will be submitted to you on this subject, will show that the revenue of this enterprise has increased in a ratio which is encouraging for the future; and this revenue, together with the other advantages derivable from the road, will compensate for the sacrifices which have been made to successfully carry it out.

The cost of constructing the Provincial Railway having exhausted the Consolidated Railway Fund, and absorbed the subsidies reserved for private Companies, and having, moreover, necessitated temporary loans on the credit of the Province, it has now become necessary to provide for the payment of those subsidies and loans. For this purpose, my Government has thought proper to take preliminary steps towards the negotiation of a loan sufficient to meet our actual requirements, without, however, exceeding the limits of the resources of the Province. You will learn with satisfaction, that this loan can be effected under very advantageous conditions and you will be called upon to give it your approval.

The Province has contracted considerable obligations in order to complete great improvements, which it thought proper to undertake, in order to secure, in the Confederation, a position, commensurate with its political importance. It is a national duty for all good citizens to labor, with one accord, towards meeting

these obligations and maintaining unimpaired the credit of the Province. I sincerely hope that you will loyally assist my Government in accomplishing this task.

Our Constitution having limited, within narrow bounds our sources of revenue ; it becomes our duty to carefully see that economy is practised in our public expenses and to see also to the immediate collection of what is due to the Treasury, if we wish to secure an equilibrium between our receipts and expenditure.

The Municipal Loan Fund debt has, for some years, increased in large proportions. A measure will be submitted to you for the purpose of disposing of this debt for the benefit of the Treasury, due regard being had to the position of the various Municipalities interested.

You will have to consider certain amendments to the License Act and also a Bill, the object of which is to make public offices contribute to the revenues of the Province.

The Act respecting Lunatic Asylums, in so far as regards the expenses which it authorizes, requires amending, and you will have to occupy yourselves with this question.

Some alterations are required in the legislation which relates to our mines, both with regard to the public revenue and to the facilities which should be afforded to the development of this important industry.

The Consolidation of the Railway Act of this Province, for the purpose of assimilating it to the Dominion Railway Act, is of the utmost importance, and a bill to that effect will be submitted to you.

The Consolidation of the laws respecting Education and Agriculture, are subjects on which you will be consulted during the course of the Session.

You will be called upon to take into consideration bills, to provide for the consolidation of the Statutes of the Province, to modify the constitution of the Superior Court and of the Court of Queen's Bench, and concerning the employment of prisoners confined in the Common Gaols of the various districts in the Province.

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :*

The public accounts of the past fiscal year, as well as a statement of receipts and expenditure for the current year, will be submitted to you.

The estimates for next fiscal year will also be laid before the House, for your approval. These estimates have been prepared with the economy consistent with the efficiency of the public service.

You will be asked to vote the necessary supplies for the use of Her Majesty's Government.

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council ;*

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :*

It only remains for me to ask you to display, in the performance of the important duties which devolve upon you, that zeal, wisdom and patriotism, which the Country has a right to expect from you ; and I pray the Almighty to guide your counsels and to bestow his favors upon our people.

The Legislative Assembly then withdrew His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to retire.

The Honorable Mr. Ross presented a Bill (A) intituled : « An act concerning agriculture. »

The said Bill was read the first time *pro formâ*.

The Speaker reported His Honor the Lieutenant Governor's speech from the Throne and the same was then read by the Clerk.

The Honorable the *Speaker* presented to the House the Report of the Librarian of the Legislature, which was read and is as follows :

---

*To the Honorable the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Quebec.*

The Librarian of the Province of Quebec hereby humbly sheweth :

That he has given all the care and shewn all the discernment in his power in the employment of the monies which have been confided to him for the purchase of books.

As the sum of \$3,000 00 annually granted to the Library, since many year, is not sufficient for the purchase of new books on science, history and literature; and as your Library should, above all, be rich in parliamentary documents, history, political journals, and in law books, I have made it my duty to find and purchase all that could, under the circumstances, be acquired in those different branches. But at the same time, I had to neglect almost entirely all that relates to literature.

Following the advice of one of the Members of the Legislative Council, I subscribed to the English Blue Books, and those important documents cost about \$350 yearly. I continue with considerable benefit for your Library to exchange documents of the Legislature and some of your new books with the official publications of France, and of most of the States of the American Union and of the English Colonies.

The number of Works added to your Library since a year past is 1,500 ; 638 of which are Pamphlets of all kinds. The total number is now 25,653. Of the 1,500 works above mentioned, 897 have been received in exchange or as gifts.

The Honorable Premier has been kind enough to get made, at my request, bookstands, which now take the place of the Library tables and permit us to suitably dispose of a great number of volumes and specially large newspapers.

There is still to the credit of the Library about one hundred dollars. This sum will be sufficient, I hope, to cover the current expenses to the end of the fiscal year.

I add to the present report a list of the books which have not been returned ; also a list of gifts made to your Library and of the books given in exchange.

The Order of the day was read for taking into consideration the speech of His Honor the Lieutenant Governor from the Throne, at the opening of the session, and

The Honorable Mr. *Ferrier*, seconded by Honorable Mr. *de La Bruère*, moved,

That an humble address be presented to His Honor the Lieutenant Governor, thanking His Honor for his Gracious Speech upon the opening of the third session of the fourth Parliament of the Province of Quebec, and further to assure His Honor.

1. That with His Honor we are confident that the representatives in Parliament, commencing their labors, are animated with that spirit of good understanding and harmony, which is so necessary for the proper working of our political institutions and the progress of our country.

2. That we also are happy to unite with His Honor in expressing our sentiments of gratitude and loyalty to Our Gracious Sovereign, on the occasion of the visit of His Royal Highness, Prince Leopold, the fifth member of the Royal Family who has honored Our Country with his presence; and we, with His Honor, take great pleasure in regarding the visit of His Royal Highness as a further proof of the affection of Our August Sovereign.

3. That with His Honor we should all rejoice at the thought that the general depression, which has been felt in all branches of industry, is beginning to disappear. That we admit with His Honor that the lumbering in our forests and the development of our mineral resources, were heretofore paralysed by the crisis, but we are, with His Honor, happy to learn that there is every reason to hope that the new impetus given to these and other industries will largely contribute to our national prosperity, while, at the same time, it will perceptibly increase the revenue of the Province.

4. That we are pleased to learn from His Honor that the two enterprises which previous Legislature and Governments had specially protected, viz: the mining of phosphates and the manufacture of beet-root sugar, have received the special attention of the Government, and are in a fair way to fulfil the hopes of the friends of Agriculture and Industry in this Province.

5. That we take great pleasure in learning from His Honor, that a general Dominion Exhibition will be held in the Province of Quebec, in the course of the year; that the Government has thought proper to encourage, in a special manner, this agricultural and industrial competition, and we will justify the hope expressed by His Honor that we will approve what has been done towards that end.

6. That we have great pleasure in being assured by His Honor that since the prorogation of the House, on the 31st October last, the Government has taken possession of the Eastern section of the Quebec, Montreal, Ottawa and Occidental Railway, and has united, under one management, both sections of the road; and that we, with His Honor, sincerely hope that the statements to be submitted to us on this subject, will show that the revenue of this enterprise has increased in a ratio which is encouraging for the future; and that this revenue together with the other advantages derivable from the road, will compensate for the sacrifices which have been made to successfully carry it out.

7. That we admit, with His Honor, that the cost of constructing the Provincial Railway has exhausted the Consolidated Railway Fund, and absorbed the subsidies reserved for private Companies, and has, moreover, necessitated temporary loans on the credit of the Province, and it has become necessary to provide for the payment of those subsidies, and we are pleased to learn from His Honor that the Government which has thought proper to take preliminary steps towards the negotiation of a loan sufficient to meet our actual requirements, without, however, exceeding the limits of the resources of the Province, can effect this loan under very advantageous conditions, and that we hope to be able to give it our approval.

8. That we admit, with His Honor, that the Province having contracted considerable obligations in order to complete great improvements, which it thought

proper to undertake, in order to secure in the Confederation a position commensurate with its political importance, it is a national duty for all good citizens to labor, with one accord, towards meeting these obligations and maintaining unimpaired the credit of the Province, and we, with His Honor, sincerely hope that we can loyally assist the Government in accomplishing this task.

9. That we agree with His Honor in stating that our Constitution having limited, within narrow bounds, our sources of revenue, it becomes our duty to carefully see that economy is practised in our public expenses and to see also to the immediate collection of what is due to the Treasury, if we wish to secure an equilibrium between our receipts and expenditure.

10. That we admit, with His Honor, that the Municipal Loan Fund debt has for some years increased in large proportions, and we learn with pleasure that a measure will be submitted to us for the purpose of disposing of this debt for the benefit of the Treasury, due regard being had to the position of the various Municipalities interested.

11. That we will carefully consider all amendments to the License Act and Bill to make public offices contribute to the revenues of the Province.

12. That we admit with His Honor that the Act respecting Lunatic Asylums, in so far as regards the expenses which it authorizes, requires to be amended, and we will occupy ourselves attentively with this question.

13. That all alterations required in the legislation respecting our mines, both with regard to the public revenue and the facilities which should be afforded to the development of this important industry, which may be submitted to us, will have our careful consideration.

14. That we agree with His Honor that the Consolidation of the Railway Act of this Province, for the purpose of assimilating it to the Dominion Railway Act is of the utmost importance, and any bill to that effect will be seriously considered by us.

15. That we are well pleased to learn from His Honor that the Consolidation of the laws respecting Education and Agriculture, are subjects on which we will be consulted in the course of the Session.

16. That the Bills to provide for the consolidation of the Statutes of the Province, to modify the constitution of the Superior Court and of the Court of Queen's Bench, and concerning the employment of prisoners confined in the Common Gaols of the various districts in the Province, when submitted to us, will receive due consideration.

17. That we join with His Honor in earnestly hoping that, in the performance of the important duties which devolve upon us that zeal, wisdom and patriotism which the Country has a right to expect from us may be exhibited, and, with His Honor, we pray the Almighty to guide our counsels and to bestow his favors upon our people.

The first paragraph being again read.

The Honorable Mr. *Ferrier*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *de LaBruère*, moved.

That the same be adopted.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was unanimously Resolved in the affirmative.

The 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th paragraphs of the said resolutions being severally read and the question of concurrence being put on each, they were unanimously agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Ross, seconded by the Honorable Mr. de Boucherville, it was

*Ordered*, That the Honorable Messrs. Ferrier, de LaBruère, the mover and the seconder, be appointed a committee to draft an address founded on the foregoing resolutions.

An Act granting to Her Majesty the moneys required for the expenses of the Government, for the financial year, ended on the 30th June, 1880, and for the financial year ending on the 30th June, 1881, and for other purposes connected with the public service.

To this Bill the royal assent was signified in the following words :

In Her Majesty's name, the Lieutenant Governor thanks her loyal subjects, accepts their benevolence and assents to this Bill.

After which His Honor the Lieutenant Governor was pleased to close the third session of the fourth Parliament of the Province of Quebec, with the following speech :

*Honcrable Gentleman of the Legislative Council ;  
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly.*

In dispensing at present with the further continuation of your Parliamentary labors, I wish to thank you for the diligence which you have shown in the execution of your public duties.

The measures, which I submitted to your consideration, were numerous and important and required a great amount of work on your part.

You have fulfilled your task with a devotion which deserves public acknowledgement, and I am confident that the country will have only to rejoice at the result of your deliberations.

I heartily congratulate you on the unanimity of your deliberations upon the important question of the settlement of the municipal loan, and the spirit of conciliation which distinguished your discussions upon all matter of public interest

*Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly,*

In the name of Her Majesty, I thank you for the supplies that you have generously voted for the various branches of the public service.

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,  
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly ;*

As you are about to separate to return to your homes, I sincerely wish you all happiness and pray to God to grant his protection to your families and to all the inhabitants of our faithful and loyal Province.

Then the Honorable Speaker of this House said :

*Honorable Gentlemen of the Legislative Council,  
Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly ;*

It is His Honor the Lieutenant Governors' will and pleasure that this provincial parliament be prorogued until Tuesday, the seventh day of September next, to be here held, and the provincial parliament is accordingly prorogued until Tuesday, the seventh day of September next (1880).
